Former Resident, Dr. M.K. Bowers Dies Of Heart Attack

Dr. M.K. Bowers died August 13 at the Methodist Hospital in Plattsburg, Mo., following a heart attack. He was 56.

Dr. Bowers was a dentist and had practiced in Plattsburg for the past 30 years. He was a graduate of Baker University, Baldwin, Kansas, and the Kansas City Western Dental College. He was a member of Zeta Chi fraternity and the Delta Sigma Delta dental fraternity.

He was a member of the Northwest Missouri Dental Society, Kansas City District Dental Association and the American Dental Assoc.

He was an active member of the Broadway United Methodist Church and had served for many years on the board of trustees and the administrative board. He was a member of the Plattsburg Masonic Lodge, the Royal Arch and Knights Templar, and the Order of the Eastern Star. He was a veteran of World War II and a member of the American Legion. He

JURY WHEEL: Under a new law passed by the Texas Legislature the Jury panel is selected by drawing the names from a wheel; the law went into effect August 1. The first drawing for Wheeler County was held Monday, August 30.

The wheel is to be filled each year between August 1 and 15 with four county officers or their deputies present; officers to be represented are County Clerk, County Sheriff, County Tax Assessor-Collector and District Clerk.

Wheeler County's wheel is filled with the names of the county's 3,000 registered voters. The names are typed on a slip of cardboard 1 1/2 by 3 1/2 inches. Each card lists the voter's name and address.

This process of selecting a jury panel replaces the Jury Commission. The jury commission consisted of five men picked by the District Judge and County Sheriff from over the county. These five men in turn selected a list of prospective jurors.

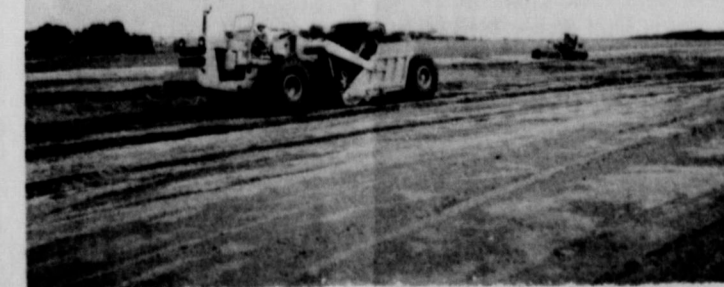

Legal Notice

AN ACT relating to the recording and rerecording of livestock brands and marks, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS

Section 1. (a) This Act shall apply to every county in this State. In all the counties, each owner of any livestock mentioned in Chapter 1 of Title 121 of the Revised Civil Statutes of 1925

shall within six months after this Act takes effect, have his mark and brand for such stock recorded in the office of the county clerk of the county. These owners shall record the marks and brands whether the brands and marks have been previously recorded or not.

(b) The owner shall have the right to have his mark and brand recorded in his name who according to the present records of the county first recorded the brand and mark in the county, or in event it can not be ascer-

tained from the records who first recorded the brand and mark in the county, then the person who has been using such mark and brand the longest shall have the right to have the brand and mark recorded in his name.

(c) After the expiration of six months from the taking effect of this Act, all records of marks and brands now in existence in the county shall no longer have any force or effect and after the expiration of six months, only the records made after this Act takes effect shall be

examined or considered recording marks and brands in the county.

(d) Immediately upon taking effect of this Act the county clerk of the county shall have this Act published in some newspaper of general circulation in the county a period of thirty days. Publication shall be paid for by the county out of general county funds.

Sec. 2. All clerks in registering brands shall comply with Articles 6899 through 6899, inclusive of the Revised Civil Statutes of Texas, 1925, as amended and with Section 1, Chapter 273, Acts of the 41st Legislature, 1929, as amended (Article 6899a, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes), and shall also be aware of and comply with Articles 1485, 1485a, and 1485b of the Code of Texas, 1925.

Sec. 3. All brands and marks registered under provisions of this Act shall be reregistered every 10 years in the manner prescribed in Section 1 of this Act.

Sec. 4. The importance of this legislation and the need condition of the calendar in both Houses create an emergency and an imperative public necessity that the Constitutional Rule requiring bills to be read three several days in each House be suspended, and this Rule is hereby suspended; and that this Act take effect and be in force after its passage, and it is so enacted.
