

### City of Wheeler Public Water Supply

Chronology of Events Addressing Water Quality

 In order to address nitrate issues associated with the drinking water, the City of Wheeler applied for funds through the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs in 1999.

 The City of Wheeler consulted Parkhill, Smith & Cooper (PSC) to design a project to provide drinking water which ensured compliance with state regulations. The project included the construction of two wells to blend with existing water supplies that had high levels of nitrate at a cost of \$230,000. The project was bid and constructed in 2002, and provided Wheeler with high quality water for approximately 5 years. After the 5 years, the levels of nitrate from the two wells have risen over time.

 In 2002, additional exploration of water rights was coordinated. This project would require approximately 12.5 miles of pipeline and a single well at a cost of approximately \$2,300,000. How- gibility of funds is late summer ever, test hole water quality sam- 2012. pling revealed elevated levels of nitrate already. It was determined too risky to pursue water with elevated nitrate levels at such a large expense to the citizens of Wheeler, TX. At the time, new water supplies were sought after, but test holes, which are constructed prior to an operational well, indicated an elevated level of nitrate in the water and immediate surrounding area. From 2002 to 2007, the City of Wheeler provided drinking water that met statutory regulations for nitrates. Shortly after 2007, the City of Wheeler and PSC considered treatment technologies including: 1) biological treatment, 2) ion exchange (water softening), and 3) reverse osmosis (membrane technology). After thorough consideration of each option, biological treatment was not ideal, and ion exchange and reverse osmosis were deemed too costly and not economically feasible. · While consideration of treatment options were taking place, the City of Wheeler proposed a temporary solution to TCEQ in order to provide safe, drinking water to local residents. A nonconventional approach was proposed to TCEQ and included the following: 1) the City would provide RO treated water to local residents at low cost and be available at City Hall, and 2) water in the distribution system would be used for showering, toilets, irrigation, etc., but not for drinking purposes. After review of the City's proposal, TCEQ ultimately rejected the proposal.

water within the region. The study identified the extent and possible source of contamination. The findings also revealed possible locations for high quality water. These locations are generally west of the City's existing wells. As a result of this study, PSC developed a project that could deliver high quality water, economically to reduce the nitrates in existing water supplies to statutory MCL levels.

 In March 2012, application was made and submitted to the Texas Water Development Board (TWDB) State Revolving Fund (SRF) fund with the intent to obtain a low interest loan to fund the project. The project generally includes two options for consideration. Option 1 explores potential water sources approximately 5.5 miles west of existing wells and Option 2 explores water sources as far away as Mobeetie. The estimated cost for Option 1 is \$1.7 million and Option 2 is \$3.7 million. The estimated time frame for when the TWDB will give notice to Wheeler regarding the eli-

## **Prarie Chicken Conservation**

NRCS Announces Wildlife Conservation Efforts to Benefit the Lesser Prairie Chicken

Innovative partnership preserves working lands and supports efforts of private landowners to conserve habitat for the lesser prairie chicken, an at-risk species Temple, Texas, April 13, 2012-Private landowners and operators in the Southern Plains and Panhandle regions of Texas have an opportunity to apply for a new conservation funding source an-

Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack and Secretary of the Interior Ken Salazar. The announcement of the Working Lands for Wildlife partnership creates a \$33 million partnership with farmers, ranchers and forest landowners to use innovative approaches to restore and protect the habitats for wildlife, including seven atrisk species and other vulnerable game species.

The targeted at-risk species in Texas, the lesser prairie chicken, is a ground-nesting bird native to the rangelands of Kansas, Colorado, New Mexico, Oklahoma, and Texas. In the spring during the lesser prairiechickens' breeding season, the birds gather on leks or "booming" grounds to display unique courtships. Lesser prairie

chicken populations declined dramatically during the past several decades due to loss of native prairie, habitat fragmentation, and degradation of habitat on both private and public lands.

With more than 90 percent of the lesser prairie chicken habitat occurring on private lands, the USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) and its partners, which include Soil and Water Conservation




