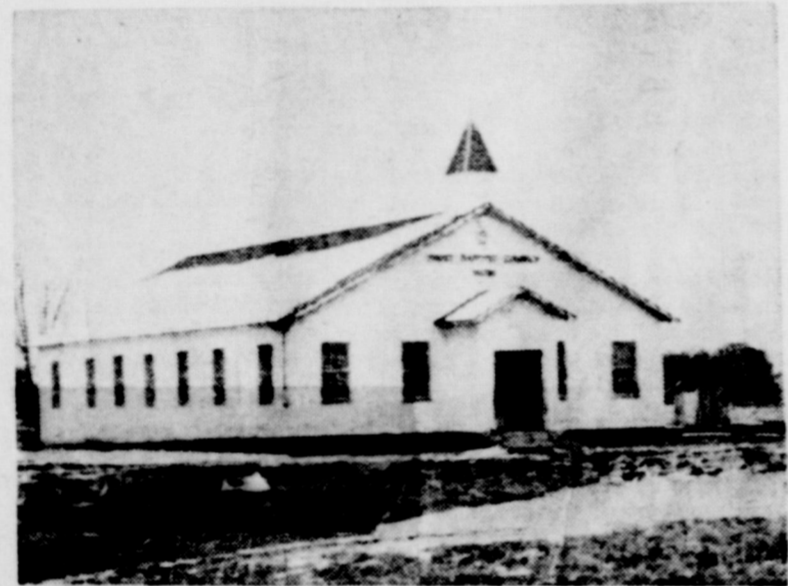

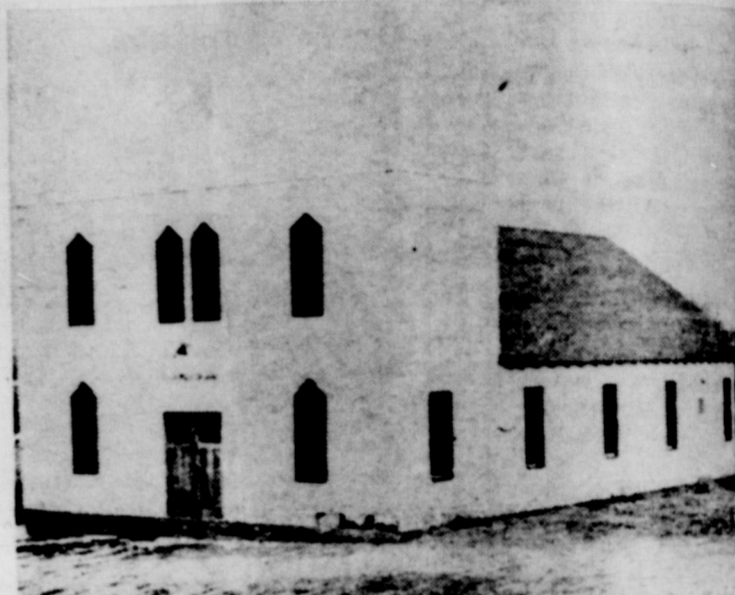
Yes, Christ is able to calm the tempest of winds and water. And He is able to calm the troubled hearts of humanity when they turn to Him in Faith.

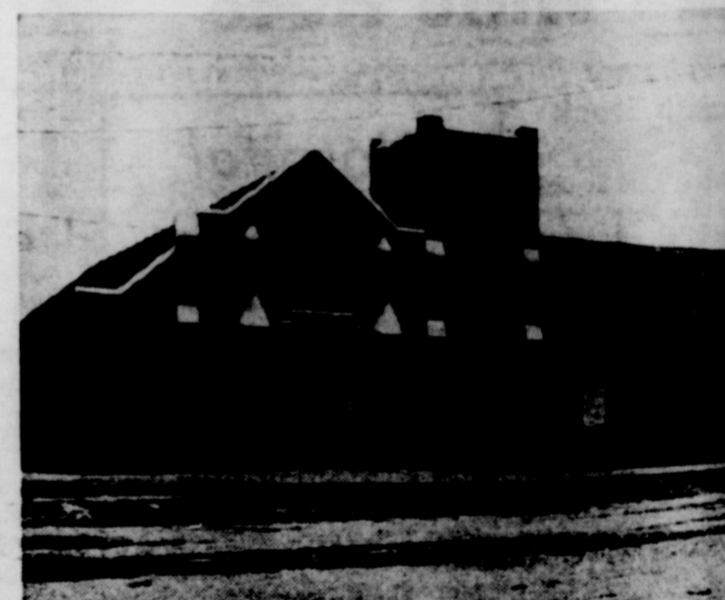

SO YOU WANT TO VOTE

June 25 1958

Former non-residents or minors who shall have since become eligible to vote by reason or length of residence or age, shall not later than 30 days before election (First Primary) obtain exemption from the County Tax Collector. This must be done by June 25, 1958.

July 6-22

Absentee voting for First Primary. Persons may vote absentee at any time not more than 20 days nor less than 3 days prior to election. Application to vote must be made to County Clerk.
