

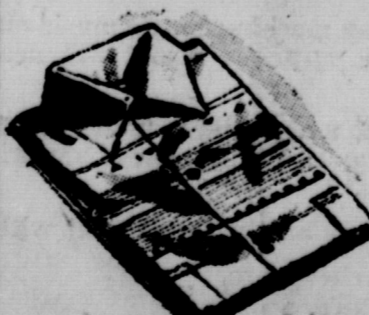

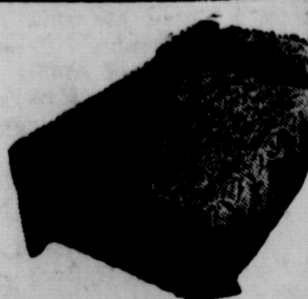

Limited Feeding of Gilts Reduced Litter and Pig Size

Sixteen pairs of littermate gilts were placed in two groups at the University of Minnesota to study the effect of limited feeding on growth and reproduction. Averaging 120 lbs. at the beginning of the test, all gilts got the same ration. But one group was fed a limited amount while the other pigs got what was considered normal feeding.

At farrowing, the normal-fed gilts weighed an average of 429 lbs.; the limited gilts, 304 lbs. The normal pigs farrowed an average of 8.23 live pigs with an average weight of 2.85 lbs. and a 56-day weight of 31.7 lbs. The gilts on limited feed farrowed only 7 live pigs, weighing 2.63 lbs. each at birth and 27.5 lbs. at 56 days.

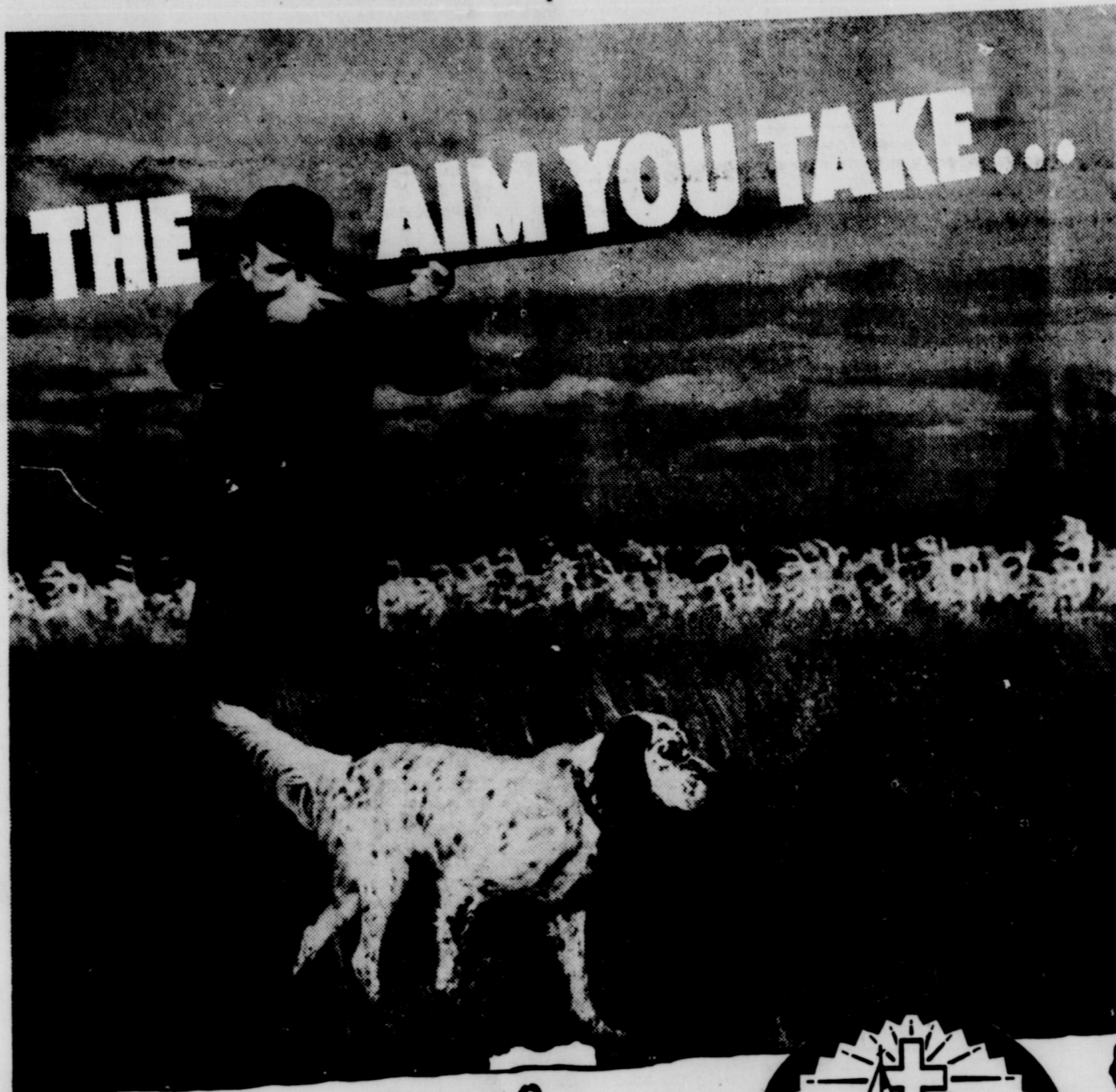

CHRISTMAS PACKAGES NOW

Postmaster Jamison announced that there has been a steady flow of Christmas packages through the post office in the past few days. He is glad to see that many people are getting their Christmas cards and gifts into the post office pointing out that packages should all be mailed by December 5th and those points before Decem-

Stressing the need for everyone to cooperate on this 1955 "Mail Early for Christmas" campaign, Postmaster Jamison says that by following these three simple rules, you're certain to have your gifts delivered before Christmas Day: Wrap them securely. Address them correctly, and Mail them early. He went on to say, "Of course early mailing of all Christmas cards and gifts is a big factor in getting everything delivered before Christmas. Keep in mind that careful packing and correct addressing is equally important. Every year many poorly wrapped packages break often despite careful handling and we often have to

puzzle over addresses which are incomplete or simply cannot be read at all." He urged that patrons ask for free copies of a new publication, "Packaging and Wrapping Parcels for Mailing," now available at the Wheeler Post Office. Advance care in preparing gift packages for the mails and making sure that all addresses are legible and complete will prevent disappointment to sender and receiver alike. "If you have any articles of unusual size or bulk, better check with the Post Office before attempting to mail them," the Postmaster warns. "There are limits on size and weight of packages. It is always better to use cor-

rugated cartons for shipping your gifts especially where there are a number of various sized objects. Use plenty of wadded tissue or newspaper in the cartons for extra protection against shock. Complete each package by wrapping in heavy paper and tying it with strong cord. As extra precaution against loss, Postmaster Jamison advised placing both your return address and the recipient's address inside the carton or package before it is wrapped. Don't seal your parcel unless you include a notice reading "Contents merchandise - may be opened for postal inspection" along with your return address and the recipient's address on the mailing label. If you use Christmas stickers or seals put them on the back of your Christmas cards and packages so that they will not conflict with the address on the front. Before you release your packages be sure that proper postage is firmly affixed to each. This information can be obtained from another free publication, "Domestic Rates and Fees."

quail, and they need to know these things throughout a series of good and bad years like we have witnessed since 1950. When and only when these things are known about a quail crop can the relative importance of hunting as a limiting influence be measured.

What hunters want and need is a sustained yield of quail, with fair to good hunting every season. To provide this kind of hunting is the purpose and direction of present-day quail research. Bobwhites hatched the preceding spring and summer carry their age within 10-day limits on certain feather patterns found on their wings.

The sex is of course easily determined by the different color markings on the head and neck of males and females. By the use of these indicators, the quail biologists can determine the make-up of fall populations as surely as the rancher knows the make-ups of his range herds. This requires examination of fair more quail than is feasible by scientific collection, and this is where the hunter comes in.
