





OUTSTANDING MAN: Erron Mercer was recognized at the Wheeler Chamber of Commerce Banquet Saturday, February 25, 2012, as the “Man of the Year” for 2011. Erron is the pastor of Cornerstone Church, a position he has held since the summer of 2002. Erron was the youth pastor at a Borger church and came to Wheeler to “fill-in” before deciding to move to Wheeler. In addition to his work with the church, he oversees the operation of Cornerstone Academy and 180 Youth Center. He helped with the organization of Cornerstone Outreach and oversees its operation. Cornerstone Outreach helps area families make ends meet through help with their food costs. In 2010, 392 families—2428 individuals—were delivered 43,811 lbs. of food; in 2011, 872 families—380 individuals—were delivered 85,181 lbs. of food. Erron’s immediate family consists of his wife, Sonia, and one-year-old son, Blaze. Erron’s theology is simple, “. . . God good. . . devil bad”. Erron was presented his award by Matt Sullivan. A church member’s comment was: “I know that the pastor would give credit to his church members and thanks to God for what has taken place, but I also know that without the vision put in his heart by God, none of it would be possible.” We are indeed blessed to have Erron and his family as a part of the Wheeler community.



OUTSTANDING WOMAN: The Wheeler Chamber of Commerce “Woman of the Year” award, presented Saturday, February 25, 2012, went to Belinda Masters. “Belinda has spent countless hours over the years doing volunteer work to support our youth and her church,” commented Dr. Ben Ed Hillhouse.
