Our cows are still gaining weight on the cured dry aftermath of weeping lovegrass. We sprayed for lice last week. It was significant that the two cows with bad infestations showed the least gains. We are convenced more than ever that lice cost the cowman money. Spray those Lice. PRUNING: Spring flowering trees and shrubs shouldn't be pruned until after they have bloomed. All necessary pruning of summer flowering trees and shrubs as well as most ever green shrubs should be completed thid month. Prune established hybrid tea and florabunda roses. Delay pruning climbing roses until after the peak of spring bloom.


