Domestic violence is a pattern in any relationship that is used to gain or maintain power and control oven an intimate partner.

Abuse is physical (such as hitting) sexual, emotional, economic or psychological actions or threats of actions that influence another person. This includes behavior that frightens, intimidates, terrorizes, manipulates, hurts, humiliates, blames, injures or wounds some-

Domestic violence can happen to anyone of any race, sexual orientation, religion or gender. It can happen to couples who are married, living together or are dating. It affects people of all socioeconomic and educational backgrounds.

Child Abuse

Child abuse can be described as any act, or failure to act, that endangers or impairs a child's physical or emotional health and devel-

Child abuse can take the form of physical abuse, sexual abuse, emotional abuse or neglect such as failure to provide for a child's physical needs including appropriate healthcare, suitable clothing, adequate hygiene, housing and shelter, and sufficient food and

Bullying Bullying is unwanted, aggressive behavior among school aged children that involves a real or perceived power imbalance. Bullying includes actions such as making threat, spreading rumors, attacking someone physically or verbally, and excluding someone

from a group or purpose. Bullying can take several forms such as verbal (saying or writing mean things), social (spreading rumors or leaving someone out on purpose) or physical (hitting, kicking, pushing, tripping, taking or breaking someone's things).
