

Editorial

BRITISH, WITHOUT U. S. SUPPORT, LEAVE IRAN

The British decision to withdraw from the Abadan Oil Refinery, under pressure from the government of Iran, was made with knowledge that the United States had no intention of backing the use of force to protect the property.

upon the conflicting arguments in connection with the unilateral confiscation of foreign property, we call attention to the fact that unless foreign investments in backward countries are safe, there will be no inducement for capitalists to risk their money in the economic development of the backward regions.

We do not attempt to defend the policy of the British in Iran in connection with their billion-dollar investment. It may be that the British drove a hard bargain with the Iranians when they entered into a contractural agreement with a previous Iranian government. By the same token, nobody can defend the action of the present Iranian government in confiscating the property of ther nationals without deference to proceedings in the International Court of Justice.

Just what the effect of the British withdrawal will be remains to be seen. Nobody believes that the Iranians can run the industry efficiently and there is some doubt whether they can operate the huge plant at all. The net result will be less oil for the world, less work for some Iranians and, perhaps, an opportunity for the Russians to get a foothold in Iran.

CONFORMITY THROUGH FEAR"

Paul G. Hoffman, former E. C. A. Administrator and now President of the Ford Foundation, hits a lick for free speech warning that the nation's fight against Communism is being weakened by the use of methods which tend to make criticism "socially dangerous" and sometimes force "conformity through fear."

Mr. Hoffman says that because "some of our people - often good people"-are ready to pillory anyone who presents an unpopular view or supports an unpopular cause, there are "too many of our fellow citizens" afraid to speak out. He asserts that in too many cases, decisions "often in high places" have been influenced by fear.






