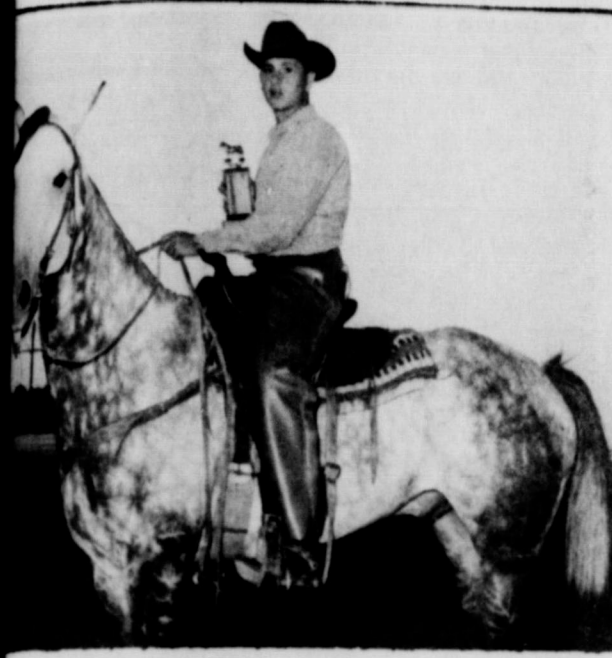

Mrs. Henderson was born Aug. 17, 1891 at Hillsboro, Texas. She was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas B. Tucker. She was married to George P. Henderson, Sr. February 11, 1909 at Brandon, Texas. She had lived in Kelton until 1947 when they moved to Wheeler.

Mr. Henderson passed away in 1963.

SHORT COURSE OFFERED ON BEEF PRODUCTION

A beef production short course for adult farmers will be held August 5-8 under the sponsorship of the Wheeler High School Vocational Agriculture Department according to Mr. Larry L. Howe, teacher of Vocational Agriculture.

Mr. Bill Holtzapfel, Beef Production Specialist with the Vocational Agriculture Division of the Texas Education Agency and the Department of Animal Science at Texas A & M University will be the instructor for the course. He is headquartered at Texas A & M University.

The short course is scheduled to begin, Monday, August 5 at 8:00 P. M. in the Production Credit Building. The meetings will run four consecutive nights. During the dates the short course is in progress, Mr. Holtzapfel will be available to assist cattlemen with individual problems and to provide on-the-farm instruction.

Cattlemen interested in attending the short course should write or call the teacher of vocational agriculture Mr. Larry L. Howe. An entry fee of \$2.00 will be charged.

Beef Production short course certificates will be presented to each cattlemen who attends all the training sessions.

Mr. Holtzapfel states that the field of beef cattle production must take a close look at efficiency of production in the future. With land prices, feed, and taxes rising, the producer is meeting more and more competition for the consumers' dollar at the meat counter. There will be no financial transactions such as stamps, money orders, etc. available to patrons of this office on Saturdays.

The outgoing mail collection will be adjusted to conform generally with the existing Sunday Collection service. No change will be made in window service hours presently provided on Monday through Friday.

The above mentioned services have been ordered by Postmaster General W. Marvin Mason to comply with the provisions of the recent enacted tax bill.

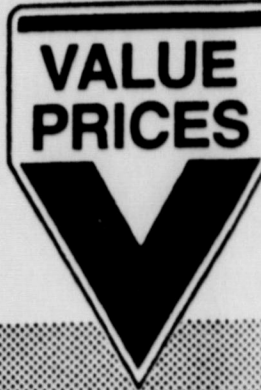
