## Texas Farm Bureau Donates \$6,000 To Co. Vol. Fire Depts.

### \$2064 Donated By Wheeler Co. Farm Bureau

Wheeler County Farm Bureau donated \$2064.00 to the Wheeler County Volunteer Fire Departments. The local Farm Bureau has donated \$344 to each of the County's Volunteer Fire Departments—Wheeler, Allison, Briscoe, Kelton, Mobeettie, and Shamrock—with \$1000 contributed by Texas Farm Bureau (TFB), to help recover resources and funds used to keep our community safe.

"We are grateful for these firefighters' tireless efforts to protect our homes, land, animals and families," said Wheeler County Farm Bureau President Mark Elmore. "With all that they've done for our community, this is a very worthy cause."

The donation was made possible with the help of matching

funds from the TFB state office. TFB committed to match county Farm Bureau donations on a \$3 to \$1 basis, up to a maximum of \$1,000 per volunteer fire department, across the state.

## OLD TIMES NOT FORGOTTEN

### DID PYTHAGORAS HAVE A JOB?

I don't know how many of you might still have any recollection of Pythagoras, but he made quite an impression on me the year that we

took geometry in school. For a while, he caused me a lot of mental discomfort. I just didn't seem to be catching on to his theorem, that "a" square plus "b" square equal "c" square. About the time I thought I knew where "side a" or "side b" was, the next problem would have them switched. The only side that seemed to stay in the same place was "side c". Finally, Mr. Barham drew me a picture with all the sides blocked off in squares that showed why it didn't matter, which of the shorter sides were "a and b". After that, I finally caught on and didn't have much more trouble.

Since Pythagoras, lived such a long time ago (569 BC to 475 BC)

he sure didn't have the luxury of computers, or calculators, like we do today. I've always wondered what he did for a living. It's for sure that he didn't have an ordinary job, like maybe a "fig picker," or "wine press operator." Any work along that line wouldn't have left him with much, if any, free time to think about mathematics.

I came to the conclusion that he must have come from a rich family, and didn't have to work. Or, maybe he spent some serious prison time somewhere. was a merchant, and was spending some time studying in Egypt. While there, he was taken as a POW when the Babylonians defeated the Egyptians. It said that he studied math, taught by them. Later on, he was released and went to Italy, where he founded a mathematical and religious school. He was also, an accomplished astronomer and musician.

Along with all that, he believed that everything could be reduced to numbers, and that numbers even had personalities. It makes me wonder if he was the guy who started the idea number "thirteen," was unlucky. It is not always easy to tell when your child's croup cough and her trouble breathing are normal and when they require more immediate attention. As a general rule of thumb, if your toddler seems to have a generally pleasant disposition, is still interested in playing and is not really bothered by her cough, then the home remedies should be sufficient to ease any discomfort she may have.

However, if she can't sleep or doesn't want to lie down because she has troubles breathing; is not interested in playing or interacting with others; or her stridor does not go away even when she is

## Croup Cough

What seemed like a regular cold in your child has suddenly gotten worse. His sniffles and sneezes have added a new sound a raspy, barking cough. Often compared to the sound a seal makes, croup cough can cause parents a lot of worry. The good news is that the croup is a common childhood ailment that clears up soon enough. The bad news, unfortunately, means that some parents may find themselves in an emergency room with their little one.

### What is Croup

Although croup in children can appear suddenly, more often than not, it emerges gradually, first as a common cold which then develops into the croup. The main cause of croup is a viral infection that affects the voice box. The barking cough that characterizes the croup is the result of your child's vocal cords swelling. Children who repeatedly suffer from the croup are considered to have spasmodic croup. This is an allergy induced croup cough brought on by a child's seasonal allergies. While the croup mostly affects children between the ages of six months and three years, spasmodic croup can affect children up to the age of six.

Croup usually lasts for anywhere between three and six days. Although the severity of the cough can fluctuate during the course of the illness, croup is at its worst during the first few days. It often peaks around the second or third day before subsiding into a bad cold.

A question many parents wonder is whether croup is contagious. Although it is, it is no more contagious than the common cold. But it is still a good idea to take precautions. Washing your hands or your toddler's hands frequently can help prevent the spreading of germs.

### Signs of Croup

Many parents who have dealt

with croup in toddlers have found that the symptoms tend to be at their worst during the night. Unfortunately, children under the age of three are more likely to have the most severe croup symptoms. The most common symptoms of croup cough include:

- A barking cough
- A hoarse voice (caused by the swelling of the vocal cords)
- A mild fever, up to 104°

calm, you may want to keep a close eye on her. If her symptoms get worse, you may need to take a trip to your local emergency room.  
 If your child experiences any of these symptoms, go to the nearest emergency room immediately:  
 • None of the home treatments work to ease the symptoms  
 • Breathing becomes a struggle  
 • Child can't speak or cry due to a lack of breath  
 • Child's lips or skin are turning blue  
 Although spasmodic croup is usually eased by home remedies, emergency treatment for severe spasmodic croup may be necessary. Always keep a close eye on your child's croup symptoms to make sure they don't worsen.
