



self-applicator bag properly stocked with dust containing either three percent Ciodrin or a one percent coum aphos (Co-Ral) and located so the cattle will contact the bag as they go about their daily

Locate the bag in the gateway to a fenced off watering trough, a salt box or in the entrance to a resting area.

Commercial, ready filled bags can be purchased from livestock supply outlets or they can be inexpensively made. All that is needed are a few medium to fine mesh burlap bags, and a few gromments to serve as hook eyes. A roof to protect the de-




