## MOBETIE ISD ANNOUNCES NEW FREE & REDUCED PRICES

Mobeetie ISD has long recognized the need for helping meet the nutritional needs of its students. Mobeetie Public School serves a well-balanced nutritious lunch each school day. The charge to students who can pay is 40c in the elementary school and 40 cents in high school. However, since some families find it difficult to pay this full price, the school will provide these lunches free of charge or at a reduced price to those children determined by the Principal or Superintendent to be unable to pay the full price for their lunches. Families who feel that their children may be eligible for free or reduced price lunches are urged to apply. Copies of the application form were sent home in a letter to parents earlier this week. Additional copies may be obtained at the school. The completed application, signed by an adult member of the family should be sent to Mobeetie School, Mobeetie, Texas. Such applications will be reviewed promptly and within 5 days the family will be notified in writing as to the decision made. All information provided on the application will be held in the strictest confidence. Any unusual circumstances or hardships which affect the family's ability to pay for school lunches, such as prolonged illness in the family, unexpected expenses due to fire, flood, or any other disaster of this nature; seasonal unemployment and similar emergency situations, will also be considered. If a family is not satisfied with the decision made on their application, it may request a hearing to appeal the decision. This request may be made orally or in writing to the Board of Education, Mobeetie.

Texas who will review the application with them and see if different arrangements can be made. The school district's formal free and reduced price policy statement and the procedure that will be followed when a decision is appealed are on file in the Superintendents office and may be reviewed by any interested person.

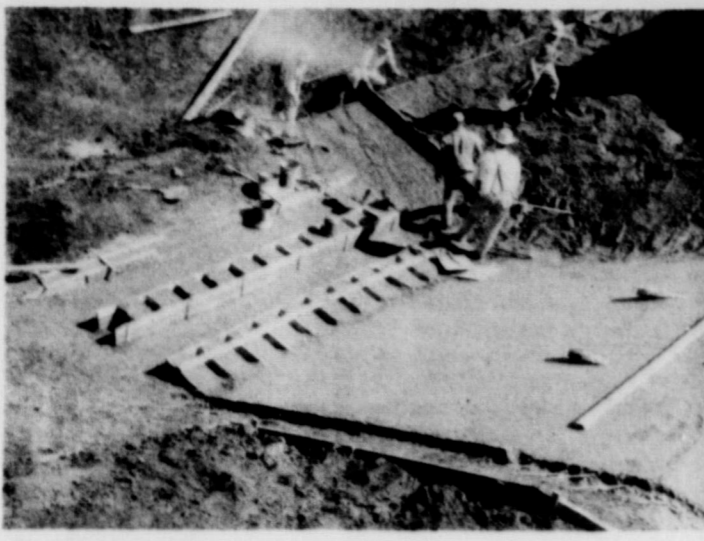

### PAT'S PARAGRAPHS

By: Pat Palmer HDA Even the small amount of snow has been really nice, hasn't it? We really have lots of things to be happy about!

Did you know that matching fabric to the pattern is the first step in creating a stylish, well-fitting garment. If the silhouette stands away from the body in a bouffant or flared shape the fabric used must have enough body or stiffness to repeat this shape. But if the silhouette clings to the body, conforming to its natural shape, limp enough to fall against the body.

Between the two extremes, bouffant and clinging shapes—there is a straight tailored silhouette requiring a fabric with both flexibility and body. Such a fabric must hold the shape into which it has been molded.

The design of the garment is created by the way it is cut and the type of fabric used.

Materials fall into four main types: Stiff and wiry: taffeta, organdy, gabardine and some wash and wear materials are examples of this type fabric, which is best suited for bouffant or flared designs.

Crisp and firm: linen, chintz, muslin and gingham—These make good selections for tailored garments.

Thick, bulky fabrics: velvet, terry cloth, fleece and suede. These increase the apparent size of the wearer, and are normally used for straight-lined garments.

Clinging, limp: chiffons, batiste, voile, some knitted materials, crepes. These hug the body and reveal the figure. They drape well in soft folds.

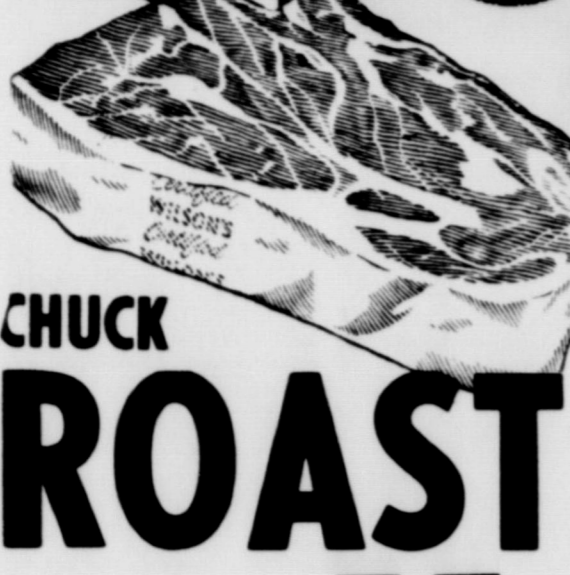

1/4 c. chopped walnuts
