Sheriff Finsterwald Reports Cost of Jail Repairs would Be Over \$800,000

The Commissioners' Court of Wheeler County, Texas, met in regular session on Monday, October 24, 2011, at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioners' courtroom of the Wheeler County Courthouse, 401 Main Street, Wheeler, Texas, to consider prior bills and discuss matters of mutual concern.

At 10:00 a.m. the court reconvened to consider fourteen items on the agenda.

There were no minutes of previous meeting.

The court voted to approve the hourly payroll time sheets for payment as presented.

The commissioners voted to pay the bills as approved.

No action was taken on the budget.

No action was taken on the burn ban.

The reports of the Justice of the Peace, Pct. 2; Tax Assessor and Treasurer were approved by the court.

Tim Parker and Brad Stepp met with the court and ask their consideration in combining the county's supplemental insurance plan for employees. They represented Colonial Insurance. No

action was taken.

Pamela Frisk, PRPC, met with the court to update 911 Interlocal Agreement between PRPC and Wheeler County Texas. The agreement will be in affect through 2013.

The check for the Wheeler County Grant to Shamrock Meals on Wheels had to be made out to Shamrock Meals on Wheels, Inc. The grants for Shamrock and Wheeler were made at an earlier meeting. Inc. was left out of the motion.

No action was taken on Supplemental and Final Order Adopting Redistricting Plan. The commissioners had not had time to study the plan. It will be on the agenda for the next meeting.

Wheeler County Sheriff Joel Finsterwald informed the court that a bid for correcting the problems at the county jail was in the amount of \$800,000. A second bid is expected this week. No action was taken.

Devon Energy Corp was given permission to bore under County Road 21 at two different locations for the installation of an oil and gas pipeline.

Colts Meet Spearman

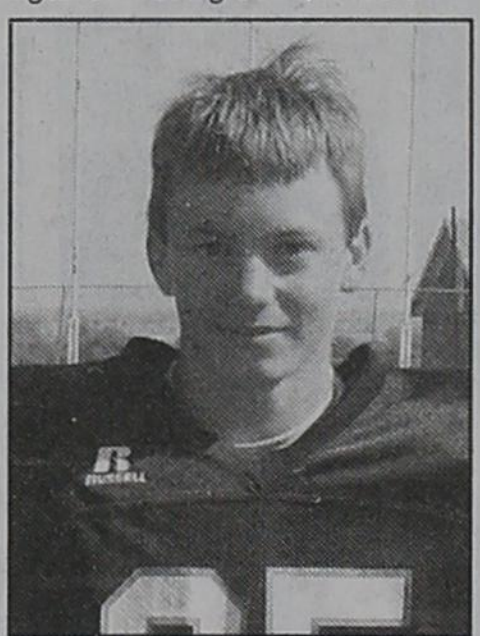
Wheeler Colts Win 1, Lose 1

Wheeler County SWCD 2012 Tree Sales

The Wheeler County Soil and Water Conservation District will be taking tree orders from now through February 23, 2012. Our tree prices are the same this year as they were last year.

Bare root species available are American Plum, Black Cherry, Bur Oak, Chinkapin Oak, Nanking Cherry, Sand Cherry, Sawtooth Oak, Shumard Oak, Flameleaf Sumac, Aromatic, Sumac and Sand Plum. They are sold in multiples of 25 and priced at \$40.

Plastic containerized species available are Arborvitae Oriental, Austrian Pine, Colorado Blue Spruce, Eastern Redcedar, Pinon Pine and Lacebark Elm. They are sold in multiples of 30 and priced at \$60.

This year the only paper containerized species available is Eastern Redcedar. They are sold in multiples of 30 and priced at \$75.

If you would like to place an order, please come by the Wheeler County SWCD office at 1410 S. Alan Bean Blvd., Wheeler, TX. Our office is open Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Trees will be available for pick up on approximately March 23, 2012. TxDOT Considers Shamrock Lights

The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT), in agreement with the City of Shamrock, will conduct a traffic signal study at the intersections of US 83 and East 2nd Street and US 83 and Business I-40 in Shamrock. Beginning November 14, 2011, the signals at these two intersections will be placed in flashing mode and remain flashing for 90 days. Advance warning signs with "traffic signals under study" will be installed.

"TxDOT recently completed phase one of the study at the above mentioned intersections", said Bart Sherrill, TxDOT Special Jobs Coordinator. "The initial study revealed that the volume of traffic through these intersections did not meet the warrants for traffic signals."

TxDOT's goal is to provide the safest transportation system possible, and the purpose of this study is to reexamine the operational aspects of these intersections.
