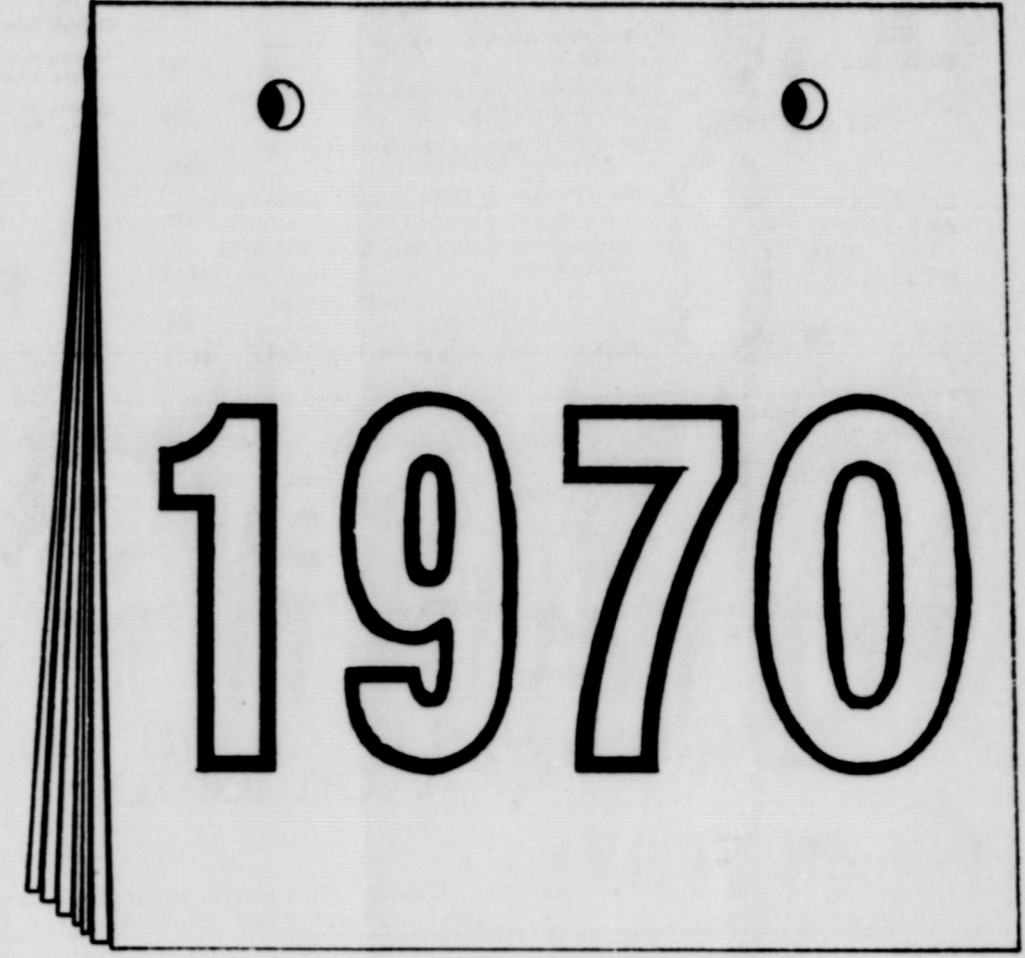

## ACROSS THE FENCE

by Max Hatter, CAA

There is an old saying that January shakes em', February breaks em', March takes em'. With "Old Man Winter" arriving and temperatures plunging, cattlemen should plan on feeding extra cake and hay to mama cows. Be sure and feed ample supplemental protein to calves wintered on native ranges or hay. Otherwise, your gains are likely to be disappointing.

Research at a Ft. Robinson, Nebraska Experiment Station shows that at least 1/2 pound of crude protein per day showed no increase in daily gain from supplementing additional em'.

## Community Development
