Mrs. Dorothy A. Walker of Briscoe was given the oath of office Wednesday for postmaster for Briscoe, Texas.

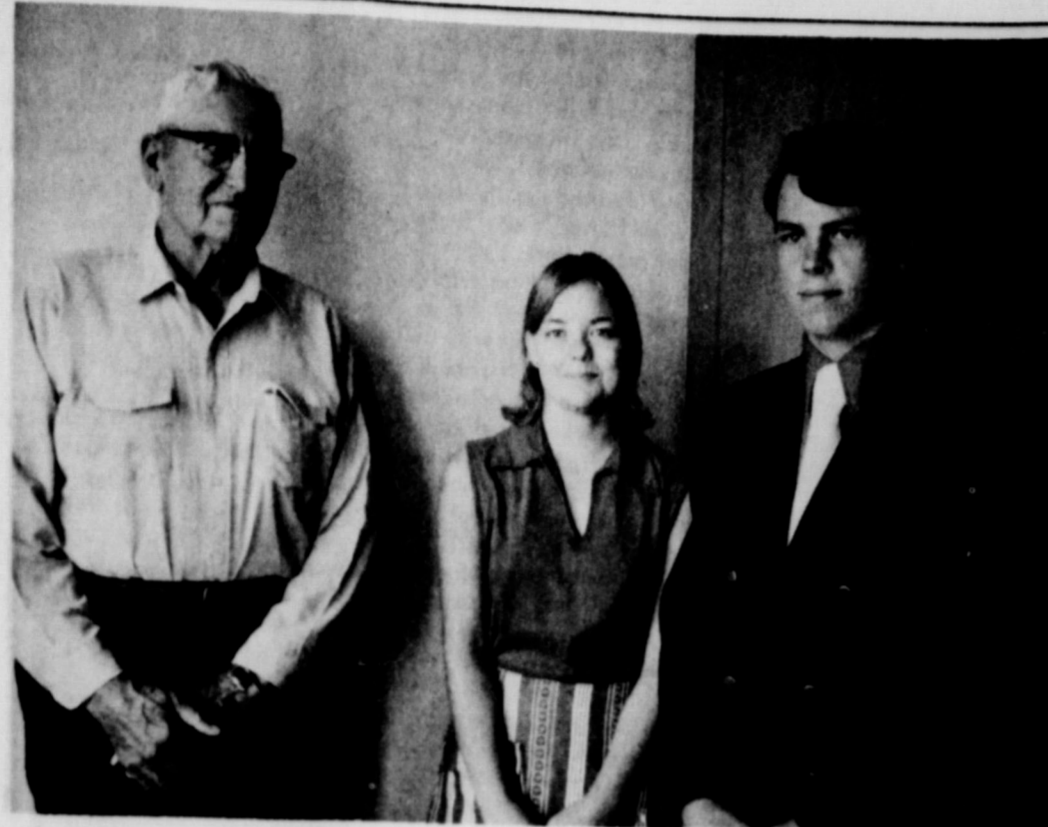
Her appointment was made official at the Central Distribution Unit in Amarillo with Dean W. Caldwell, assistant Amarillo postmaster. Administering the oath of office.

The system was established by the postal reorganization of 1970. All new postmasters are chosen by the Regional management selection Board and appointments do not require Senate Confirmation.

Mrs. Dorothy Walter, a native of Briscoe served as assistant postmaster there from March 15, 1960 to Nov. 1, 1969, when she was appointed officer-in-charge. She served in that capacity until her postmaster appointment became official Wednesday July 21.

800 Co. Horses Vaccinated

Hatter, CAA.

Over 800 horses have been vaccinated against the disease of Venezuelan Equine Encephalomyelitis in Wheeler County, according to veterinarians. The vaccine order is still in effect on the movement of horses, mules, jacks and ponies until two weeks after the final inoculation. Some horses have died in the past since the outbreak of the disease is fatal to horses. The disease is spread by mosquitoes. The mortality is 80-90% fatal to horses once contacted. All small percent of the horses have been immunized against the disease in Wheeler County. Thanks to the cooperation of local horsemen, veterinarians and interested citizens in getting the disease under control. If you have any unvaccinated horses in your community, please let me know or the sheriff who is cooperating with me in making a list of unvaccinated horses available to Animal Health workers to follow-up work on the disease. In any case the owners of these unvaccinated horses will assume the responsibility for getting them vaccinated. It will then become the responsibility of the Animal Health Commission to see that it is done. The following horsemen will be helping us make a list of unvaccinated horses: H.B. Freeman, H.B. Hanner, Kelton Doyberry and Clois Wheeler—Sheriff Busby, Dick Hefley, Howard Hill, Mobeetie—Estes, Briscoe—Dodd.

QUITO CONTROL—The mosquitoes have been identified as the carrier of sleeping sickness disease along with other diseases. Control should be given to the water in cisterns, water

troughs, fish ponds or ornamental ponds could serve as breeding places for wigglers. They can hatch out in less than 3 days. Temporary rain pools, flooded areas, irrigated pastures, salt marshes, rain gutters, tin cans and holes in trees can also serve as breeding places. Stock tanks can be treated with kerosene, using 9 ounces of oil per 100 square feet of water surface or 30 gallons per acre of water. Where no livestock are breeding, DDT, Chlor-dane, Toxahene or Methoxychlor can be applied in an oil solution at weekly intervals.

TEXAS HOG CHOLERA QUARANTINE MODIFICATION We are not under Federal quarantine. Not certificate is necessary for movement of hogs now. When hogs are moved, however, they are automatically quarantined for 30 days. If hogs are healthy, the quarantine automatically expires.

2,4-D—The amine form of 2,4-D did a good job killing Russian thistles and tumbleweeds on our demonstration plot. We appreciate the assistance of K.D. Ford on this project. Apparently, the addition of 2,4,5-T to the 2,4-D didn't help a lot. We didn't know that we'd necessarily get the results we got because the weeds were so tough. We put about 20 gallons of the solution to the acre, mixing about 1 gallon of 2,4-D to 50 gallons of water. By the way, K.D. says this got good results in grain sorghum. Careless weeds are pretty susceptible to 2,4-D, he said. We believe 2,4-D is the cheapest material getting the most results for the money spent.

Greg Estes will be receiving a free pig from Richard McIntyre of Sweetwater, Oklahoma in a few days. The pig is an award to Greg from Mr. McIntyre for showing the grand champion at the Wheeler County Livestock Show this past March.

INSECTS—Elm leaf beetles have been active this past week on Elm trees in our area. Several insecticides have given good control. Setting spray coverage to taller trees is a problem.

Army worms have been eating the leaves from cotton plants, alfalfa and other plants. Sevin 80-2 has given good control with no grazing or haying restrictions.

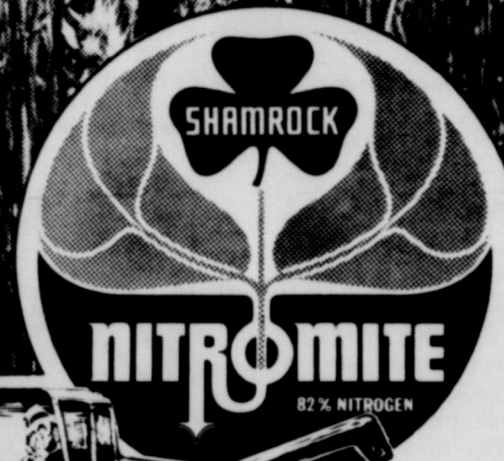

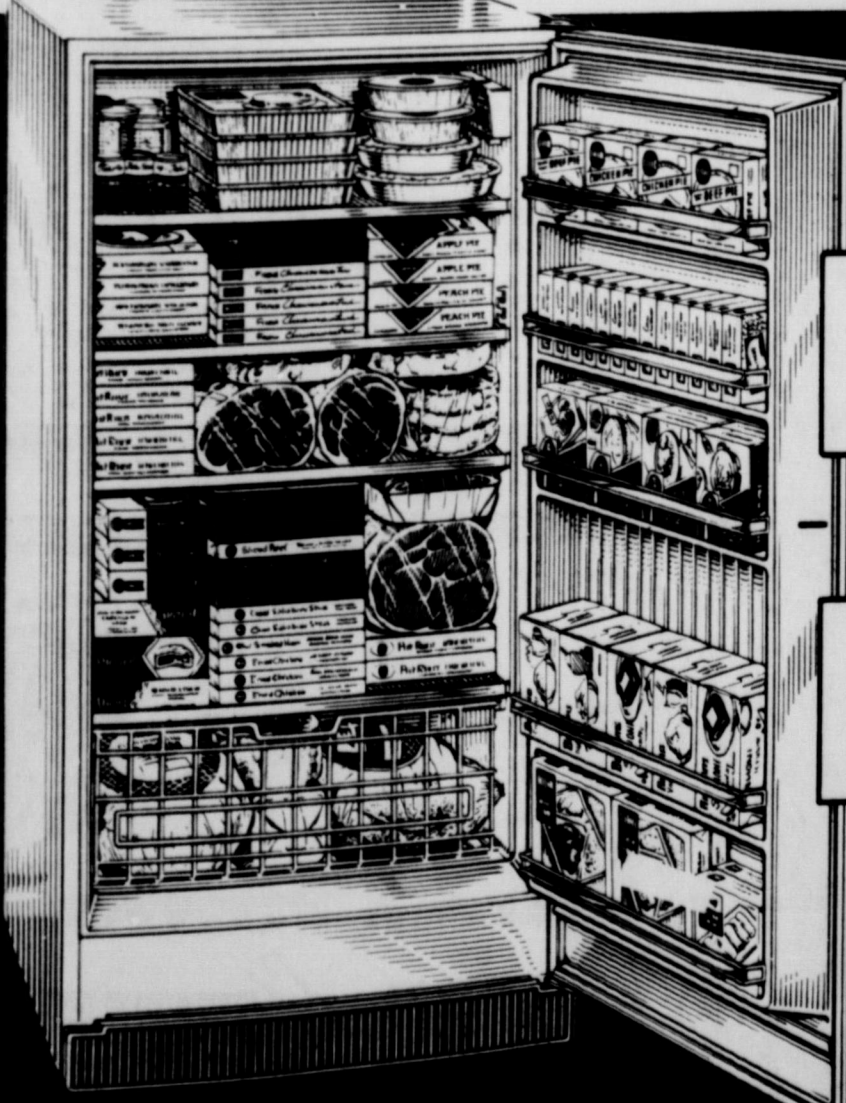
