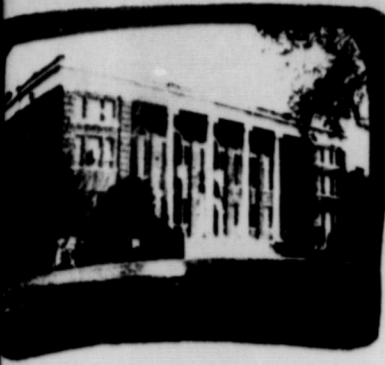

## Terry Hall Injured in Wreck Sunday

Terry Hall of Allison was injured Sunday night when he lost control of his car 6 miles north of the nine mile station east of Wheeler. Hall was traveling north and apparently lost control, skidding 100 feet and coming to rest on the west side of the road.

Terry was thrown against the right door glass. Terry was taken to St. Anthony's Hospital where he is being treated for back injuries. The extent of his injuries is not known at this time.

The accident occurred around 10:30 p.m. north.



**COLLISION WITH HORSE:** Dave Britt, 17, received injuries and remains in St. Anthony's Hospital in an accident which occurred Thursday morning at 1:00 a.m. He was driving a 1969 Chevrolet which struck a horse at 1000 feet from the stop sign at the nine mile station east of Wheeler. Britt was traveling north on the Kelton. The car traveled 300 ft. down the pavement and 62ft. into the field of Buster Walser after striking the horse. Britt was thrown from the car and landed a few yards from the Walser home and the noise from the wreck woke them up. Dave was brought to Parkview Hospital and immediately taken to St. Anthony's. Dave is out of intensive care, but his legs remain paralyzed. He is in room 245 and looks forward to the mail each day.

## Blevins Receives Second B. Star

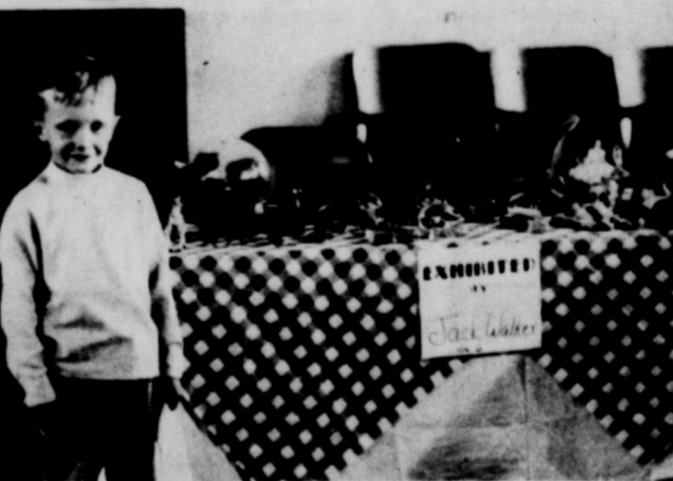

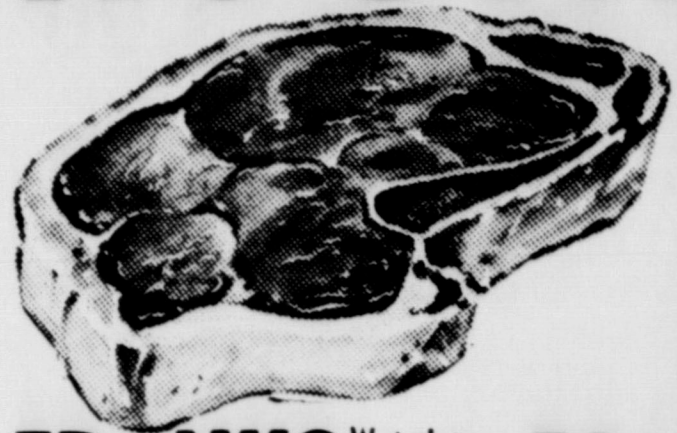

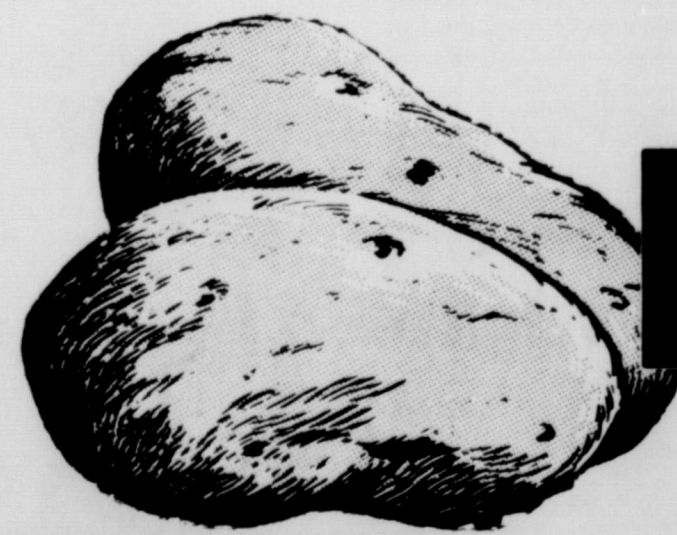
