The law gives property owners the right to protest actions concerning their property tax appraisals. You may follow these appeal procedures if you have a concern about:

- · the market or appraised value of your property
- · the unequal appraisal of your property
- · the inclusion of your property on the appraisal roll
- · any exemptions that may apply to you
- · the qualification for an agricultural or timber appraisal
- · the taxable status of your property
- · the local governments which should be taxing your property
- · the ownership of property
- · the change of use of land receiving special appraisal · any action taken by the chief appraiser, appraisal district or ap-
- praisal review board that applies to and adversely affects you.

Informal Review

Taxpayers may contact the CAD for corrections/changes. If you have concerns pertaining to the list above, a protest form should be filled out and returned by the appropriate date then an appraiser will contact you for possible informal resolution.

Review by the Appraisal Review Board

If you can't resolve your problem informally with the county appraisal district (CAD) staff, you may have your case heard by the appraisal review board (ARB).

The ARB is an independent board of citizens that reviews problems with appraisals or other concerns listed above. It has the power to order the CAD to make the necessary changes to solve problems. If you file a written request for an ARB hearing (called a notice of protest) before the deadline, the ARB will set your case for a hearing. You'll receive written notice of the time, date and place of the hearing. If necessary, you may request a hearing in the evening or on a Salurday or Sunday. Prior to your hearing, you may ask to review the evidence the CAD plans to introduce at the hearing to establish any matter at issue. The law provides that before a hearing on a protest or immediately after the hearing begins, you or your agent and the CAD shall each provide the other with a copy of any written material intended to be offered or submitted to the ARB at the hearing. To the greatest extent practicable, the hearing will be informal. You or a designated agent may appear in person to present evidence or you may send notarized evidence for the ARB to review at your hearing. The CAD representative will present evidence about your case. You may cross-examine the CAD representative. The ARB will make its decision based on the evidence presented. In most cases, the CAD has the burden of establishing the property's value by a preponderance of the evidence presented.
