Seems like there should be some appetizing and interesting ways to transform these "left-overs" into "planned-overs." Well, here a few ideas! If you don't plan to use the turkey in the next few days, just wrap it in freezer paper, of foil, label and freeze immediately. If you do plan to go ahead and use it, here are a few recipes you might enjoy using.

**Turkey Shortcake**  
 ½ c. chopped scallions (green onions)  
 1 c. diced cooked ham (optional)  
 1½ c. chicken stock or bouillon  
 1/3 c. flour  
 2 c. (1 pt.) light cream  
 2 c. diced cooked turkey  
 2 Tablespoons chopped parsley  
 Salt and Pepper  
 Heat 3 Tablespoons shortening in saucpan and add onions and ham. Sauté over medium heat until onions are tender but not brown. Add stock to pan and boil until reduced to ½ cup, Blend 1/3 cup flour with 1 cup cream; stir into saucpan and add the remaining 1 cup cream. Bring to boil, stirring constantly and boil 2 minutes. Add turkey, parsley and salt and pepper to taste. Slowly heat to serving temperature. To serve over toast or toasted English muffins.



 3/4 Cup diced celery  
 1/2 Cup diced carrots  
 1/4 Cup rice
