THE "GIANT ARROWS" OF THE QUANH PARKER TRAIL

The Quanh Parker Trail "Giant Arrows" are sculpted by artist Charles A. Smith of New Home, Texas and have been presented as his gift to the Texas Plains Trail Region Counties of the Texas Panhandle. These unique markers have been placed throughout the Panhandle indicating researched and authenticated locations of interest along the Quanh Parker Trail. This historic trail honors landmarks, sites, events and artifacts that link the

Panhandle region to the Native Americans who once roamed the plains of the Texas Panhandle.

The Giant Arrows symbolize the Comanche people's presence in a region once known as "The Comancheria". The Arrows serve as visual markers commemorating the long-ago presence of a great chief who was successful in leading his people to bridge the worlds of two cultures. Chief Quanh Parker's legacy is shared by all 52 counties of the Texas Panhandle.



## Sign-up for CSP Program by January 13

USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) State Conservationist Salvador Salinas reminds agriculture producers that the ranking period cut-off date for the Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP) is January 13, 2012. Producers interested in CSP should submit applications to their local NRCS office by the deadline so their applications can be considered during the first ranking period of 2012.

"CSP gives conservation minded producers the ability to apply and build on their current stewardship efforts," says Salinas. "Farmers and ranchers actively engaged in natural resource conservation practice have the opportunity to earn financial rewards through CSP."

CSP is a voluntary five-year program offered to landowners statewide through continuous sign-up. Producers interested in CSP should submit applications to their local NRCS office by the deadline so their applications can be considered during this first ranking period in 2012. Eligible lands include cropland, pastureland, rangeland and non-industrial forestland and agricultural land under the jurisdiction of

# OLD TIMES NOT FORGOTTEN

## WHEELER COUNTY ALLSTARS

I've been intending for a long time to mention the "Babe Ruth League," that a lot of boys my age played on. This was a summer baseball league that was for boys fourteen and fifteen years old. The best I remember, Wheeler, Mobeetie, and Kelton had teams. Our coach at Wheeler was Bus Dorman. I think he had played some semi-pro ball when he was young. As many of you know, he was our county sheriff for many years. He was a really good coach, and spent a lot of his off-duty time with our team.

The coach for Mobeetie's team was Mr. L.R. Reeves, their school superintendent. At the end of the playing season, several boys from each team were picked to make up a team to go to Austin, and play in the state playoffs. Mr. Reeves and Bus Dorman, practiced us together a few times, then we headed to Austin. Thinking back about that trip, and trying to remember who all went, it was plain that I needed some help. This would have to come from some of the guys who had been on that team. I found out that Geoffrey Caldwell, had moved back to Mobeetie after he retired, so I called him up. I told him who I was, and why I was calling. He remembered me and was glad to answer some of my questions. He suggested we get together for some coffee, and talk over old times; after all, fifty-plus years, is a long time. As sometimes happens in life, we never got around to it. Shortly after that, he took sick, and passed away. I didn't try to get started back on this story again for a year or more. A few months ago, I called Ferrell Baird and Bob Hill, to see if they could help. We got together for dinner at Maxey's, in Wheeler, and gave the trip to Austin a good hashing over.

In order to haul all of us boys, it required three cars. Mr. Reeves drove one, Bus Dorman the second, and a young preacher, named Bruce Matthews, from Mobeetie, drove the third car. I thought that was really nice of him. We went about a day early, so we could see some of the sights in Austin. They took us to see the capitol building and the state vault that was out underneath the capitol lawn. We went down to the tunnel from the basement of the building. They had the vault door open at the time. We were told that it weighed twenty eight tons, but was so well balanced and the hinges were on bearings, that the smallest boy in our group would be able to swing it easily. Bob Hill was about the smallest, so they let him swing it a little. He didn't have the least bit of trouble moving it. After that, we climbed the stairs to the top of the capitol dome. For anyone who hasn't ever heard; the Texas capitol dome is taller than the U.S. capitol dome in Washington, D.C. On the way back down the stairs, Bob Hill took off the little hat he'd been wearing, and threw it out into the center of the dome. It took several seconds for the hat to finally hit the floor. Needless to say, he did get a pretty good scolding for that.

We spent the night in a nice motel and the next day, they drove us down to the baseball field where we were going to play later that evening. I don't personally remember much about the field. Ferrell and Bob said they couldn't remember much about it either, other than the smell from the bakery across the street sure stuck in their minds. I don't think the bakery smell had any bearing on us losing our game, but we got beaten pretty badly. Ferrell and Bob both agreed that there were fifteen boys that went on that trip; but for the life of us, we could only come up with fourteen names. We

tried and tried to figure out who was that fifteenth boy, but never could. I personally think it was either Larry Hunter from Wheeler, or Jack Tanner from Samnorwood. Maybe someday, we'll find out. Here's a list of the guys Ferrell, Bob, and I came up with that were our team. ## Parkview Artery Warning Signs of Stroke

If you smoke - quit. If you have high blood pressure, heart disease, diabetes, or high cholesterol, getting them under control - and keeping them under control - will greatly reduce your chances of having a stroke.

Stroke symptoms include:  
SUDDEN numbness or weakness of face, arm or leg - especially on one side of the body.

SUDDEN confusion, trouble speaking or understanding.

SUDDEN trouble seeing in one or both eyes.

SUDDEN trouble walking, dizziness, loss of balance or coordination.

SUDDEN severe headache with no known cause.

Call 9-1-1 immediately if you have any of these symptoms. Note the time you experienced your first symptom.







The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) has notified the **WHEELER MUNICIPAL WATER SYSTEM** that the drinking water being supplied to customers had exceeded the Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL) for nitrate. The U.S. Environmental

Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) has established the MCL for nitrate at 10 milligrams per liter (mg/L) based on a single sample, and has determined that it is a health concern at levels above the MCL. Analysis of the drinking water in your community for nitrate indicates a compliance value in quarter three 2011 of 18mg/L for EP001.

Infants below the age of six months who drink water containing nitrate in excess of the MCL could become seriously ill and, if untreated, may die. Symptoms include shortness of breath and blue baby syndrome. If your child is under the age of six months, the child must be given an alternative water supply for any consumption. Boiling the affected water is not an effective treatment for nitrate removal.

Most consumers do not need to use an alternative water supply. However, if you have health concerns, you may want to talk to your doctor to get more information about how this may affect you. We are working to correct the problem.

Bottled water is available at no cost for the affected populations at City Hall. The city is in the process of acquiring water rights with lower nitrates, if possible, to drill 2 new water wells to provide water to the residents of Wheeler.

Please share this information with all people who drink this water, especially those who may not have received this notice directly (i.e., people in apartments, nursing homes, schools, and businesses). You can do this by posting this notice in a public place or distributing copies by hand or mail.



## County Historical Committee Report

The Wheeler County Historical Commission met December 13, 2011, at 2:00 p.m. in the Wheeler County Courthouse break room. After the minutes were approved and the treasurer's report was accepted, a review of the progress for the year was discussed. Historical designations for cemeteries in the county were the focus of the commission for 2011. The Wheeler, Mobeetie and Zybach cemeteries have been designated by the Texas Historical Commission and will also receive official Historical Markers from THC in the Spring. The work will continue on new designations for Kelton, Bow-

ers, Turcott and Center for 2012. A second accomplishment was funding by the Wheeler County Commissioners Court for the markers and supplies for the project. A third goal was to encourage the designation of family farms and ranches to the Family Land Heritage Program Sponsored by The Texas Department Of Agriculture. The Lohberger Family Ranch received this designation in Austin, Texas, this year. With the efforts of the Wheeler County Historical Commission it is hoped that interest will be renewed in the history and culture of Wheeler, County, Texas.

One of the many ties of the Comanche people to the Wheeler County area is the Sweetwater Creek Battle, September 12, 1874. This battle was fought on a five mile stretch of the Sweetwater Creek, just north of present day New Mobeetie. It was a running battle between the United States Military, lead by Major Wm. R. Price and the Comanche and Kiowa Indian Tribes.

As the last stronghold of the free Comanche, the Panhandle Region is unique for being the last frontier of the 48 contiguous states of America. These "Giant Arrows" provide an object of discovery, as well as an incentive for travelers, scholars, educators, and students to locate. Texas artist Charles A Smith's "Giant Arrow" is physical reminder of the vanished nomadic Native Americans who once roamed free in this vast area. For more information go to [www.guanahparkertrail.com](http://www.guanahparkertrail.com) "Quanah Parker Trail." The goal of installing giant arrows along the QPT is to mark with distinction each TPTR county's connection in the past to Quanah Parker and the Comanche people, whose presence preceded the arrival of Anglo pioneer settlers.

The arrow is the creation of Charles Smith, a cotton farmer, welder, artist and sculptor. He originally was commissioned by Gid Moore Crop Insurance Company to create an arrow based on Henry Wadsworth Longfellow's poem, "The Arrow and the Song." This first arrow was installed about five years ago as the first piece of an Art and Literacy non-profit sculpture park on a 7-acre site at the intersections of FM211

and FM1730 in New Home. Painted red, white, and black, the arrow rises grandly, singing in the wind. With the blessing of the great grandchildren of Quanah Parker, the arrow and its song will now mark the Quanah Parker Trail. All other arrows to come after it will now denote each county's place on the Quanah Parker Trail. Each arrow will be painted in the Comanche colors of red, blue, and gold.

Charles Smith, working in conjunction with the TPTR, donated the arrows to the Quanah Parker Trail to help develop a cultural and historical trail that uniquely characterizes the region, and sets it apart from all other areas of Texas.

A Giant Arrow, courtesy of sculptor and artist Charles Smith of New Home, Texas, landed (DATE) in (NAME OF CITY) at (LOCATION).

Smith and community volunteers consisting of (NAMES OF VOLUNTEERS) installed the outdoor sculpture to highlight the history and legacy of Comanche presence in (NAME OF COUNTY), officially placing the county on the Quanah Parker Trail.

Placement of the arrow required a (FRONT END LOADER or BUCKET

TRUCK) to move it from a trailer; two bags of concrete mix; and a 2-foot by 1/4 inch diameter hole to place the tip. The arrow stands about 22 feet tall; and 1/4-inch steel rods, resembling the fletching of feathers, vibrate in the wind. A metal plate on the tip of the arrow with the number (ARROW NUMBER) signifies the order of placement in the 52-county Texas Plains Trail Region (TPTR).

The TPTR is one of its heritage regions in the state formed by the Texas

Historical Commission. Heritage regions strive to develop and promote thematic cultural and heritage sites and trails for their communities. The sites and trails preserve local history and attract the interest of travelers and tourists to encourage them to come to the area for a visit.

The community leaders from the 52 counties that form the TPTR located

in the Texas Panhandle wanted to develop a cultural and historical trail that uniquely characterizes it and sets it apart from all other areas of Texas. They arrived at the idea of developing a Quanah Parker Trail (QPT) in the

Texas Panhandle plains region. Our region is remarkable for the fact that it formed "The Last Frontier" in the 48 contiguous states where Native Americans last roamed free before being removed to reservations. The trail honors historical landmarks, sites, events, and artifacts in museums that link our region to the Native Americans who last roamed the Texas Panhandle Plains. It is named after Quanah Parker to honor his role as the chief of the Comanches, who were the most powerful Native American presence in the region. Quanah Parker is considered by many historians to be one of the most outstanding native sons of Texas. The TPTR currently is developing a Website that can be found by googling The Arrow and the Song for West Texas

According to Dolores Mosser, past president of the Texas Plains Trail region (TXPT), a cultural and heritage tourism development program of the Texas Historical Commission, the community leaders from the 52 counties that form the Texas Plains Trail Region wanted to develop a cultural and historical trail that uniquely distinguishes it from all other areas of Texas.

The trail honors landmarks, sites, events, and artifacts that link our region to the Native Americans who last roamed the Texas Panhandle Plains.

It is named after Quanah Parker to honor his role as the chief of the Comanches, who were the most powerful Native American presence in the region. Quanah Parker is considered by many historians to rank among the many outstanding native sons of Texas. As a leader among one of the

last nomadic bands of Native Americans remaining in the Texas Panhandle Plains, Quanah Parker not only posed a valiant last stand to defend the lands and way of life of his people, but he insightfully realized when surrender was necessary in order to save his people from defeat and death at the hands of the U.S. Army. After leading his Kwahadi band in 1875 to the reservation in Indian Territory near Ft. Sill, Oklahoma, he then saw the need to guide all the Comanches gathered there to adopting to a new way of life thereafter.

Before he died in 1911, Quanah Parker returned frequently to towns and ranches of the Texas Plains Trail region. In this new role, he functioned as a diplomat, businessman and leader for his people to help all, both Native Americans and pioneer settlers alike, forge a bridge of understanding between the two cultures.

Dr. Holle Humphries, a scholar of the arts, with a keen interest in public art, harbored the goal of integrating the contribution of artists and art with the economic development plans and ideas for the Texas Plains Trail Region. In the course of traveling with Dolores Mosser across the Texas Plains Trail Region during a 52-county rolling stamp cancel trip last year, the two discovered on January 21, 2010, a sculpture of a Giant Arrow piercing the grounds of New Home, Texas.

Both Mosser and Humphries were enchanted to discover that not only was the arrow immense in scale, towering 25 feet into the air, but it exuded aural properties as well. When the wind souged through the steel wires forming the upper "feathers" of the fletching, they could hear the arrow "sing". Immediately they saw the great potential of the Giant Arrow to physically mark important sites of the QPT.

Humphries set about researching who had created the sculpture. By following a hunch and telephoning the local high school, she learned from talking with a staff member that the arrow had been sculpted by her uncle, Charles A. Smith of New Home, Texas. A follow-up phone call to Mr. Smith revealed that the arrow had been commissioned by Gid R. Moore, a crop insurer, as the precursor (Continued Page 7)
