THE PURSUIT OF PEACE

In the world of unrest and confusion, with war clouds and sin on every side, the Human heart is crying for "peace and rest".

There comes the blessed words of our Lord Jesus in St. John 14:27 "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: Not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let Not your heart be troubled, Neither let it be afraid." Also again we here him speak concerning the conditions of life in St. John 16:33. "These things I have spoken unto you, that in me ye might have peace. In the world ye shall have tribulation; but be of good cheer; I have overcome the world."

The Christian with faith in God may have tribulation in this life and still have peace in his own heart by faith in Christ.

The great secret of having peace is in complete surrender of our lives to the Divine Will of our Heavenly Father. The silver tongued prophet Isaiah said we must have a Divine Keeper of our hearts. Isaiah 26:3 "Thou wilt keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on thee: because he trusteth in thee."

When the Human heart finds its self in confusion is when he has let his mind stray away from the Lord.

Again the prophet Isaiah speaks in Chapter 48:22 "There is no peace saith the Lord, unto the wicked." The wicked can have no peace in this life or the life to come. They are like the troubled sea, when it cannot rest, whose waters cast up mire and dirt.

Paul the apostle wrote of wickedness in the last days in the Epistle to Timothy. He said, "Men shall be lovers of their own selves, covetous, boasters, proud, blasphemers, disobedient to parents, unthankful, unholly, Without natural affections, truce breakers, false accusers, fierce, dispisers of those that are good; lovers of pleasure more than lovers of God. Having a form of godliness but denying the power thereof; from such turn away."
