ing flowers for showing follows: Temperature and humidity play a large part in prolonging keeping quality of cut flowers. Stems should be cut slanting with razor blade. Keep in cool place, as basedraft. Most flower's should be immersed immediately in cool water up to their necks. The cut end of dahlias or poppies should be seared in a flame or plunged into hot water then into cold water. Remove foilage that will be in water for its causes spoilage.

Some people use asperin, vinegar, listerine, etc. to keep flowwould do damage to the stem. Here are two formulas which

sulphate, 2 tablespoons sugar and

Formula 2-1/4 teaspoon clorox, 1-16 teaspoon of femic oxide, 2 tablespoons sugar and 1 quart of water.

Change water solution daily. There are two trademarked flower preservetives on the market, Bloomlife and Floralife.

The coloring in some leaves, such as oak can be preserved by painting, spraying or dipping the leaves in two parts of water to one part of glycerine. Shake solution well before applying. Have leaves perfectly dry before painting. This will also keep them flex-

To keep grain and grass heads from shattering paint with one part of liquid shellac (white) thinned with three parts of denatured alcohol. If too shiny when you come to arrange them, wipe lightly with cloth dampened in alcohol.

#### STORING SYNTHETIC BLOOD

The Civil Defense Administration has purchased more than a million pints of synthetic blood which will be stored to be used in case of a national disaster or an enemy atomic attack. Synthetic blood, which is known as PVP-Macrose, has many of the desirable properties of blood. It can be used to treat shock, due to burns, surgery or in-

Of course, synthetic blood won't take the place of real blood plasma, but it will help bridge a danger period between the first flash of a disaster and the time when whole\* plood and plasma would be available in sufficient quanity. This stored-up supply of synthetic blood could play a very important role in the event of an atomic attack on one of the large metropolitan areas.

The big advantage of synthetic blood is that it can be produced in almost unlimited quantities at a cost lower than the cost of whole blood or plasma.
