During the next academic year, Miss Mundy will attend the University of Oklahoma at Norman. The scholarship is made possible by the New March of Dimes.

"It gives me great pleasure to present this health scholarship to Miss Mundy," Mr. Wofford said.

"These young people, men and women dedicated to helping others, will one day help relieve the acute shortage of trained personnel in the health fields, a shortage that becomes more serious every day. The National Foundation through March of Dimes contributions, is proud to be able to give them a helping hand."

This is the second year the health scholarships have been awarded by the National Foundation, which now seeks to prevent birth defects and arthritis in addition to continuing to seek total prevention of polio. Winners of the 515 scholarships in medicine, medical social work, nursing, physical therapy or occupational therapy are selected in each state by committees composed of five state health leaders representing the 5 professions included in the program.

Local Hospital To Become A 'Nicholson Memorial'

Dr. H. E. Nicholson Sr. and wife announced this week that the name of the Wheeler Hospital will be changed to "Harold E. Nicholson, Jr., M.D. Memorial Hospital" as soon as the necessary legal work can be completed and the necessary changes and adjustments made.

Following the change the hospital will be operated as a non-profit organization. Any profits derived from the operation of the hospital will be divided equally between the development fund of the Texas A & M Ex-Student Association and the Alumni Association of the medical Department of Baylor University. This money will be utilized at both schools to assist needy students in completing their education and training. No part of the funds will be used to pay salaries or operating expenses but will be utilized entirely for the aid of students. The purpose for the memorial funds will be to help those students that have exhausted their own families potential, have shown themselves to be dedicated and worthy, capable and honest. Funds from these two organizations are used to see that the worthy young men are

able to finish their training and then it is customary to repay the funds when the student is able and is earning according to the training taken.

Texas A&M, of course, is the school Dr. Harold loved and Baylor University Medical Department is the school that both Dr. Nicholson Sr. and Dr. Harold Nicholson Jr., completed their training in.

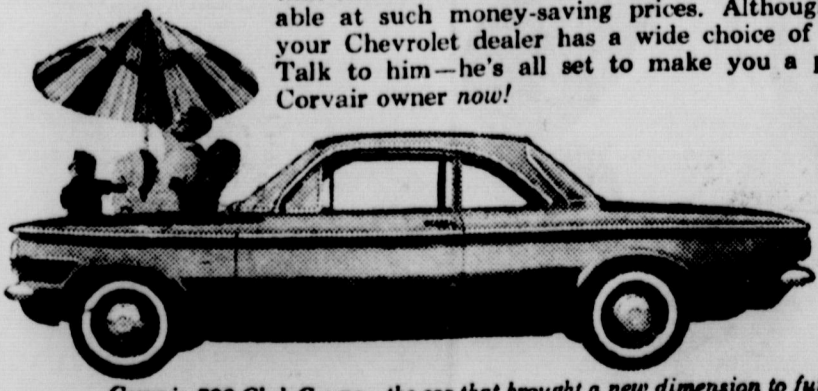


