# It is Illegal To Shoot Fireworks Within Wheeler City Limits

**ORDINANCE NO 4:3** TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO.25

AN ORDINANCE MAKING IT UNLAWFUL, TO DISCHARGE FIREWORKS WITHIN THE CITY OF WHEELER, DEFINING THE TERM FIREWORKS AND PRO-VIDING A PENALTY AND A SAV-ING CLAUSE SECTION 1.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Wheeler that it shall hereinafter be unlawh,I for any person to discharge any fireworks of any kind or size anywhere within the city limits except for the July 4th fireworks presented to the Public by the Wheeler Fire Department at the City Park.

The term "fireworks" shall mean and include any Lire cracker, roman candle, torpedo, sky rocket or any other combustible package or contrivance of in flammable or
