

Wheeler Cemetery Receives **Historical Cemetery Designation**

The Texas Historical Commission (THC) recently designated Wheeler Cemetery as a Historic Texas Cemetery on July 28, 2011. The distinction means the cemetery has been legally recorded through the THC's Historic Texas Cemetery Program, an important step in ensuring its preservation.

This designation is reserved for cemeteries that are at least 50 years old and documented through the Historic Texas Cemeteries process to record their historic association and significance.

"This designation is a tool that will increase public awareness of these important cultural resources," said Mark Wolfe, executive director of the THC. "Knowledge and education are among (Continued Page 8) preservation of a historic cem-

etery." "We are very pleased to have this designation, "said Beth Shelton, Wheeler County Historihold valuable historic information and they are often the last reminders of early settlement' historical events, religious beliefs, lifestyles and genealogy. While the Historic Texas Cemetery designation encourages cemetery preservation, it cannot guarantee that a historic cemetery will avoid destruction. Threats to historic cemeteries include urban expansion and development, vandalism, grazing animals and long-term deterioration from weather and uncontrolled

vegetation. The THC developed the Historic Texas Cemetery designation to address the destruction of historic cemeteries and the illegal removal of cemetery fixtures. Any individual or organization is eligible to submit an application for (kick blocked)

Wes Crites Announces Republican Candidacy For Wheeler Co. Sheriff

vves Crites, retired Commander of the Texas Department of Public Safety's Criminal Law Enforcement Narcotics Division, has officially announced his candidacy for the 2012 Wheeler County Sheriff's election.

Wes and his wife, Shelia, have been married for 36 years and moved to Wheeler County four years ago where they purchased a ranch east of Shamrock. They have four grown children and 10 grandchildren. They are actively involved in the Shamrock school system, raising two of their grandchildren that they have legally adopted as their own, Wesley, a freshman at Shamrock High School, and Sierra, a fourth grader at Shamrock Elementary. Wes is a member of the Shamrock Boosters Club and Shelia is active in the Shamrock Band Boosters.

Crites was raised in Pampa, and is a Gray County native. Crites began his 34 year law enforcement career as a Trooper in he served as a Trooper, followed by three years as an undercover narcotics agent. Four years was spent as a Sergeant and later a Lieutenant for Narcotics Investigations and 17 years as a Captain, supervising 30 counties in the Dallas/Fort Worth area. He retired after three years of serving as Commander of the Narcotics Division headquartered in Austin. Crites is licensed as a Private Investigator by the State of Texas and is currently commissioned as a Special Texas Ranger for the Texas DPS. He also currently holds an Associates Degree in General Education with an emphasis on Criminal Justice and holds a Master Peace Officer Certificate from Texas Commission on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Education.





Snacking to Even Your Blood Sugar?

While growing up, you might have been told that snacking between meals would ruin your appetite or cause you to gain weight. And although those statements could potentially be true, snacking mindfully can benefit your health, appetite and weight. Among several other benefits, snacking between meals helps to even blood sugar levels — a particularly important benefit for diabetics. Benefits

Frequent snacking is most often recommended for those with diabetes. Medications used to treat diabetes — including insulin and physical activity can lower blood sugar levels in diabetics. When blood sugar drops too low, a condition known as hypoglycemia develops. Symptoms of hypoglycemia include shakiness, sweating, dizziness, confusion and muscle weakness. If left untreated, the condition can cause dangerous effects on the body. Snacking between meals allows diabetics to maintain healthy blood sugar levels.

Healthy Snacks

When snacking between meals, choose foods that are high in carbohydrates. When you eat carbohydrates, your body quickly converts them into glucose, raising your blood sugar level almost immediately. Although you can also eat snacks high in protein and fat between meals, they raise your blood sugar level more slowly and less significantly. It is recommended choosing snacks with 15 to 45 g of carbohydrates. Healthy snack ideas include fresh fruit, whole-grain chips with salsa, a handful of nuts, whole grain crackers with peanut butter, cottage cheese, a small baked potato and raw vegetables dipped in hummus (is a dip made of chickpea paste with various additions, such as olive oil, fresh garlic). Snacks to Avoid

Although carbohydrate-rich foods are good to snack on throughout the day, avoid simple carbohydrates that cause a quick spike in blood sugar, followed by a quick drop. Snack to avoid include those made with white flour, white sugar and white rice. These categories often include crackers, processed foods, desserts and cereals. Although these snacks might help temporarily increase your blood sugar level, the effect is only brief and your glucose levels will quickly plummet.

Non-Diabetics Although regular snacking is most commonly suggested for diabetics, people without diabetes can also benefit from regular snacking. Mindful snacking between meals maintains blood sugar levels and provides a continuous supply of fuel for the body and may prevent you from overeating at mealtime. Follow the same rules for snacks by choosing foods that are rich in nutrients, but low in calories, fat and sodium.

View from a personal side As women we all know by now how important it is to do self exams and have our mammograms. And I can hear a lot of women saying to themselves, but I don't have time, those things are so darn uncomfortable, blah, blah.. We all have the same excuses, but we all also know friends, relatives, neighbors that have had breast cancer. And that have survived it. This is a personal testimony of someone that has done just that . ..

I always had regular mammograms, always knew I needed too. I had two sister and two grandmothers that had history of Breast Cancer. So every year like clockwork I had the usual, but one year it was not usual. That year 1997, the test came back positive a small lump on left side of the breast, so they did a lumpectomy, (also removed 9 lymph nodes) inserting a small wire to remove the lump. It came back cancer, cancer such a word. So I went through 6 weeks of radiation, 5 days a week, 200 miles every day, back and forth for treatments. It was quiet an ordeal. Well, I would return for frequent checks, you know every 3 months then every 6 months, then finally once a year. Then 7 years after the diagnosis, in 2004 I was declared cancer

After a 2007 check-up I mentioned to my gynecologist that one of my breasts seems to be shrinking (not bad news to some of us). He said we will just keep an eye on it. Many months later I had to have an emergency appendectomy. While I was at home recovery from that, I found a lump on the underside of the left breast. Keep in mind I have had a mammogram every year since I can remember. Well after testing it came back stage 2 cancer and because of previous history and family history the Doctor recommended and proceeded to do a radical bilateral mastectomy, it was done on Feb 15th 2008; the chemo did not start till May of that year, with one treatment every 3 weeks. Well the first two went well it was the 3rd one that the hair started to go and then go some more. Oh well (It was cooler in summer anyway), then there was more side effects, an increased weakness, mouth sores and so on. But here it is 3 years later, and I am still cancer free, recovered and renewed. I think God and my family and friends who were there with me and to all the Doctors and
