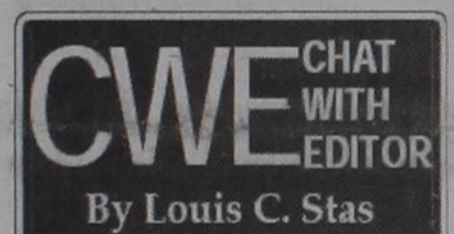

In 2005, The Texas Department of Transportation held a public hearing to discuss making HWY 83 a four lane highway and building sidewalks on both sides of the highway. After two lengthy meetings, several residents stated it would create a hardship on their businesses if HWY 83 was widened.

TXDOT met with the Mayor and Council and because of the resident's concern decided not to widen the highway. Therefore, TXDOT would not pay for the sidewalks. After HWY 83 was completely rebuilt, many residents voiced their concerns about the safety of the pedestrians along this route. They requested the city do something to remedy this dangerous situation. Therefore, Mayor Wanda Herd began to look for a way to fund the sidewalks the residents had been requesting.

In 2007, Mayor Herd was informed that the Amarillo Area Foundation was offering a matching grant of \$50,000.00 to celebrate their 100 year anniversary. The Wheeler EDC gave the city the \$50,000.00 to be used for the matching grant. After 5 years the sidewalks have become a reality with the funding coming from the Wheeler EDC, Amarillo Area Foundation, and private donations. Mayor Bob McCain and the City Council would like to thank ever one who gave of their time and money to see this project completed.

## OLD TIMES NOT FORGOTTEN

### I'M NORMAL

I guess we all think we're pretty normal, but may have some doubts about a few of our friends. I used to work with another welder who just had to have his welding table lined up perfectly parallel with and a certain distance from the wall of our shop. To make it easier to keep track of, he took an ink marker and made a mark where each table leg touched the floor. If it got scooted out of place a little, he could see it and put it back on his marks. Since the table weighed about a thousand pounds, he'd have to use the overhead crane to get it back in place.

Being the "good ol' boys," we were, we took turns scooting his table just a little out of place nearly every day. After a few months of adjusting it daily, he stopped doing it. I'm not altogether sure what "normal" is, but if it's doing everyday stuff pretty much like most people, maybe I am. It's for sure, we all have some things that we do identically, every day. I'll list just a few of mine. More than likely, most of you have similar habits. ...Put left sock on first; right arm in shirt first and button it from top down. Now it's time for the pants. Left leg in first, belt buckle goes on right side, carry billfold in left back pocket, put change in left front pocket, carry knife and truck keys in right front pocket, left shoe on first, always put the peanut butter on the same side of cracker or toast, always put sugar in the coffee cup before pouring coffee. Thumb through a magazine from

the back to front, start up stairs left foot first, usually count steps when climbing stairs. In school, I'd usually crank the pencil sharpener six turns, then looked to see if it was sharp enough. When digging, I always use my left foot to push the spade into the ground. When using a shovel, hoe, or rake, my left hand is the lowest on the handle. Going through, or over a wire fence, it's right leg first, but when I climb a ladder, it's left foot first.

I'll admit, some of our habits may be a little goofy, and at times, may even annoy our spouses a dab. My early-morning routines keep me from having to do hardly any thinking until after breakfast, and that's the way I need it.

I don't mean this disrespectfully, but I've got a suspicion that our preacher and his roping buddies have some routines that they go through before and after roping; like maybe giving their horse a pep talk, or making promises to it. Then again, I could be wrong.

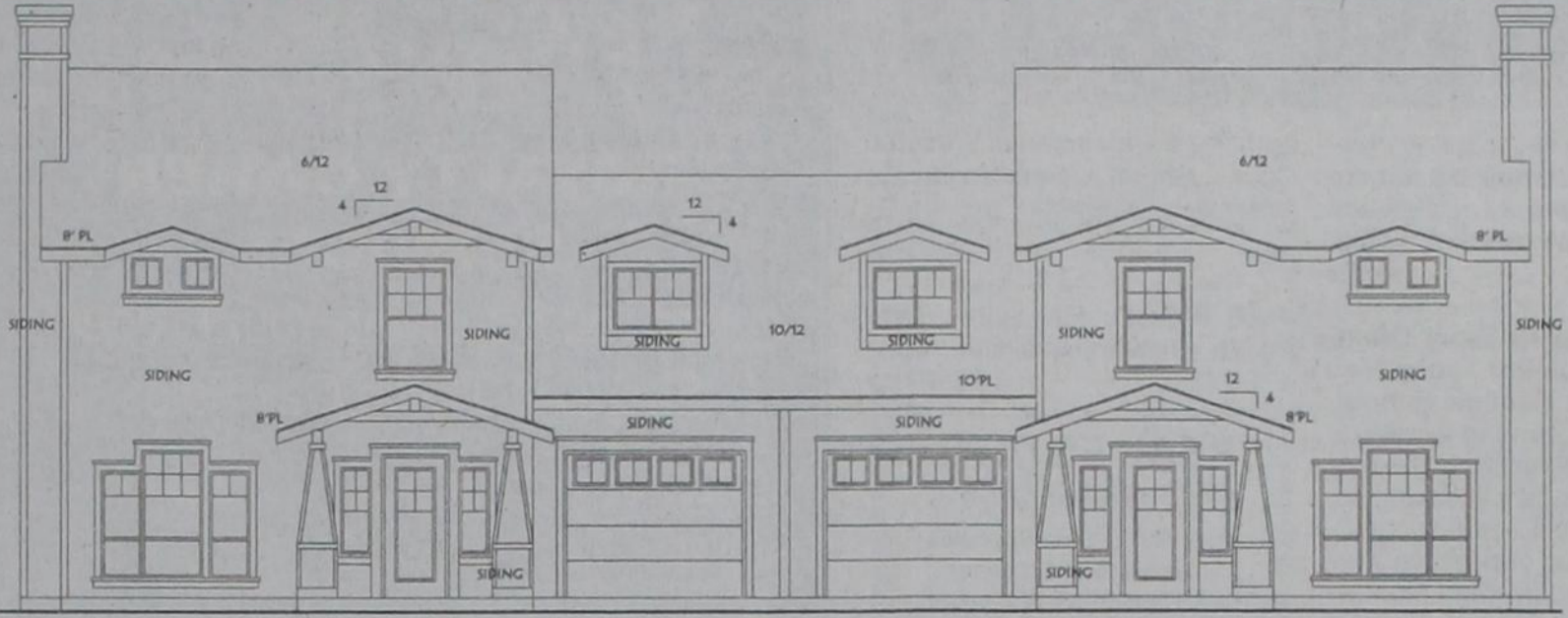

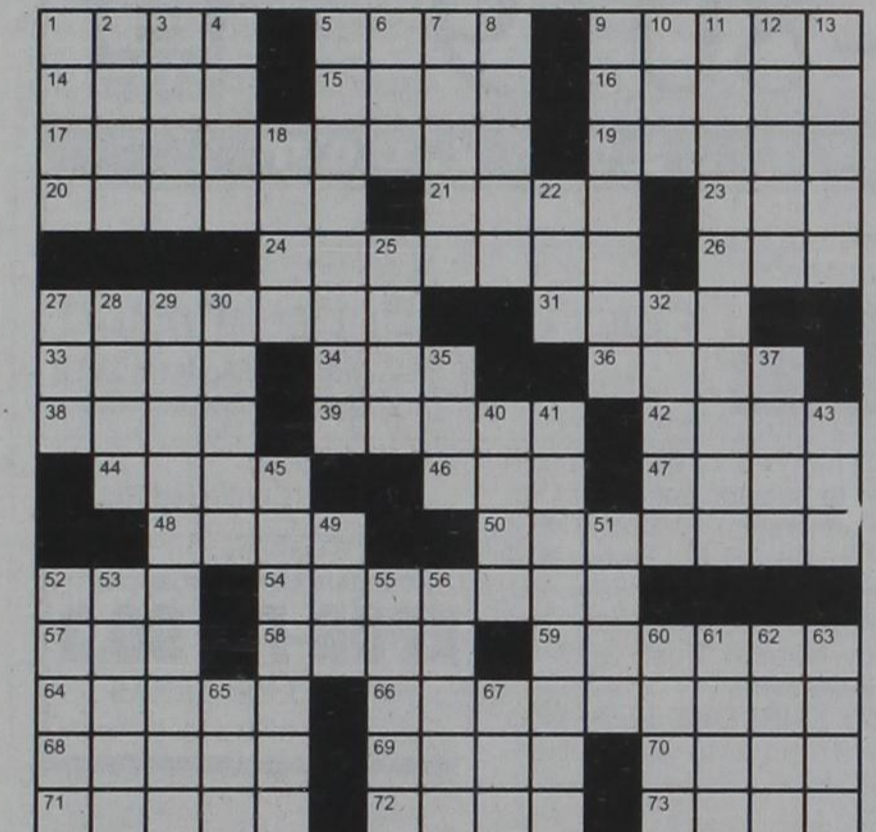

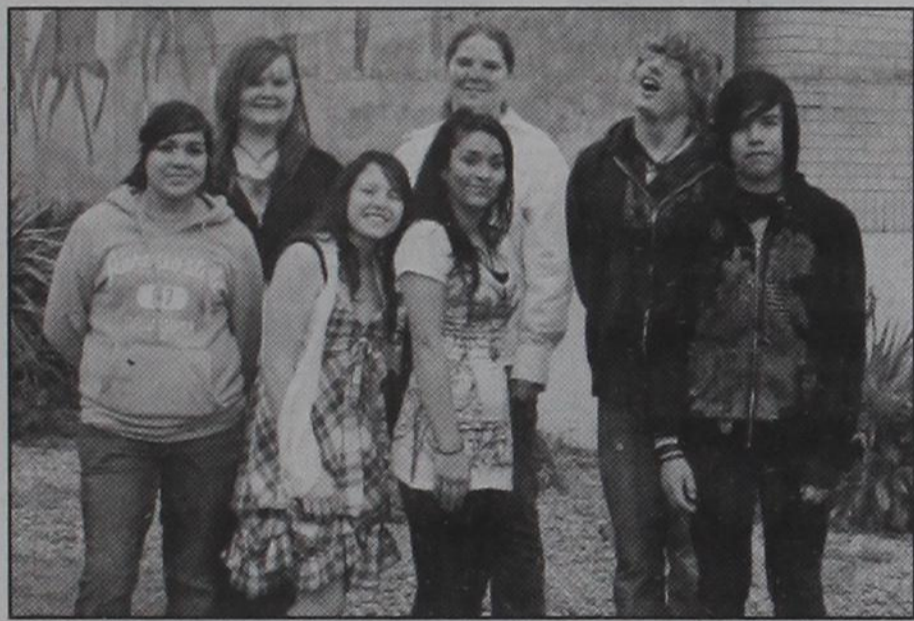

### Parkview Artery Distracted Drivers

You know you have done it, you've reach over to get something. You've answered your phone or text, took a bite of something, even turned around to talk to someone, especially if you have kids in the car.

**What does it mean to be a distracted driver?**

**There are three main types of distraction:**

- Visual — taking your eyes off the road
- Manual — taking your hands off the wheel
- Cognitive — taking your mind off what you're doing

Distracted driving is any non-driving activity a person engages in that has the potential to distract him or her from the primary task of driving and increase the risk of crashing.

While all distractions can endanger drivers' safety, texting is the most alarming because it involves all three types of distraction.

**Other distracting activities include:**

- Using a cell phone
- Eating and drinking
- Talking to passengers
- Grooming
- Reading, including maps
- Using a PDA or navigation system
- Watching a video
- Changing the radio station, CD, or Mp3 player.

**Research on distracted driving reveals some surprising facts:**

- 20 percent of injury crashes in 2009 involved reports of distracted driving. (NHTSA).
- Of those killed in distracted-driving-related crashes, 995 involved reports of a cell phone as a distraction (18% of fatalities in distraction-related crashes). (NHTSA)

- In 2009, 5,474 people were killed in U.S. roadways and an estimated additional 448,000 were injured in motor vehicle crashes that were reported to have involved distracted driving.
- The age group with the greatest proportion of distracted driving was the under-20 age group — 16 percent of all drivers younger than 20 involved in fatal crashes were reported to have been distracted while driving. (NHTSA)

- Drivers who use hand-held devices are four times as likely to get into crashes serious enough to injure themselves. (Source: Insurance Institute for Highway Safety)
- Using a cell phone use while driving, whether it's hand-held or hands-free, delays a driver's reactions as much as having a blood alcohol concentration at the legal limit of .08 percent.

**There are a number of important steps drivers can take to cut down on distracted driving. But the best strategy is always simply to decide to put down the phone while you're behind the wheel. Some phone apps will screen texts and calls with a reply that say the driver will return the call when he or she has reached the destination safely.**
