Tornado Shelter Information

When the National Weather Service issues a Tornado Alert, which may affect Wheeler County, the Volunteer Fire Departments of the county go on watch and remain on watch until the danger has passed. Those on watch have been trained for storm watching. When Wheeler or surrounding communities need to take shelter, a siren will sound. If you do not have a shelter, the south door of Wheeler County Ag and Family Center on Highway 83 at the north edge of Wheeler City limits will be open for use as a shelter by the general public.

Please take heed to the warning if sounded; the alarm will not sound unless the fireman feel the immediate area is threatened!

If you have a basement or shelter, make sure your fire department is aware of its location.

Parkview Artery Spring Break Safety

On the road...
Buckle up, disco dancers! Also take turns behind the wheel, and whoever sits shotgun should stay awake to keep the driver company. Make sure everyone has a valid driver's license and the vehicle registration is in the car before driving off.

In hotels...
Reserve a room that's above the 1st floor but below the 6th floor. Why? First floor rooms are easier to break into, and rooms above the sixth floor are sometimes too high for fire ladders to reach. If safes are provided, definitely use them for any valuables you may have. Keep doors and sliding doors locked, and don't let anyone into your room unless you can trust them. Make a mental note of where the nearest fire exits and stairwells are located in case you need to evacuate.

At the ATM...
Try to go the ATM in groups, but avoid getting overly complacent about safety just because you're traveling in numbers. Also try to go during daylight hours. When you approach the ATM, do a full 360 degree scan, looking completely around you to see if anyone is hanging out where they shouldn't be. When punching in your pin number, use your other hand to cover the keypad. Always be on the lookout for anyone suspicious. If someone is creeping you out, go to another ATM. (There are plenty of them, especially in vacation spots!)

While drinkin'...
Do us all a favor (including yourself) and party smart. Be responsible. Pace yourself if you choose to drink, and avoid hard alcohol or other drinks that are powerful and have fast effects. (And remember that drinks = easy targets.) Also be aware of alcohol poisoning. According to a Nationwide study, 75 percent of college males and 43 percent of females reported being intoxicated on a daily basis during spring break. If you do decide to drink, know the liquor laws of wherever you'll be vacationing. Drinking & driving is always a dangerous situation, so avoid this by having your safe mode of transportation home planned before you go out.

On the beach...
Drinking + sun can equal a bad sunburn and an even worse hangover. Sun can maximize the effects of alcohol so keep this in mind if you party on the beach. Take it slow and stay hydrated by drinking lots of water. If you start feeling faint or light headed, get shade and water immediately. And don't be a lobster...use sunscreen of at least SPF 15 and reapply often. Pay extra special attention to ears, nose, face and shoulders. Fair skinned friends should wear sunglasses and even a hat. Avoid sun exposure during the hottest hours of the sun's rays and remember you can burn even when it's cloudy.

While swimming...

Jumping into the water without a lifeguard is putting yourself at risk. Even the most experienced swimmer can get caught in an undertow. In case you get caught in a rip current, don't bother swimming against it. Instead, swim parallel to shore until the rip passes. Try to stay within the designated swimming area and always swim with a buddy. Also know the flag system for water safety:

-Red Flag: Stay out of the water because of strong undertow and riptides.

-Yellow Flag: Use CAUTION in the water. There are some undertow and riptides possible.

-Blue Flag: Calm water. Swim safely.

In the hot tub...
Drinking in the hot tub might sound like a good idea, since pretty much every MTV video makes it look glamorous. But low and behold, MTV is not an educational resource. (shocker!) Alcohol can dilate blood vessels and lower blood pressure to dangerous levels. The effects of alcohol are felt sooner and stronger in a hot tub. It can lead to unconsciousness and drowning. Overall, just a bad idea.

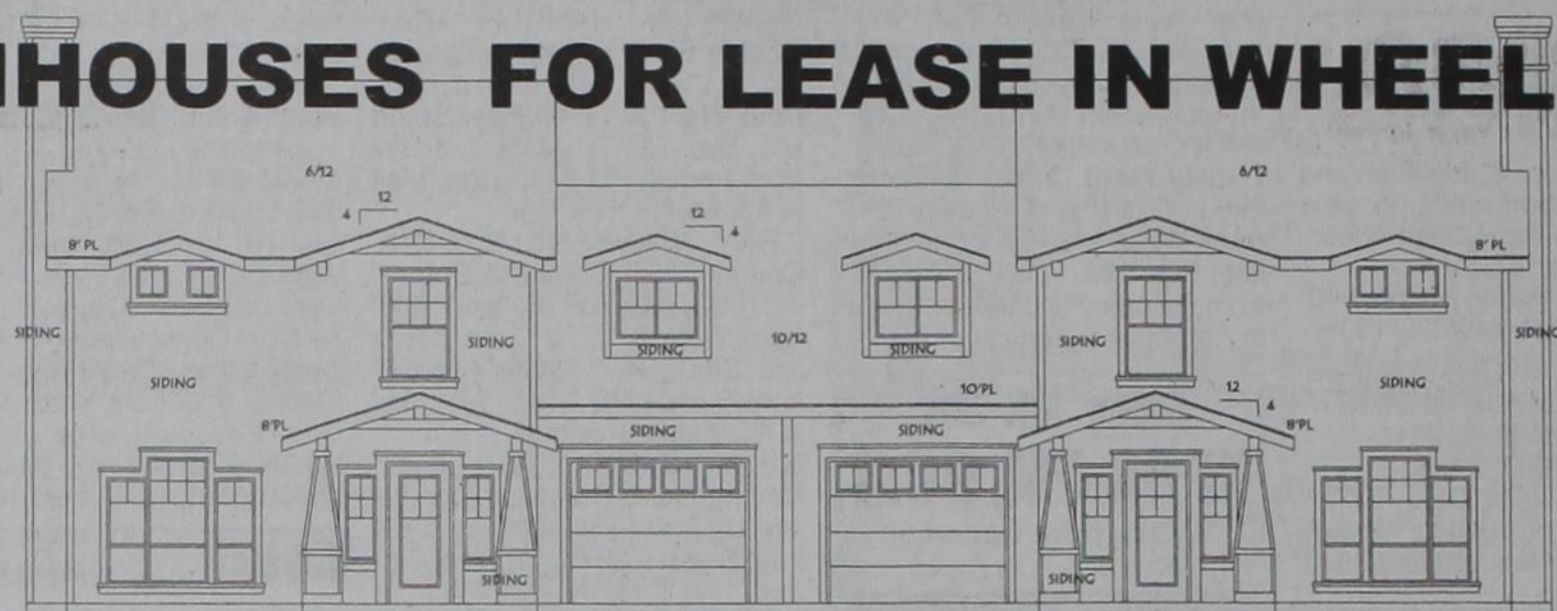

Wildfire Disaster Assistance Available To County Producers

USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) State Conservationist Salvador Salinas announced \$4 million in disaster assistance to help with recovery after the 2011 historic drought and wildfire conditions across much of the state. Funds are being made available through the Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP), which provides both financial and technical assistance to install measures that reduce post-fire damage and aid in the rehabilitation process.

"Many parts of Wheeler County were affected by wildfires over the last year," said Calvin Devereaux County NRCS District Conservationist. "Loss of vegetation not only affects production, livestock and wildlife; it also makes the land vulnerable to erosion by wind and water."
 "Our assistance will enable landowners and livestock producers to accelerate the recovery of the health and vigor of the affected grazing land," Calvin Devereaux said.

Although EQIP sign-up is continuous, applications for this first funding period will be accepted in the Wheeler County NRCS office through April 13. In order to apply, producers must visit the local NRCS office to fill out an application. Applications will be ranked

and those approved for funding will be offered an EQIP contract. A priority will be placed on land affected by wildfires with an emphasis on conservation practices that will help restore plant health and condition, prevent soil erosion, and address soil quality and water quality.
 On grazing land, practices such as grazing deferral, cross fencing, reseeding and water development are effective post-fire strategies to help reduce erosion and re-establish wildlife.
 Calvin Devereaux suggests landowners consult with their local NRCS staff to develop a conservation plan, which can be an effective strategy for rangeland recovery and mitigating the effects of the prolonged drought Texas is experiencing.
 NRCS services and programs are voluntary and offered without a fee to all agricultural producers.

NRCS helps landowners and land managers protect and improve the natural resources on their property, including soil, water, air, plants, and animals.

endangered or threatened species. Lesser Prairie Chickens are ground-dwelling birds, native to rangelands of the American West, including the South Plains and Panhandle region of Texas. Over the decades they have experienced a significant decline in population and habitat.

NRCS and its conservation partners are helping farmers and ranchers enhance, restore and protect habitat for this bird with financial assistance through the Environmental Quality Incentive Program's (EQIP) Lesser Prairie Chicken Initiative (LPCI). Through the LPCI, NRCS offers landowners financial assistance for conservation practices that promote healthy grazing lands and are also beneficial for the Lesser Prairie Chicken. These practices include prescribed grazing, upland wildlife habitat management, brush management, prescribed burning and range planting.

"In 2011 this was a very successful initiative for improving the Lesser Prairie Chicken habitat in Texas," said Salinas. "Producers entered into 127 contracts and enrolled 114,131 acres for which over \$2.9 million were obligated in the targeted counties."

Another option to improve and protect the habitat would be enrollment in the Grassland Reserve Program (GRP). Under the GRP, a landowner may enter into a rental agreement for a period of 10, 15 or 20 years. The agreement requires implementation of a grazing plan developed by NRCS and the participant agrees to maintain the land in grass cover in exchange for a per-acre payment. Under GRP, the land may

be used for grazing or haying purposes.

Landowners may also apply for a conservation easement to protect the land in perpetuity. GRP 20-year rental contracts and easement applications place priority on CRP land that are within 12 months of expiring. GRP also offers cost-share assistance for practices needed to restore the grazing values.

Landowners with expiring or expired CRP land may also be interested in applying for the Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP). CSP is a voluntary five-year program that offers payments to producers who sustain a high level of conservation on their land. Under CSP, landowners have a variety of land management activities to consider.

NRCS also reminds landowners that if land is converted back to crop production, it may be necessary for them to apply certain conservation practice alternatives

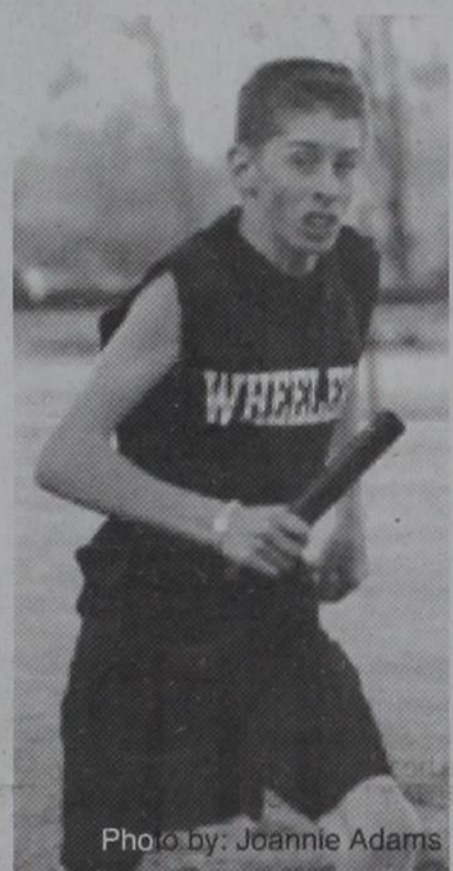

Tornado Safety For Texans

Texas Division of Emergency Management

Tornadoes can occur at any time of year in Texas, but they happen most often in spring and summer. When severe weather threatens, monitor TV and radio broadcasts for storm information, as well as NOAA weather radio. Most tornado fatalities are caused by flying debris. When a tornado is sighted, the most important rule is **to get low and stay low.**

In interior buildings: Seek shelter in an interior room on the lowest floor of a home, office or other building. Shelter in a windowless area: a stairwell, bathroom, hallway or storage closet.

Avoid any area with a wide, unsupported roof such as an auditorium, gymnasium, cafeteria or theater. Avoid areas with windows or large amounts of glass.

At school, follow the drill and go to a designated shelter area, usually interior hallways on the lowest floor.

At the shopping center, go to the interior rooms and halls on the lowest floor. Do not leave the shopping center to get in your car. If you are in a mobile home, get out immediately and take shelter in a nearby sturdy building.

If you are in open country, take cover on low ground, preferably lying flat in a ditch or ravine.

In your car:
If the tornado appears to stay in the interior rooms and halls on the lowest floor, but is growing larger, it is headed toward you. Take shelter AWAY from the car. Take shelter inside a nearby sturdy building or lie flat in a ditch or ravine.

Avoid highway overpasses. Parking or taking shelter under a bridge or overpass is extremely dangerous due to flying debris and the possibility the structure may collapse.

Parking beneath an overpass on traffic lanes creates a deadly hazard for others, who may plow into your vehicle at full highway speeds in poor visibility, and can trap people in the storm's path or

If you are trapped in your car, keep your seat belt on and lean down as low as possible, away from windshield and windows.

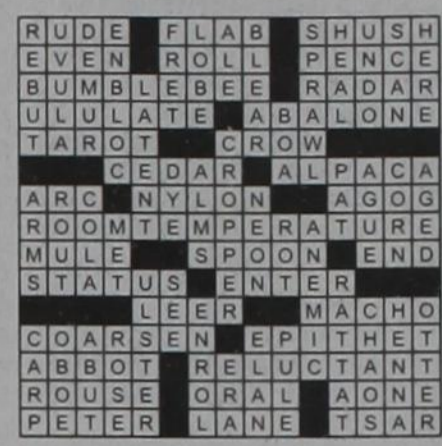
