It's a little hard for me to believe, but we've been doing these little, silly stories for three years now; this one being #156. All my working life was spent around other guys, like myself; who were a little less than perfect, and seemed plenty willing to prove it. Just about everybody knows a few stories about how they "goofed up," sometime in the past. When you come right down to it, nobody wants to hear you tell how 'good' you did. I've always been of the opinion, if you're actually good at something, people will figure it out for themselves. You won't have to chase them down and tell them.

I worked in an oil refinery for seven years a long time ago. Every Monday morning, the crew that I worked with, had a safety meeting. Free & Reduced-Price Meals

Media Release for Free and Reduced-Price Meals
Make appropriate changes as applicable to reflect the programs operated. Attach a copy of the current eligibility guidelines.

Fort Elliott CISD today announced its policy for providing free and reduced-price meals for students served under the National School Lunch and/or School Breakfast Program.

Each school or the central office has a copy of the policy, which may be reviewed by any interested party.

The household size and income criteria identified below will be used to determine eligibility for free and reduced-price benefits. Students from households whose income is at or below the levels shown are eligible for free or reduced-price meals. Foster children who are the legal responsibility of the state agency or court are eligible for free meal benefits regardless of the income of the household with whom they reside.

Application forms are being distributed to all households with a letter informing households of the availability of free and reduced-price meals for their children. Applications also are available at the administration office in each school. To apply for free and reduced-price meals, households must fill out the application and return it to the school. Applications may be submitted anytime during the school year. The information households provide on the application will be used for the purpose of determining eligibility and verification of data. Applications may be verified by the school officials at any time during the school year.

For school officials to determine eligibility for free and reduced-price benefits, households receiving Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits (formerly Food Stamps)/Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) only have to list their child's name and SNAP or TANF case number. An adult household member must sign the application.

Households that do not list a SNAP/TANF case number must list the names of all household members, the amount and source of the income received by each household member, and the last four digits of the Social Security number of the adult household member who signs the application. If the adult who signs the application does not have a Social Security number, the household member must indicate that a Social Security number is not available by writing the word "None," "No Number," or some indication that the person does not have a Social Security number. The application must be signed by an adult household member.

Under the provisions of the free and reduced-price meal policy, Principal's Secretary will review applications and determine eligibility. Parents or guardians dissatisfied with the ruling of the official may wish to discuss the decision with the reviewing official on an informal basis. Parents wishing to

make a formal appeal for a hearing on the decision may make a request either orally or in writing to the Principal.

If a household member becomes unemployed or if the household size increases, the household should contact the school. Such changes may make the students of the household eligible for benefits if the household's income falls at or below the levels shown above.

In accordance with Federal Law and U.S. Department of Agriculture policy, this institution is prohibited from discriminating on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, age, or disability.

Making the decision to breastfeed is a very personal matter. It's also one that's very likely to elicit strong opinions from friends and family.

What Are the Benefits of Breastfeeding for Baby?

Breast milk provides the ideal nutrition for infants. It has the perfect mix of vitamins, protein, and fat — everything your infant needs to grow. And it's all provided in a form more easily digested than infant formula. Breast milk contains antibodies that help your baby fight off viruses and bacteria. Breastfeeding reduces your baby's risk of having asthma or allergies. Babies who are breastfed exclusively for the first six months, without any formula, have fewer ear infections, respiratory illnesses, and bouts of diarrhea. They also have fewer hospitalizations and trips to the doctor.

Breastfeeding has been linked to higher IQ scores in later childhood in some studies. The physical closeness, skin-to-skin touching, and eye contact all help your baby bond with you and feel secure. Breastfed infants are more likely to gain the right amount of weight as they grow rather than become overweight children. The AAP says breastfeeding plays a role in the prevention of SIDS (sudden infant death syndrome). It's been thought to lower the risk of diabetes, obesity, and certain cancers as well but more research is needed to confirm these findings.

Are There Breastfeeding Benefits for the Mother?

Breastfeeding burns extra calories, so it can help you lose pregnancy weight faster. It releases the hormone oxytocin, which helps your uterus return to its pre-pregnancy size and may reduce uterine bleeding after birth. Breastfeeding lowers your risk of breast and ovarian cancer. It may also lower your risk of osteoporosis.

Since you don't have to buy and measure formula, sterilize nipples, or warm bottles, breastfeeding saves you time and money. Deciding to breastfeed provides you with regular time for relaxing quietly with your newborn as you grow close and emotionally bond.

Will I Make Enough Milk to Breastfeed?

The first few days after birth, your breasts produce ideal "first milk." It's called colostrum. Colostrum is thick, yellowish, and scant — but there's plenty to meet your baby's nutritional needs. Colostrum helps a newborn's digestive tract develop and prepare itself to digest breast milk.

Most babies lose a small amount of weight in the first three to five days after birth. This is unrelated to breastfeeding. A natural feedback loop exists between your baby's feeding needs and your milk production. As your baby needs more milk and nurses more, your breasts respond by producing more milk. Experts recommend breastfeeding exclusively (no formula, juice, or water) for six months. If you supplement with formula, your milk production may go down.

Even if you breastfeed less than the recommended six months, it's better to breastfeed for a short time than no time at all. You can add solid food at six months but also continue to breastfeed if you want to keep producing milk.

Breastfeeding is a gift that lasts a lifetime.

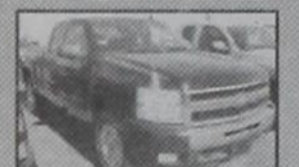

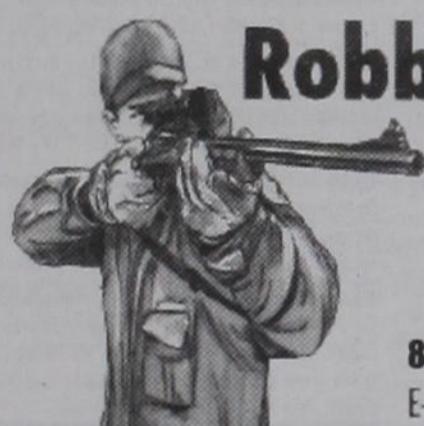

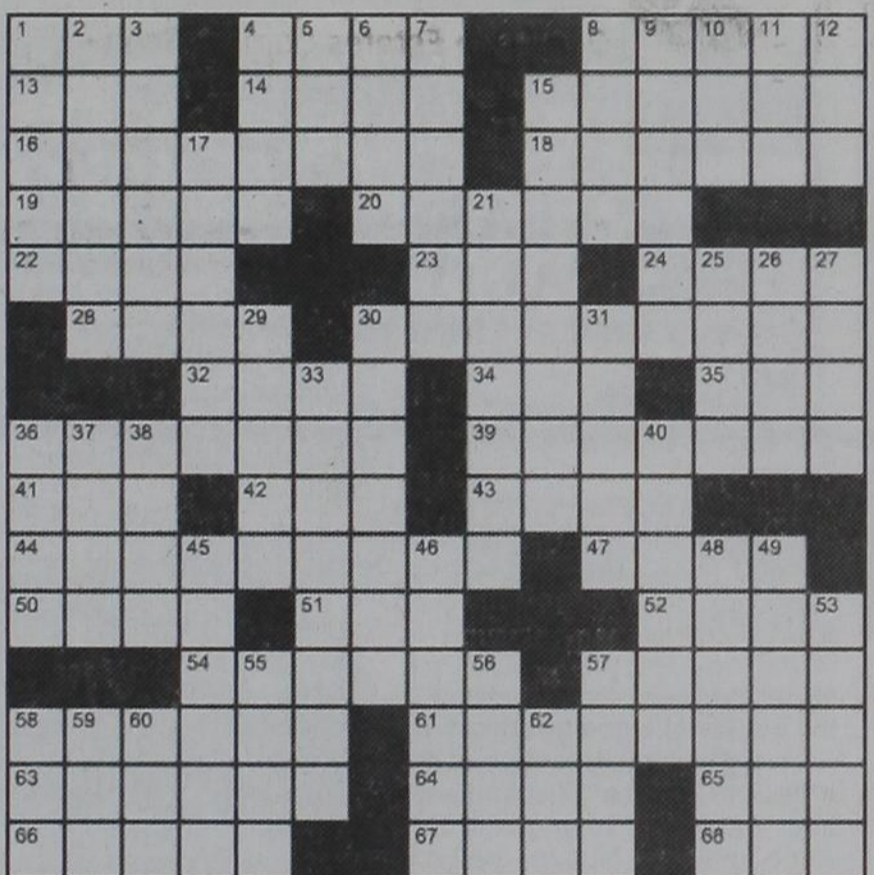

Free & Reduced-Price Meals

Wheeler ISD today announced its policy for providing free and reduced-price meals for students served under the National School Lunch and/or School Breakfast Program. Each school or the central office has a copy of the policy, which may be reviewed by any interested party.

The household size and income criteria identified below will be used to determine eligibility for free and reduced-price benefits. Students from households whose income is at or below the levels shown are eligible for free or reduced-price meals. Foster children who are the legal responsibility of the state agency or court are eligible for free meal benefits regardless of the income of the household with whom they reside.

Application forms are being distributed to all households with a letter informing households of the availability of free and reduced-price meals for their children. Applications also available at the administration office in each school. To apply for free and reduced-price meals, households must fill out the application and return it to the school. Applications may be submitted anytime during the school year. The information households provide on the application will be used for the purpose of determining eligibility and verification of data.

Applications may be verified by the school officials at any time during the school year.

For school officials to determine eligibility for free and reduced-price benefits, households receiving Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits (formerly Food Stamps)/Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) only have to list their child's name and SNAP or TANF case number. An adult household member must sign the application.

Households that do not list a SNAP/TANF case number must list the names of all household members, the amount and source of the income received by

each household member, and the last four digits of the Social Security number of the adult household member who signs the application. If the adult who signs the application does not have a Social Security number, the household member must indicate that a Social Security number is not available by writing the word "None," "No Number," or some indication that the person does not have a Social Security number. The application must be signed by an adult household member.

Under the provisions of the free and reduced-price meal policy, Superintendent's Secretary will review applications and determine eligibility. Parents or guardians dissatisfied with the ruling of the official may wish to discuss the decision with the reviewing official on an informal basis.

Parents wishing to make a formal appeal for a hearing on the decision may make a request either orally or in writing to the Principal.

If a household member becomes unemployed or if the household size increases, the household should contact the school. Such changes may make the students of the household eligible for benefits if the household's income falls at or below the levels shown above.

Xcel Energy warns of new customer scam

AMARILLO, Texas — Xcel Energy has received numerous reports about a new scam targeting customers in the Texas-New Mexico area.

Some customers have been contacted by callers claiming to represent Xcel Energy, indicating the customers' electric service is soon to be disconnected. The caller then tells customers to make their utility payments by purchasing a Green Dot pre-pay VISA card at a local drug or convenience store.

When customers purchase the card and call the phone number provided by the scammer, they are then directed to another phone number where the card information is obtained and the cash value is removed from the card. Additionally, the card customers purchase at stores is only a temporary card, so when they provide their information, the permanent card may be registered in another name and redirected.

This scam typically targets Hispanic customers and is perpetrated by callers who may speak Spanish.

Xcel Energy is communicating the following advice in the wake of this scam:

- Any time customers are unsure if they've been contacted

about their accounts or payments by Xcel Energy, call us at 1-800-894-4999 to verify that we sent the email or letter or made the phone call.

A hilltop southwest of Wheeler has seen its share of activity during this yearly season of severe weather.

Wheeler's dedicated volunteer firemen have constructed a unique type of storm cellar on the hill for the specific purpose of watching the clouds when this area is alerted for turbulent weather.

And a designated number of firemen take their places at the cellar each time storm clouds move into the area.

The unusual feature of the cellar is a Plexiglas blister imbedded in the roof, from which firemen keep a close look at the clouds.

The blister was taken from an Air Force bomber and secured by the firemen for use in the cellar.

Fire Chief R. J. Holt, Jr., said members of the Wheeler Fire Department work in shifts at the storm watch site.

A fire truck equipped with a two-way radio, stands by there, and another two-way radio is inside the cellar.

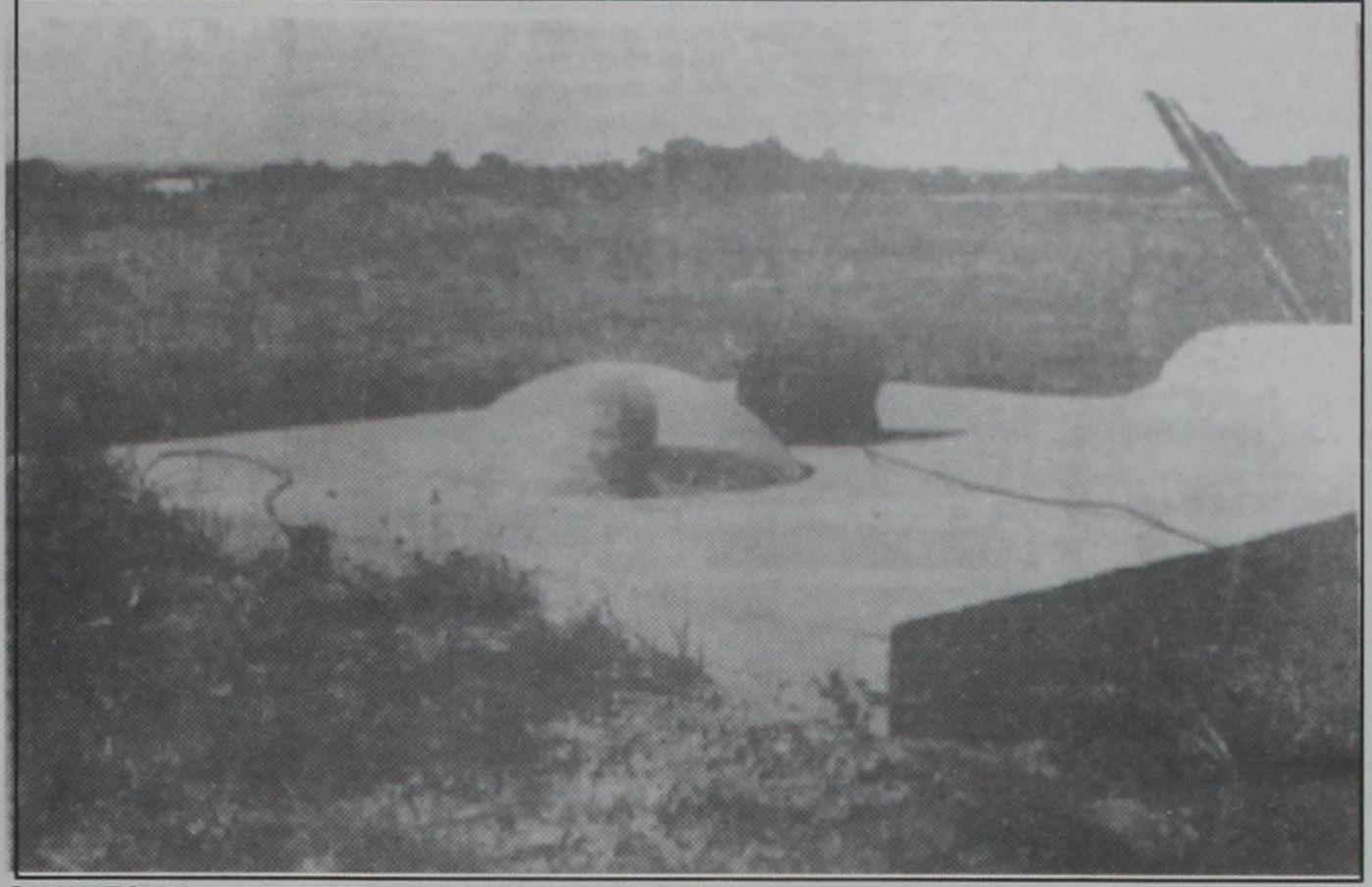
If a tornado is sighted, work is

radioed or telephoned to the fire station where other volunteers also are on duty during the alert. Two 30-second blasts are sounded to warn residents of impending danger.

In the event electricity has been knocked out, firemen are pre-

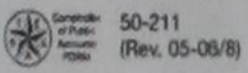


pared to drive fire department vehicles along the streets of Wheeler with sirens sounding to alert residents.

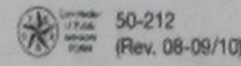

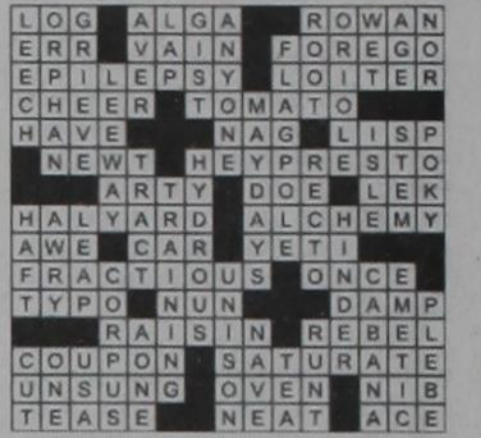
