Parkview Artery Domestic Violence

Domestic violence is a pattern in any relationship that is used to gain or maintain power and control over an intimate partner. Abuse is physical (such as hitting) sexual, emotional, economic or psychological actions or threats of actions that influence another person. This includes behavior that frightens, intimidates, terrorizes, manipulates, hurts, humiliates, blames, injures or wounds someone. Domestic violence can happen to anyone of any race, sexual orientation, religion or gender. It can happen to couples who are married, living together or are dating. It affects people of all socioeconomic and educational backgrounds.

Child Abuse
Child abuse can be described as any act, or failure to act, that endangers or impairs a child's physical or emotional health and development. Child abuse can take the form of physical abuse, sexual abuse, emotional abuse or neglect such as failure to provide for a child's physical needs including appropriate healthcare, suitable clothing, adequate hygiene, housing and shelter, and sufficient food and water.

Bullying
Bullying is unwanted, aggressive behavior among school aged children that involves a real or perceived power imbalance. Bullying includes actions such as making threat, spreading rumors, attacking someone physically or verbally, and excluding someone from a group or purpose. Bullying can take several forms such as verbal (saying or writing mean things), social (spreading rumors or leaving someone out on purpose) or physical (hitting, kicking, pushing, tripping, taking or breaking someone's things).

Elder Abuse
Elder abuse includes involuntary seclusion, intimidation, humiliation, harassment, threats of punishment, deprivation, hitting, slapping, pinching, kicking, any type of corporal punishment, sexual assault, coercion, or harassment, verbal abuse, or any oral, written or gestured language that includes disparaging or derogatory terms, regardless of the person's ability to hear or comprehend. Neglect means the failure to provide good or services which are necessary to avoid physical or emotional harm or pain. Exploitation includes a caretaker's illegal use of a senior's resources for monetary or personal benefit, profit or gain.

Why should I get involved?
Texas Law requires any person who believes that a child or person 65 years or older, or an adult with disabilities is being abused, neglected, or exploited to report the circumstances to the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services (DFPS). Any persons suspecting abuse and not reporting it can be held liable for a misdemeanor or state jail felony. Any person making a report in good faith is immune from civil or criminal liability and the name of the person making the report is kept confidential. There is safety in numbers.

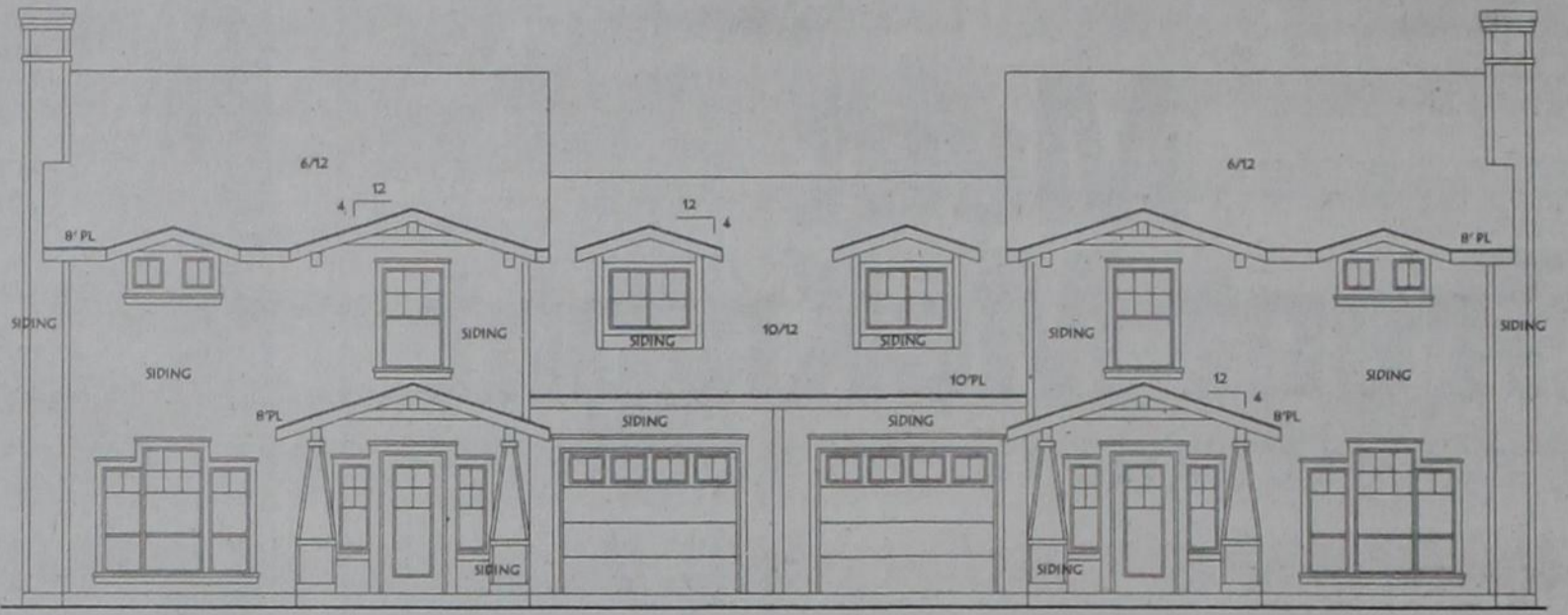

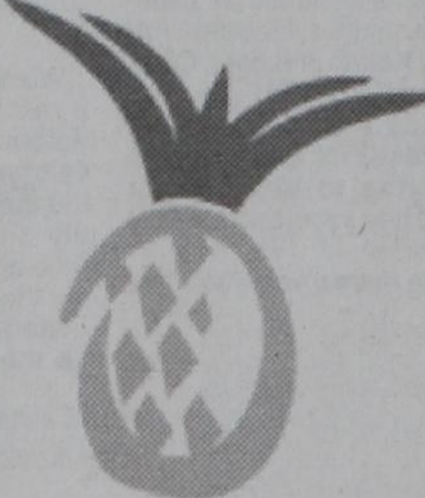
