



Here are some house-keeping New Year's resolutions I read, made by a weary housewife. These are just a few to think about (the third one sounds extra nice!)

1. Stage a sit-down strike. For example, don't stand up when you can sit down to do your cooking preparations like chopping up vegetables, rolling pie crusts, etc. Other household jobs also lend themselves to sit-down tactics.
2. Stop being a conveyor belt. Make up separate sets of cleaning equipment for bathrooms and kitchen (other areas, too if needed). That way the cleaning gear is where you're at.
3. Make use of the 25th hour of the day. This is the time for yourself to take an uninterrupted tub, a short rest or read that book.

Dozing Driver

Too little sleep, like too much liquor, can turn even the mildest motorist into a deadly menace. If a driver dozes off and has an accident, is he legally liable for the consequences?



The law starts with the proposition that no one should be blamed for what he does while unconscious. Blame rests on free will misused—and the sleeping person is not using free will at all.

But one court after another has nonetheless imposed liability on the dozing driver. They find him negligent not for what he does while asleep but for disregarding, while still awake, the telltale signs that sleep was coming.

"It is true," said one court, "that (the driver) can not ordinarily fix the precise moment when he lapses into unconsciousness. But it is not true that ordinarily sleep comes unheralded. It lies within his own control to keep awake or cease driving."

Background factors, contributing to the danger, are also taken into account. One driver had been at the wheel continuously for 18 hours; another was exhausted from overwork; a third had kept going after twice almost "fading out." In each case, when the driver dozed off, he was held liable for the results.

Suppose it is the passenger, not the driver, who falls asleep. Does the law frown on that too?

Occasionally the passenger does have a duty to stay awake—when he has some special reason to think that the driver needs watching. But as a rule he may nap at will, putting his trust in the driver to take care.

In one case a woman in the back seat dozed off and slumped against the driver's seat, pushing it forward and knocking his hands off the steering wheel. In the crash that followed, the driver was injured.

Could he collect damages from the woman on the theory that her falling asleep was an act of negligence? A court said no, because a passenger could scarcely be expected to anticipate such a freakish accident just from falling asleep.

"(She) was required to exercise foresight," said the court, "not clairvoyance."

Biscuits - Roll, cut, and separate by a double layer of cellophane or other moisture-vapor proof paper. Pack tightly in moisture-vapor proof package, freeze and store. Do not store longer than 2 to 4 weeks. Biscuits may be baked thawed or unthawed.

Bake thawed biscuits on a greased baking sheet for 12 to 15 minutes and unthawed ones 20 to 25 minutes at 450°

baking cups, freeze, wrap, seal and store. Do not store longer than 2 to 4 weeks. To prepare for serving, thaw at room temperature for 1 hour. Bake as for fresh muffins.

Bran Muffins, fruit and nut bread - Bake, cool, and wrap in moisture-vapor proof material, freeze and store. Do not store longer than 3 months. To prepare for serving, thaw in original wrapping at room temperature or in a 250° to 300° oven.

Like beans and burgers? Try combining them in this recipe:
Round-up Beans and Burgers
1 pound ground chuck
1/4 tsp. pepper
1 c. undiluted evaporated milk
1/4 c. finely chopped onion
1 c. catsup

2 tsp. brown sugar
2 tsp. Worcestershire sauce
1 tsp. salt
1/2 c. quick oats
1/2 c. flour
2 tsp. shortening
1 tsp. vinegar
1/2 tsp. dry mustard
3/2 c. (1 lb. 12 oz. can) baked beans.

Mix chuck, salt, pepper, oats, 1/2 cup milk, and onion in mixing bowl. Divide into 12 portions; shape into balls. Melt shortening in skillet. Brown meat balls on all sides. Drain off fat. Mix catsup, vinegar, sugar, mustard and Worcestershire. Pour over meat balls. Simmer 15 min. Mix baked beans, flour and rest of 1/2 cup of milk in a 2 qt. casserole dish. Bake at 375° for 10 min. Spoon meat balls and sauce over hot beans. Bake 20 min. longer. Serves 4.

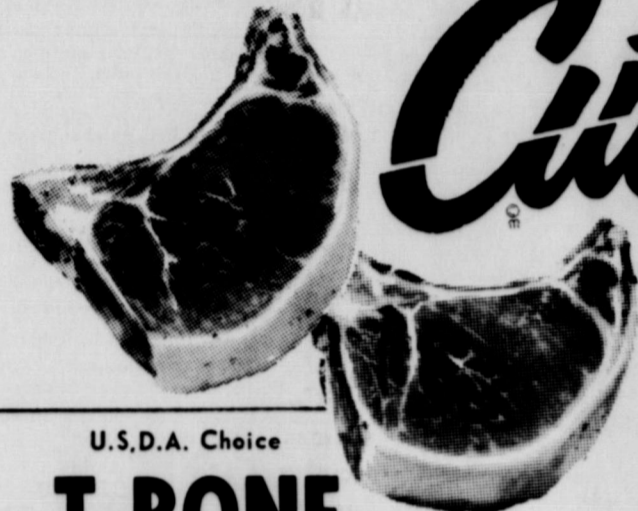

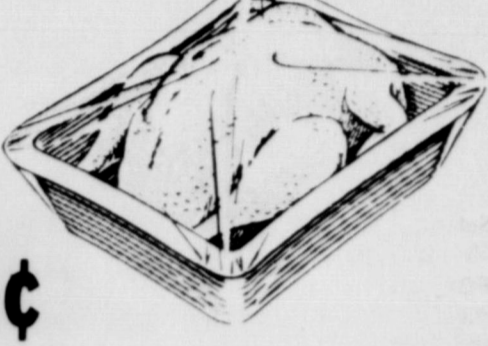
