"In 1948, the CIO-PAC moved in on the grassroots level

of the Democratic party. According to the PAC expert, the move was made with the personal approval of Walter Reuther.

The year 1948 was enormously successful for the CIO politicians in Michigan. They elected a Governor. But, they did not let him get the foolish idea that he might be in control

"In the spring convention of the Democrats in 1949, the New York Times reporter says it was Gus Scholle, director of the state CIO, rather than the Governor, who was the real head of the State Democratic Convention.

### Goon Squads Take Over

"In 1950, I understand the traditional Democrats made a last vain attempt to take back their party from the CIO politicians of Michigan. The Calkins investigation shows how this last attempt was smashed by equipping each of the Wayne County District conventions with small squads of men ready to use force to prevent the regular Democrats from regaining power. The leader of the armed squad which took over the Democratic Convention in the 15th district told Calkins he was equipped with 6 men, 29 clubs and 2 pistols.


