Ranch operators by conducting demonstrations on their own ranches are finding that balancing range forage production and livestock numbers is a paying proposition, A. H. Walker, range specialist for the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, says the results of 4,746 demonstrations conducted by adults and 4-H members are an indication of what can be done to improve the forage production of Texas rangelands.

Last year 737 stocking rate demonstrations were conducted in 111 counties. Many of these demonstrators, says Walker, are finding if they run only about three-fourths as many breeding stock as they think their range will carry, then fill the gap with steers or heifers in the good years, they make more money in the long run. The lower stocking rate
