

What is Croup Although croup in children can appear suddenly, more often than not, it emerges gradually, first as a common cold which then develops into the croup. The main cause of croup is a viral infection that affects the voice box. The barky cough that characterizes the croup is the result of your child's vocal cords swelling.

Children who repeatedly suffer from the croup are considered to have spasmodic croup. This is an allergy induced croup cough brought on by a child's seasonal allergies. While the croup mostly affects children between the ages of six months and three years, spasmodic croup can affect children up to the age of six.

Croup usually lasts for anywhere between three and six days. Although the severity of the cough can fluctuate during the course of the illness, croup is at its worst during the first few days. It often peaks around the second or third day before subsiding into a bad cold.

A question many parents wonder is whether croup is contagious. Although it is, it is no more contagious than the common cold. But it is still a good idea to take precautions. Washing your hands or your toddler's hands frequently can help prevent the spreading of germs.




