The Wheeler Chamber of Commerce met Tuesday evening at Nora's Cafe for their regular monthly meeting. Theprogram was presented by Stanley Jaggers, Superintendent of Wheeler Schools.

Questionaires were sent to everyone enrolled in Wheeler County Schools within the last ten years. The questions were related to the type of work and the amount of education or training the exstudent had received.

Only a portion of the complete information was available for Mr. Jaggers to present at the meeting.

Wheeler County students, due to the small number in each school, can not enjoy vocational training while in igh school. The survey pointed out the need for vocational training in the schools. It is a possibility that on the job training can be offered Wheeler and Shamrock students through the school in cooperation with the business and professional men. The program, if enacted, would be a pilot program and would set the pattern for the state.


Saturday night, two boys softball games will be played. The Wheeler Astros will play Mobeetie; followed by a game for boys of high school age and over.



Home Canning Season is Here

BY BRENDAHOFMANN, CHDA Home canning season is here and many homemakers will soon be spending hours in the kitchen preserving food for the winters. How can the homemaker be sure that her time isn't wasted? Is it worth the time to prepare the food, only to find that six months later it has spoiled! What are some common errors made in canning? Let's look

Many times the error lies in the equipment that is used. Make; shift jars such as peanut better jars, mayonnaise jars, and pickle jars should never be used. These jars are not tempered to withstand the heat needed in processing. They crack easily. The mouths are not an accurate width and many times the lid rides on the edge or the sealing edge is not level; therefore a good seal can't be formed. Be sure to use screwbands that are in good condition. The lids should only be used once. Never use a 'used' lid. The tempered
