#### Civil Defense Has **Key Role in Peace**

Natural disasters can strike anytime, anywhere.

From pioneer days to the present, neighbors have always helped each other in times of distress. But often, the power of a great hurricane, flood or tornado completely outmatched the valiant but disorganized efforts of untrained volunteers.

TODAY THE UNITED STATES has a form of disaster insurance -civil defense. Like any other insurance, it doesn't guarantee that disaster won't occur. But by executive order, the Federal Civil Defense Ad-

rederal Civil Defense Administration does have the responsibility for coordinating all disaster rollef efforts of the Federal Government under Public Law 875. This guarantees that the resources of the entire nation can be marshalled against nature on the rampage as required. the rampage as required.



It's a job which requires the skills of many specialists, such as the Army Corps of Engineers, the National Guard and the American Red Cross. Trained civil defense workers in the general disaster area put their rescue, traffic control, first aid and other skills to practical use.

SIX-YEAR-OLD boy is carried to safety by George A. Spoouer, New Britain, Conn., civil defense director, during great Northeast flood in the wake of Hurricane Diane.
