## P.C.A. Purchases **S8 Million In Stock**

Canadian, - - - On December 31 the Canadian Production Credit Association joined the other 33 Associations in Texas in buying back nearly \$8 million in capital stock held by the government in the Federal Intermediate Credit Bank of Houston, Erbin L. Crowell, president of the Canadian Association, announces.

The Houston bank is one of twelve federally incorporated banks which operate exclusively in the field of agricultural credit.

The Federal Intermediate Credit Bank discounts short and intermediate term notes of farmers and ranchers for the 34 Production Credit Associations, which are federally-chartered but farmer-owned and about 11 agricultural credit corporations, livestock loan companies and commercial banks.

Crowell pointed out that the repayment of this Government capital is not maridatory, but the Associations have concluded to take advantage of recently enacted laws which authorize them and other patrons of the bank to become complete owners of the quity interests in the Institution.
