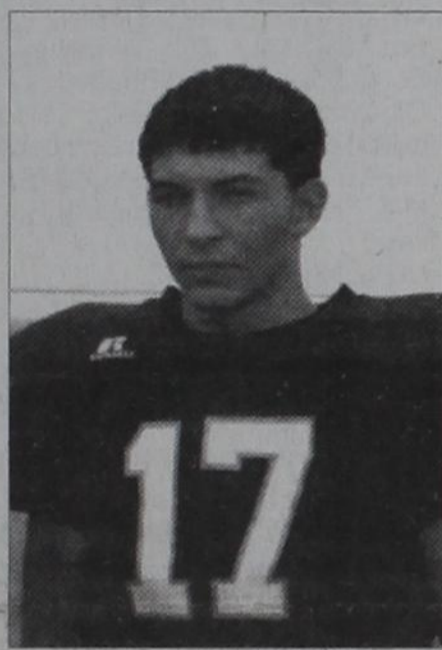
On Friday I saw Kace (Campbell). He is so cute! I love that little guy. Rhalee went to see him too. He is a sweet little baby.

Wellington finished off the first quarter when Ashmore threw another touchdown to Brady Montgomery. The extra point was wide and the first quarter came to an end with the score Wellington 22 Wheeler 0. Ashmore continued his domination as he threw two more touchdown passes to Montgomery, one for 38 and one for 6 yards as the Skyrockets rolled to a 34-0 halftime lead.

The Mustangs got on the

scoreboard early in the third quarter when Jake Ware ran for a 78 yard touchdown with less than a minute gone in the third quarter. Buenrostro kicked the extra point to bring the score to 34-7. Six minutes later Ware scored again on a 1 yard run and again the extra point was good to make the score 34-14. Ashmore passed for his fifth touchdown of the night and Montgomery caught his fourth touchdown pass of the night to bring the score to 40-14. The Mustangs scored the final touchdown of the game with five min-

utes left in the third quarter when Ware took off on a 71 yard touchdown run and made the extra point to make the final score Wellington 40 Wheeler 21. The good thing is the regular season is over and it is on to the playoffs for the 2-8 Mustangs. Wheeler will face the Mustangs of Claude in a rematch of a 34-32 win. The game will be played in Panhandle at 7:00PM on Thursday Nov. 15. It is a new season so let's get to Panhandle and support our play-off bound Wheeler Mustangs. **GO STANGS!!!!**

Accident Claims Life On 152 Nov. 7

An Oklahoma man died Wednesday morning after a two-vehicle wreck in Wheeler County, Texas. Department of Transportation Trooper, Daniel Hawthorne said.

At 8:32 a.m., John J. Taylor, 31 of Oklahoma City was driving a 2005 Ford Focus and collided with a tractor-trailer on Texas Highway 152, about 15 miles east of Wheeler, Hawthorne said.

Taylor was eastbound when he veered into the westbound lane and struck the front-left of the tractor-trailer, Hawthorne said.

Taylor died at the scene at 9:05 a.m., Hawthorne said.

The driver of the tractor-trailer, Juan G. Lopez, 47, of Memphis, was taken to Northwest Texas Hospital with internal injuries and his condition was unknown, Hawthorne said.

Both drivers were wearing their seat belts, according to Hawthorne.

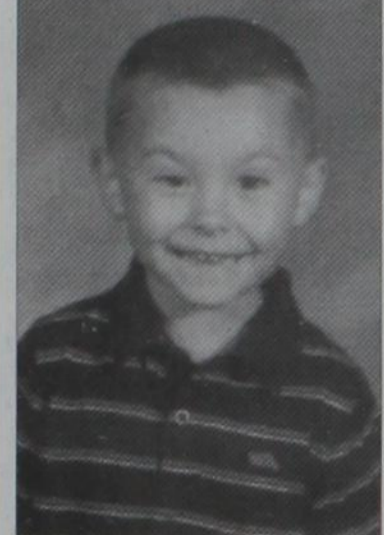

OLD TIMES NOT FORGOTTEN

Team Truck Drivin'

By the time I was sixteen or seventeen, I would jump at the chance to see a little more of the world. My opportunity came in the form of a grain hauling truck. My uncle Coyse, drove a truck for a living and hauled grain, too. He would load up somewhere in Kansas and make the long trip to Houston. From there, it was loaded onto ships, destined for places around the world I hadn't even heard of. One summer, since I had a few spare days, plus the weekend, Coyse, asked me if I'd like to make a trip with him. He said he'd pick me up on the way back from loading in Kansas. Sure enough, we "set sail" on a Friday

evening. He did all the driving on the way to Houston. We had to wait in line at the port for a couple of hours before we could get unloaded, then headed back home. When we got back to Electra, we stopped by my Uncle Lonnie's house and spent the night there. The next morning, when we got on the road again, he even let me drive for an hour, or so. On the way home, he told me a story about a trip to Houston that he'd made with a young man named, Slocum. This guy was probably in his early twenties, but did have something in common with me. He hadn't been anywhere much either, and made a deal with Coyse, to go with him on a trip to Houston. Coyse said it was already late in the evening, when they got started. After driving for two or three hours, he asked Slocum if he would drive for awhile. Being the obliging guy he was, he took the wheel, and Coyse went to sleep. About four or five hours later, Slocum pulled over and stopped. He woke Coyse up and told him, "I'm just too sleepy, can you take over for awhile?" Then he got over on the passenger side and immediately went to sleep. Coyse said, he got out of the truck, checked the tire air pressures and felt of each of the wheel bearings to see if any were hot. By the time he'd done all that, and taken care of some personal business, about ten or fifteen minutes had gone by. He got back in the driver's seat, then woke Slocum up, and said, "Hey, Sloke, are you about ready to drive some more?" Slocum replied, "Sure, I feel quite a lot better, now that I've had some sleep."..... Coyse, said that he lasted another hour or two, then played out again. I guess that's one way of "maximizing" your help.

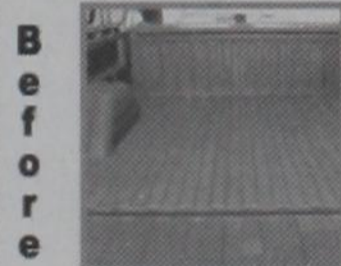

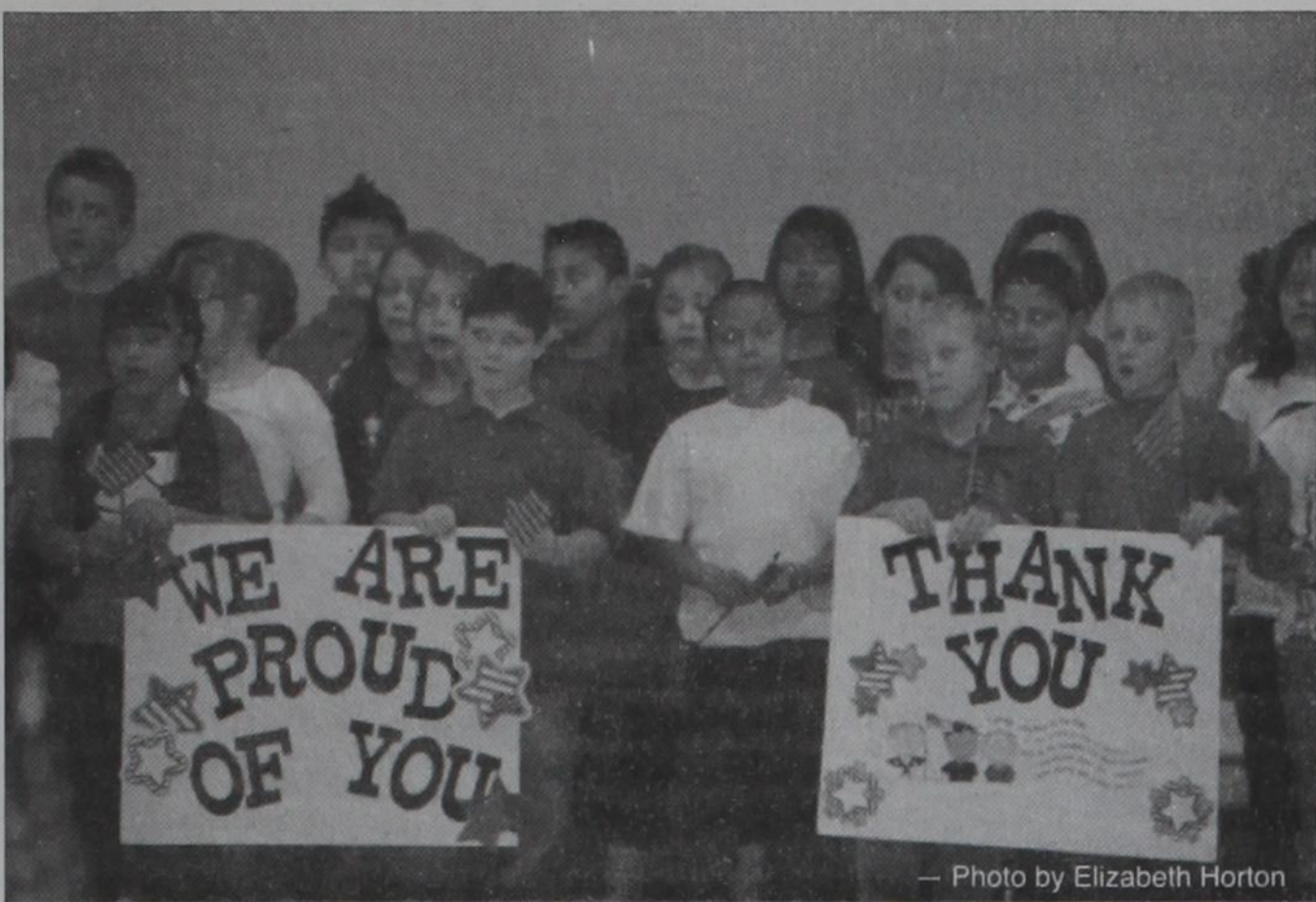

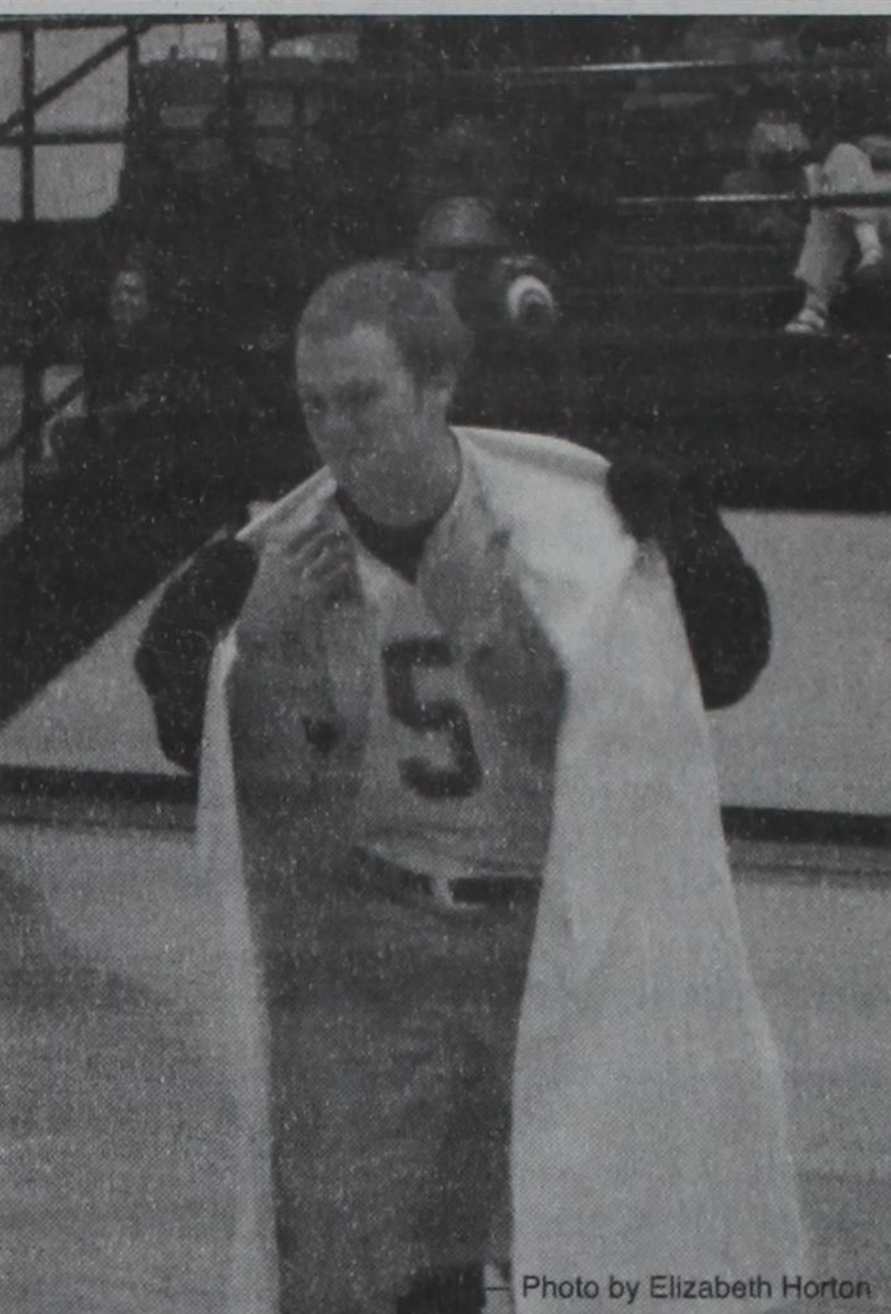
On Saturday, November 10, 2012, Wheeler's girls' basketball teams hosted the Canadian girls, and were defeated 31-54.

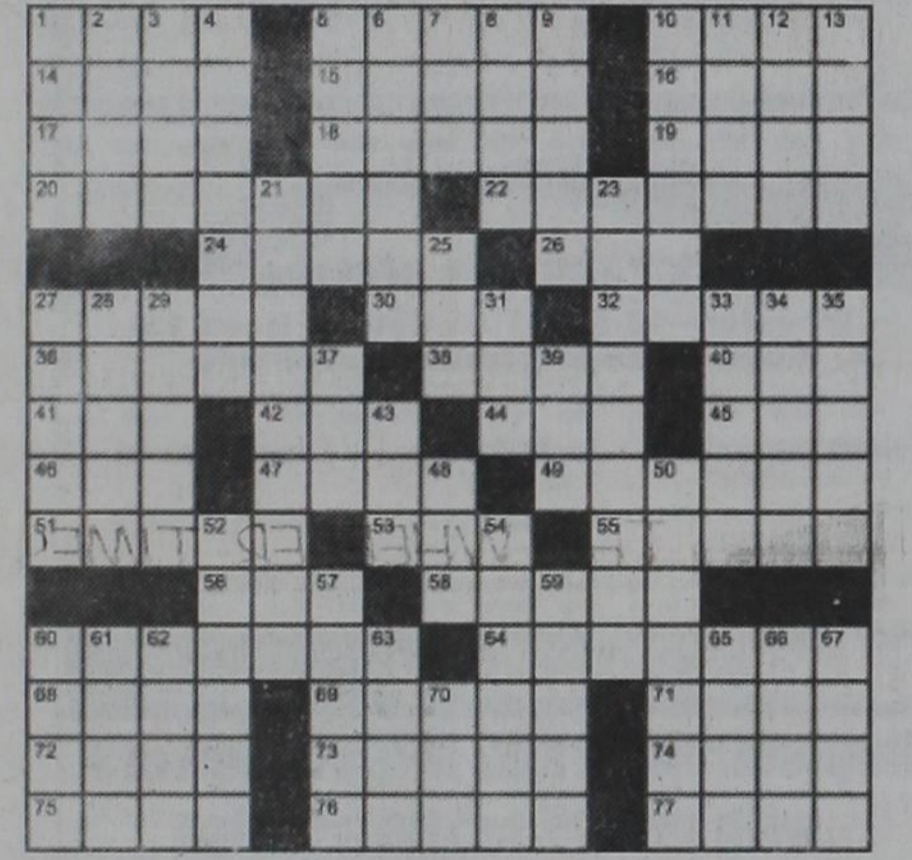
ORDER PROHIBITING OR RESTRICTING OUTDOOR BURNING

WHEREAS, the Commissioners' Court finds that circumstances present in all or part of the unincorporated area of the county create a public safety hazard that would be exacerbated by outdoor burning;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED by the Commissioners Court of Wheeler County that all outdoor burning is prohibited in the unincorporated area of the county for 90 days from the date of adoption of this Order, unless the restrictions are terminated earlier based on a determination made by the Texas Forest Service or this Court. This Order is adopted pursuant to Local Government Code Sec. 352.081, and other applicable statutes. This Order does not prohibit outdoor burning activities related to public health and safety that are authorized by the

Texas Commission on Environmental Quality for:
(1) Firefighter Training;
(2) Public utility, natural gas pipeline or mining operations;
(3) planting or harvesting of agricultural crops; and
(4) burns that are conducted by a prescribed burn manager certified under Sec. 153.048, Natural Resources Code, and meet the standards of Sec. 153.047, Natural Resources Code;
In accordance with Local Government Code Sec. 352.081(h), a violation of this Order is a Class C misdemeanor, punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500.00.
ADOPTED this 13th day of November, 2012, by a vote of 4 ayes and 0 nays and effective November 13, 2012.

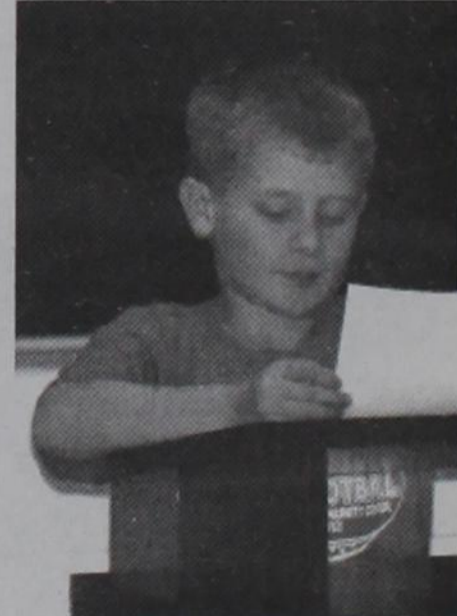

agency or maintenance vehicles, especially when their flashing lights are on. Did you know? The law requires you to maintain a distance of at least 200 feet when approaching a snow plow, and do not pass on the right. Visibility can also be reduced during winter weather conditions.

Be patient. Your trip time—including short commutes to work—could increase when adverse weather conditions exist.

Also, keep to the main roads and avoid taking shortcuts through territory that may not have been plowed.

Winterize vehicles before traveling during adverse weather. Check fuel, tire, oil, and antifreeze levels. Make sure heater, brakes, and windshield wipers are working properly starting a trip.

Tex. Marks 12 Yrs. Of Daily Fatalities

Somber anniversary reinforces importance of Texas traffic laws—simple actions can save lives

As hard as it is to believe, the last day Texas was able to enjoy without a single fatality on Texas roads was 12 years ago on November 7, 2000. That means since that date, at least one person has died every single day on a Texas highway or roadway,

bringing the total to 41,252 fatalities—almost the size of the population in San Marcos.

"One fatality on a Texas roadway is one too many, and to see as many as eight or 10 in a single day is unacceptable," said Phil Wilson TxDOT executive director. "As we acknowledge these tragic statistics, we are asking Texans to please help us make our roadways safer."

In 2011 alone, Texas experienced 3,048 traffic fatalities. The majority of these traffic fatalities resulted from people who did not

use seat belts, were drinking and driving and/or driving distracted:

- 28.9 percent of people killed in fatal crashes were not wearing seatbelts
- 34.9 percent were attributed to drinking and driving
