Budget Hearing

The Wheeler Independent School District, Board of Education, met in special session Tuesday, August 27, 1968 at 8:00 P. M. to consider and approve the School Budget for 1968 - 69 as presented by Superintendent. Stanley Jaggers.

For W. School

The Ammendment to the 1967-68 School Budget was also approved as presented.

At the end of the current 1967-68 School fisical year there is a \$12,600.00 deficit in school operating funds. Taking this fact into consideration and after careful consideration of budget needs for the 1968-69 school year. a 20¢ tax increase was found to be necessary. The increase will raise the school tax rate from \$1.25 to \$1.45.

This action was taken by the Board of Education after all other possible solutions had been thoroughly considered and discussed.

The School Budget for up pretty well. For this good 1968-69 would have ended with at least a \$10,000.00 deficit, if the tax rate had remained at \$1.25. This would cause a deficit of about \$20,000.00 to accumulate by the end of the 1968-69 fisical year.

Correction

In the story on the City Council Meeting last week, we stated the local swimming pool was completed in 1959 at a cost of \$16,000. The overall cost of the pool and building was about \$38,000. The \$16,000 was the amount of money borrowed by the City for the construction of the pool and buildings.

Wheat Planting Time Near

By Max W. Hatter, CAA Wheat planting time is just around the corner. A lot of farmers are debating on whether we can afford to grow dryland wheat. Most folks will probably agree that we can, using certificates on our dome stic allotment. However this certificate is paid at parity on 40 percent of our allotment. The remaining 60 percent, called export wheat, is cheap and we guestion whether we can compete

on the world market with it. If we add 53¢ in certificate payments, we will have \$1.80 wheat. We can make some money on \$1.80 wheat. We can't however, make any money on \$1.25 wheat.

harvest time is nearing. We would like to suggest that the best market for \$1.60 maize is through hogs. Prices have been good on hogs recently. However, the old saying still prevails that 'che ap feed is for erunner of cheap livestock."

Every two years a state conference for all agricultural Extension Service employees is held on the campus of Texas A&M University. This year the date is August 26-30. Both the Home Demonstration Agent and myself will be out of our offices this week, but the office secretary will keep the office open. The announced theme for the conference is "Working Toward Perfection in Extension Educational Programs. We'll have an opportunity to participate in programs covering major subject matter areas. These programs were planned to present new information in the various fields. The week spent at A&M is a part of our continuing professional improvement program aimed at making the work of every Extension employee

more efficient and productive. Insect Picture in Maize: Greenbug - Heavy infestation of the greenbug continues to damage maize in the county. Considerable chemical control is being carried out against the bugs, however, shortages of Methyl parathion and other chemicals has hampered control effects. Those farmers who have sprayed. had excellent control.

Sorghum Midge: Late sorghum is being infested by the sorghum midge. The adult midge is an organge colored fly. Tiny, headless, grayishto-red larve bore into and destroy grain. A lot of producers with late maize have asked "howmuch damage in dollars and cents does the midge cost us?" Research data as late as 1966 revealed that maize sprayed in the boot to the fully emerged from

boot stage made from 2 to 3,000 pounds of maize to the acre more than untreated maize. At present prices, this would be a savings of nearly \$50 to the acre. If you have late maize, you may want to consider spraying.




