

City Council Changes Rates On Water, Sewer

The City Council met in a regular session Thursday, August 3, and discussed a survey, which disclosed irregularities in charges for water, sewer and sanitation for the city.

The following regulations were passed and put into effect as of August 1, 1961. The changes will appear on your next bill.

1. Charge \$2.50 per sewer rates on all services stations, hotels and cafes.

2. Charge \$3.50 sewer rates on all trailer parks, motels, laundries, Court House and hospital.

3. Charge every business in town \$1.50 sanitation fee.

4. Charge each business and or residence the minimum water, sewer and sanitation rate on each business and or residence when occupied, where they are on the same meter.

If you have a question, the council asks that you appear in person September 7 at 7:00 p.m. at the city office.

Several times in the last two years, applicants for marriage licenses have had to postpone weddings in some instances where invitations had been mailed out because they failed to make application for their marriage license in time to satisfy the law, Harry Wofford, County Clerk, said.

The law provides that if the male is 21 or above and the female is 18 or above, the marriage license may be issued immediately upon application to the County Clerk, provided each party can present documentary proof of age and has obtained a blood test from an approved state laboratory. The blood test is good for only 15 blood is taken until the marriage is performed.

If one or both of the parties are under age when application is made, they must meet specifications above and, in addition, each minor must be accompanied by a parent or a legal guardian when application is made. The parent or quardian must appear before the County Clerk in person. After ap-

plication is made, there is what is known as a three-day waiting period for minors, but in complying with the waiting period the date application is made may not be counted and the date the license is issued cannot be counted, making a reality a FIVE-DAY WAITING
