Recent discoveries concerning cures for cancer, tuberculosis and other diseases bring promise of a new age in medicine to this generation. temporarily benefitted since they developed an immunity to the germs and could not be reinfected for additional treatment. Nevertheless, the test indicates that viruses can be "trained" to eat cancerous tissue without harming normal tissues. There is as yet no proof that a virus curative will be found, but the test results so far have spurred additional

Other significant progress in the fight against cancer has been made within the ast three months and, in the last month, it has been discovered that the beginning of infantile paralysis can be located in the bloodstream. This discovery is ranked as a najor forward step in the fight on polio. In addition to these discoveries, the prospect nas recently been raised that the battle against tuberculosis is on the verge of being von. The new drug being used in this fight nas obtained spectacular results so far, although tests are still continuing.

While trying to avoid being over-optimistic, it is quite possible that readers will soon see the day when these three dreaded diseases: cancer, infantile paralysis and tubarculosis, will be almost completely conquered by medical science. Certainly, progress toward this goal has been satisfying, even exciting, in the last six months.

Studies reported to the Federation of American Societies for Experimental Biology recently show that your dietary intak should be reduced seven and one-half per cent each decade after reaching the age twenty-five. The studies also showed that the condition of being overweight is the mos widespread and devastating nutritional di order in the United States today.

The recommendations of the National Research Council are for a 2,900-calorie intake each day for active young people. Garden insects are on the march again and many requests are coming in for methods of control of the various insects. A 5% DDT dust will control almost every garden insect with the exception of aphids. For aphids use 1% rotenone or 3% nicotine or 1% lindane. To treat squash, cucumbers, cantaloupes or watermelons; use 20% Sabiadilla dust or 1% pyrenthrins, but do not use DDT or other chemicals as they will cause burning.





The Texas Motor Vehicle Law Requires That Your Car or Truck Must Pass the Inspection Test For Safety



The Texas Safety Association estimates that if every shop that is qualified to inspect cars and trucks under the new Texas Motor Vehicle Law were—starting May 1—to inspect eight vehicles a day that they would not be able to inspect all of the cars and trucks in Texas by the deadline in September.

But the facts remain that the average qualified inspection agency is inspecting considerable less than this number each day.

For that reason the Texas Safety Association predicts that there will be a terrific glut of cars and trucks at each inspection point in July and August unless motorists start having their cars inspected now and keep on doing so steadily through May and June.

As inspection agents of the state we respectfully urge you to bring your cars in now; for we are sorely afraid that we will not be able to handle the task if too many people wait until July and August to have this work done.

It should be remembered that your car or truck must have an inspection sticker on the windshield if you are to drive it today. The inspection test is not nearly as severe as most people think it is. The items to be checked are the ones that will save your life.

So don't delay. Act today. You can save yourself time and trouble by making an appointment to have your car inspected now and you won't be among the hot and bothered people who will be sweating it out in August waiting your turn.
