### GOVERNMENT TO MAKE WATER SEWER LOAN

Four years of work, planning and hoping came to a climax last Thursday morning when Mayor Thomas Daughtry received the following telegram:

PLEASED TO ADVISE FACILITIES ADMINISTRATION HAS APPROVED \$110,000 LOAN TO WHEELER TO FINANCE CONSTRUCTION OF WATER AND SEWER FACILITIES.

LYNDON B. JOHNSON  
UNITED STATES SENATOR

The telegram was followed by a letter from the Housing and Home Finance Agency advising that the appropriation had been approved and that a loan agreement was being forwarded to the city council.

The loan agreement was received Tuesday morning, the city council met Tuesday evening and okayed the agreement.

Mayor Thomas Daughtry, city councilman Jake Holcomb, along with the city's engineer left early Wednesday morning to attend a pre-planning conference in Fort Worth.

At the conference they will discuss the general problems which

### WATER-SEWER PROJECT WAS STARTED IN '55

Practically everyone in Wheeler, at sometime or another, had a hand in the water and sewer project. The original idea was conceived in 1955 while Chamber of Commerce members were working on paying and city limit expansion programs. In their contacts with the individual taxpayers they learned of the need for addition water and sewer facilities in Wheeler.

And in 1956 Harry Wofford, president of the Chamber that year, appointed Virgil Jamison and Thomas Daughtry to investigate the advisability, feasibility and possibility of extending water and sewer facilities in Wheeler.

On February 14, 1956 Virgil Jamison and Thomas Daughtry presented the Chamber of Commerce with the facts, figures and charts explaining the feasibility of the proposed water and sewer project.

On May 1st, 1956 Wheeler voters went to the polls and voted for "the issuance of the water works systems bonds and the levying of the tax in payment

### Dunham To Speak At Associational Meeting

The Rev. R. Elmer Dunham, superintendent of missions for the El Paso Baptist Association, will be one of the principal speakers at the annual North Fork Baptist Association meeting Thursday, September 25, at the First Baptist Church of Wheeler.

J. E. Byers of Shamrock, moderator of the association, said the Rev. Dunham will report on denominational work and outline goals for next year's state Baptist program.

Rev. Dunham was recently elected president of the Southern Baptist Convention City Mission Conference. He formerly served as superintendent of city and rural missions for the Baptist General Convention of Texas before becoming missions superintendent for the El Paso association.

While serving as state superintendent, the 54-year-old minister helped Texas Baptists establish more than 500 new churches. He inaugurated a survey program now used by the BGCT to determine areas in which to establish new church work.

Purpose of the associational meeting is to bring messengers from all churches in the association together to share progress reports, get firsthand knowledge of denominational work and to hear inspirational messages.

More people attend the annual meetings in Texas 125 Baptist associations than either the Southern Baptist Convention or the Texas Baptist Convention.

### SHORTY ERWIN HAS LARGE SHETLAND HERD

Some 20 years ago Shorty Erwin bought his oldest son a shetland pony. Today Erwin has one of the finest and perhaps the biggest herd of shetland ponies in the Panhandle.

He has 48 of the small, stocky breed of ponies and his herd is producing from 17 to 30 colts each year.

Erwin has sold his ponies all over the nation. Some have gone to Pennsylvania, some to Georgia and others to California. He has sold them at prices ranging from \$80.00 up to \$1,300.

Erwin keeps the animals on his ranch 4 miles north of Wheeler.

Contrary to the belief that shetland ponies are mean, Erwin says, "they are extremely gentle" but like any other animal they turn mean when mistreated. After all, Erwin said, shetlands aren't like dogs and cats, and they can't be treated like them.

Erwin said the animals cost about 15 cents a day per head to feed them.

## PITTINGER TO SPEAK AT STATE SCHOOL MEET

George S. Gandy of Wheeler, President of the Texas Association of School Boards and former Wheeler Independent School District Board President, announced that Dr. B. F. Pittenger, Professor Emeritus of Educational Administration at The University of Texas, veteran educator and author, will deliver the keynote address at the 12th Annual Meeting of the Texas Association of School Boards which will be held October 12 and 13, 1958, at the Driskill Hotel in Austin. Dr. Pittenger will present the theme of the two-day conference, "What is Wrong With Public Education". Board members will follow up on this address by exploring "What is Being Done About It Both Locally and State-wide?"

Another feature of the program will be an address by Dr. George Z. Bereday, Associate Professor of Comparative Education at Teachers' College, Columbia University, former Polish army officer and recent visitor to Russia, who will speak on "American Observations of Russian Education" at a joint school boards-school administrators banquet on Sunday night, October 12.

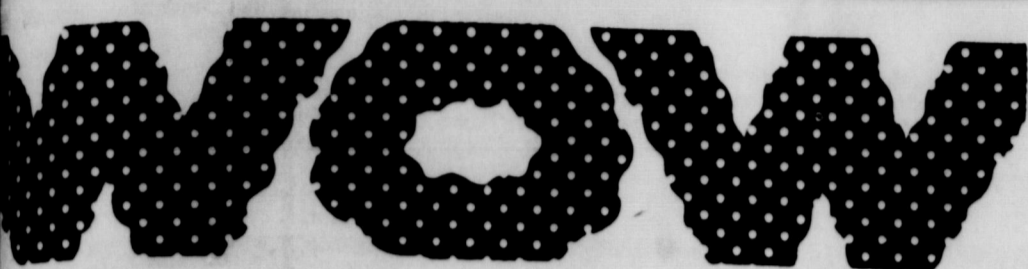
Among others appearing on the two-day program will be Senator A. M. Alkin of Paris; Education Commissioner J. W. Edgar; Mrs. W. D. deGrassi, President of the Texas Congress of Parents and Teachers; L. P. Sturgeon, Director of Public Relations for the Texas State Teachers' Association; Don Morris, Regional Director for the National Citizens Council for Better Education; Ted Andress, El Paso Board member and attorney; and R. L. Ashworth, Amarillo Superintendent of Schools and President of the Texas Association of School Administrators.

The annual statewide meeting of the Texas Association of School Boards brings together local board members from across the state to discuss problems facing the public schools of their communities. Increasing public school enrollments and rising costs make this year's meeting of vital importance to all local school boards in Texas. 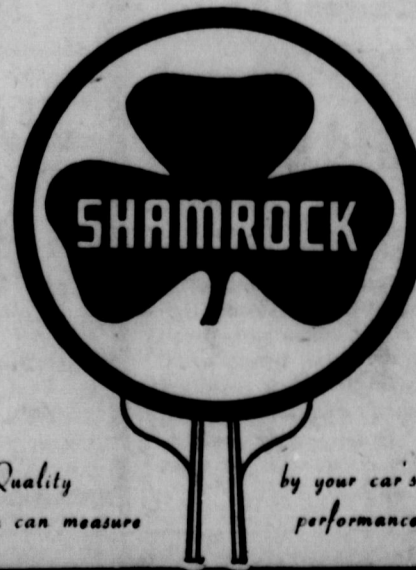
