DON EARNEY INSTALLED DIRECTOR OF HUD-FHA

Don D. Earney, 36, former director of HUD's Corpus Christi, Texas Office and Mayor of the City of Wheeler, Texas for two terms, today was appointed Director of the HUD-FHA Lubbock Insuring Office by Administrator Richard L. Morgan of the Southwest Region of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

Mr. Earney will be responsible for administering all HUD-FHA mortgage insurance and assisted housing programs in 71 west Texas counties served by the Lubbock Office. He succeeds Mr. Glenn Bailey who has been assigned to HUD's Regional Office in Seattle, Washington as Special Assistant to the Administrator.

The new Director will be sworn in at the Lubbock Insuring Office located at 1601 Avenue N. at 10:30 A.M. on Tuesday, June 1.

From 1956 until September 1970, when he entered federal service as director of the office HUD established in Corpus Christi to help vic-

tims of Hurricane Celia, Mr. Earney was self-employed as a real estate, oil and gas lease broker. He was editor, publisher, and owner of newspapers in Wheeler, McLean, and Lefores in Texas and at Sherman Air Force Base and Hinton in Oklahoma. While he was Mayor of Wheeler, with supporting help from City Council members without raising taxes-the city park was enlarged and improved; several hundred new street lights were installed; two new water storage tanks, a city office building, fire station and garage were built; and improvements were made to the airport and swimming pool.

Mr. Earney was born in Clinton, Oklahoma and was graduated from Clinton High School. He studied journalism in several workshops conducted at the University of Oklahoma. He is a past president of the Chamber of Commerce, County T.B. Association, and has been active in civic, fraternal and industry associations.

Representing Wheeler at the installation was Mayor Pete Burton and Harry Wofford, Co. Clerk.

Since the establishment of the Lubbock Insuring office on June 1, 1953, it has insured home mortgages amounting to \$1,148,563,933 through 1970 and multifamily mortgage insurance in the amount of \$90,174,068 through 1969.

The Lubbock office is moving and as of Monday, June 7 it will be located on the fifth floor of the new Federal Building at 1205 Texas Avenue. The Director's Office phone is 747-3711 Ext. 265.

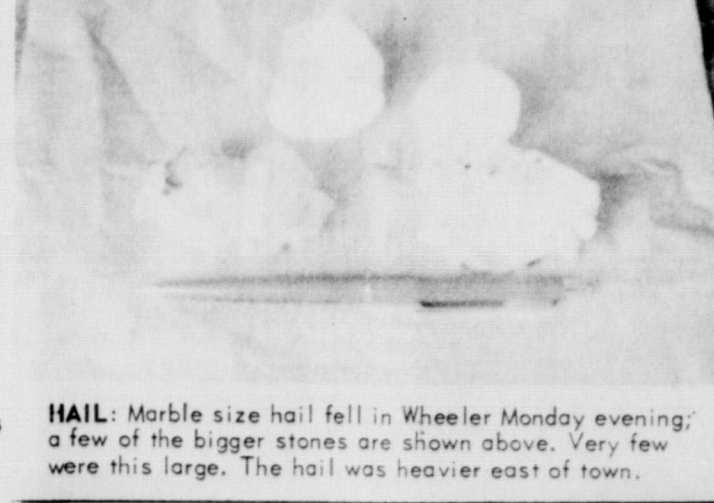

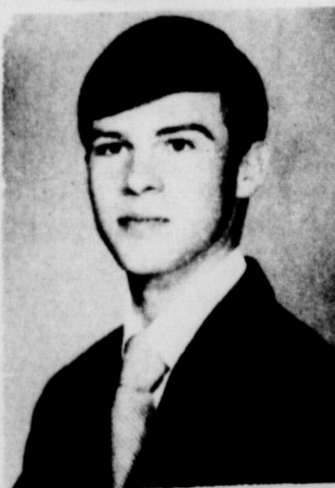

The following precaution has been added to the new order effective May 28, 1971: "While this statewide quarantine order is in effect, all swine shall be quarantined for 30 days at the premise of the purchaser and no movement from such premise except for slaughter shall be allowed for the period of the quarantine. This premise quarantine will automatically expire after the 30th day." By the way, we have received notice that more personell will be in the field. We would like to remind all of our hog producers that a violator of this order shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction, they will be subject to a fine. While the Texas statewide quarantine has been in effect, roadblocks have been set up by the Texas Animal Health Commission in various parts of the state and over 200 trucks carrying hogs have been stopped and no violators have been found. This is an indication that producers are enduring this quarantine with a good attitude. We still have movement permits on hand, if producers need any more.

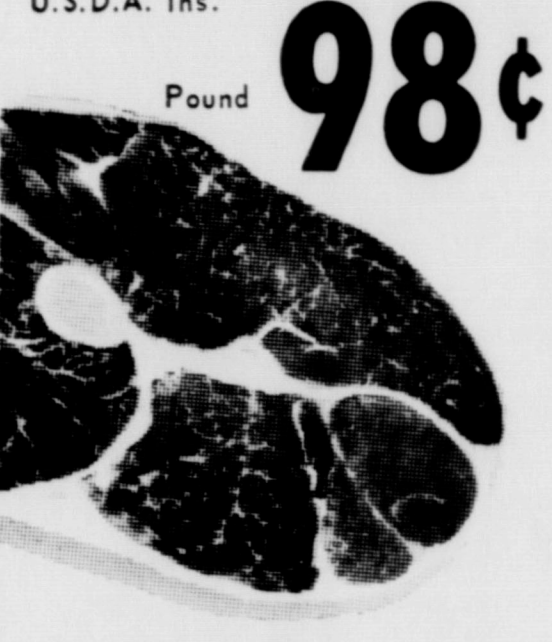

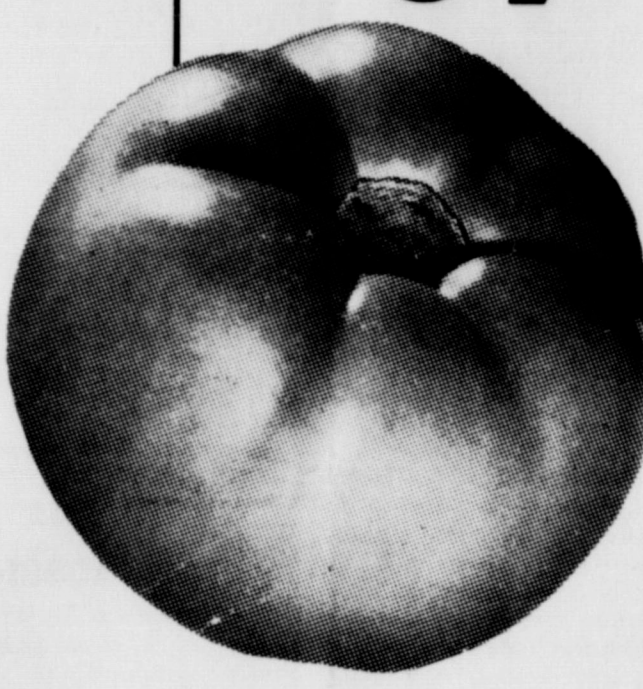
