## TO A HERO

A small group of Volunteer Firemen met Sunday in Wheeler to pay their tribute to a friend and a courageous fireman who gave his life Saturday while protecting the property of others and performing his duty as a volunteer fireman.

No more noble death can come to any man than that of giving his life for his fellow man.

Only hours before some of these same men had fought side by side with Dudley as they attempted to quench the blaze of a prairie fire which burned almost 2 sections of grass land.

Deep within, each of these men realized the debt they along with the rest of the county, owed to Dudley, his family and his memory. And within a few minutes the small group had come up with \$500.00 to give to the family.

This, of course, is small payment for a loved one's life, but in the words of one man, "We can replace the fence posts and the grass will grow back but only God can breath the breath of life. However, in our small way we can attempt to lessen the family's suffering."

A trust fund has also been started to help with the education of Dudley's two children. Anyone desiring to make contribution toward this trust fund can do so at the Times office.

## SERVICES HELD FOR DON RAY SNELGROVES

Funeral services for Don Ray Snelgroves, 20, of Pauls Valley, Oklahoma, were conducted at 3 p.m. Monday in the Wheeler Church of Christ.

Minister Joe Duke officiated assisted by E. M. Borden.

Burial was in Wheeler Cemetery under the direction of Kirk Funeral Home.

Mr. Snelgroves was fatally injured in an automobile accident at 10:30 p.m. Friday three miles east of Follett.

He was an oilfield worker and was married to the former Shirley Ann Thompson of Mobeetie, October 29, 1955. He had lived most of his life in Wheeler.

Surviving are his wife and a son, Ray; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. N. H. Snelgroves all of Pauls Valley; a sister, Mrs. Retha Gordon of Pauls Valley; five brothers, Cecil of Twitty, Henry of Roff, Oklahoma; Thad of Garden Groves, California; Truman of Long Beach, California and Tommy of Paul Valley.

## Fireman Callan Dies In County Prairie Fire

### WHEELER RIDING CLUB, BAND AND FLOATS PLACE HIGH AT SHAMROCK

Approximately 30,000 attended the St. Patrick's Day Celebration in Shamrock Tuesday, and enjoyed near perfect weather all day. Wheeler was very well represented.

The Wheeler band placed 3rd in their division. This is indeed an honor for Wheeler and certainly indicates the fine job band director Vernon Lewis is doing with the local band. 19 bands were entered in the parade.

The Wheeler Riding and Roping Club placed second in their division. 8 clubs were entered. Every year the riding club looks and performs better than the year before. Wheeler certainly has a club

to be proud of. In the city division of the float contest Wheeler placed 2nd. Sayre won first and Amarillo won third place. Each year the Chamber of Commerce pays for the material and Bernice Hall takes the responsibility of decorating the float. This, by the way, is certainly not the first plaque Bernice has won for Wheeler. The Farm Bureau also placed second with their float.

Another highlight at the celebration came when it was announced that Palmer Sivage of Wheeler won the pony and saddle given away during the celebration.

### Service Held Monday For Local Business Man

High winds with gusts up to 60 miles per hour fanned smoldering timber on the George Kite ranch early Saturday morning and started one of the worst prairie fires in recent history. The dust laden high winds quickly spread the fire over two sections of range land and cost the life of one Wheeler Volunteer fireman.

Dudley Callan, 39, owner of the Deluxe Cleaning plant in Wheeler was fatally burned by flames as he battled the mid morning grass fire. Callan suffered burns over 100 per cent of his body. He died in the Wheeler hospital at 5:55 P.M. Saturday, less than 4 hours after the accident occurred.

Callan was burned shortly after the Wheeler fire truck became stuck in a bed of sand. Callan and another fireman, N. D. Ware Jr. of Wheeler, had gone to fight the fire. The remaining firemen stayed with the truck in an attempt to free the truck.

The two men were forced to retreat before the advancing flames. Callan was engulfed by the flames. Ware was able to jump over the fire and make it to safety.

Funeral services for Dudley Callan were held at 10:00 A.M. Monday in the First Methodist Church of Wheeler. The Rev. Carlton Thomson, pastor, officiated assisted by Rev. M. B. Smith of Pampa.

Martin Dudley Callan was born at Sweetwater, Oklahoma April 19, 1919 and lived most of his life in Wheeler with the exception of 4 years spent in the Air Force during World War II. He served as an MP during the war and spent two years overseas.

Callan was a member of the American Legion, Wheeler Chamber of Commerce, Wheeler Volunteer Fire Department and the Methodist Church.

He is survived by his wife Verma Callan; 2 daughters, Malinda Kay and Cathy D'Ann, all of Wheeler.

Other survivors include his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Martin Callan of Wheeler; one brother, Harold D. Callan of Pampa; Paternal grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. J. A. Callan of Wheeler; Maternal grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. W. O. Miller of Wheeler.

Interment was in the Wheeler Cemetery with a full military service by the West Passons Legion Post of Wheeler, under the direction of the Kirk Funeral Home.

Pall bearers were Bob McNeil, Earl Barnes, Thurman Rives, Hiram Whitener, Ocie Ford and Jack Garrison.

### Second Fire Saturday Burns 200 Acres

Following the grass fire west of Wheeler Saturday morning which took the life of volunteer fireman Dudley Callan, a second blaze broke out on grassland four miles south of Wheeler about 5:30 p.m. when an electric power line snapped and set fire to tinder-dry prairie land. An estimated 200 acres of grass went up in smoke before the blaze was controlled at 7 p.m. Saturday. There was no damage to permanent property and no reported injuries.

Both blazes were fanned by strong winds which hurled a blanket of dust across much of the High Plains and portions of the South Plains through most of the (Continued on Page 5 No. 3)

Now it is our turn to respond to the annual appeal of the Red Cross. Knowing its many and varied services on our behalf, I am sure this appeal will receive our most generous support.

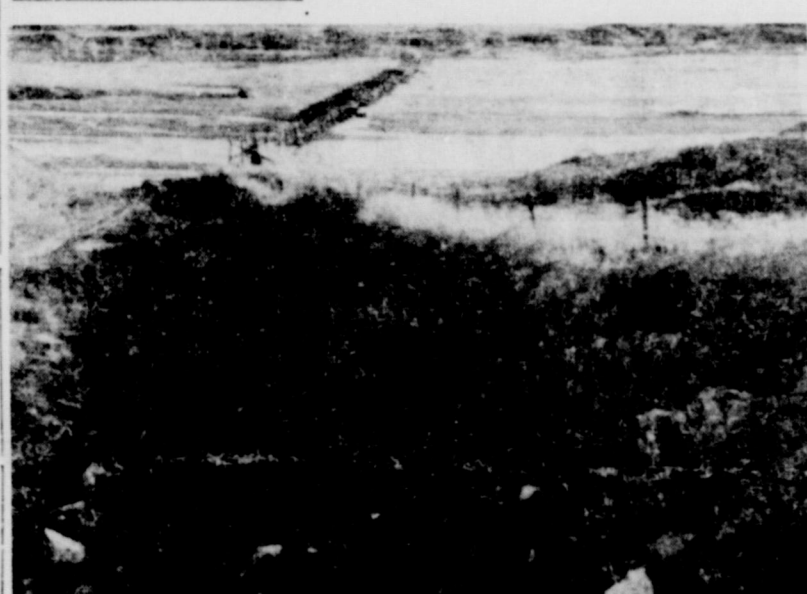

## Contract For Bridge, Paving Project To Be Let In May

In a telephone conversation Tuesday evening with District Highway engineer Clyde Drake it was learned that plans for the 6 miles of paving and new bridge across Red River are in Austin now for inspection. If the plans meet the state engineers specifications the contract for construction of the project will probably be let sometime in May Drake said.

The new bridge and paving will connect Wheeler and Magic City and open a vast new trade territory for the Wheeler Community. The project will consist of a 1,205 foot concrete and steel bridge a-

cross the Red River and 5 miles of paving on the north side of the river and 1 mile of paving on the south side. The paving on the north side will tie into Farm to Market road 2167 and the paving on the south side will connect with paving north of Magic City.

Drake estimated the cost of the project at \$240,000 and said it will probably take from 8 to 10 months to complete.

## Harris Arrested With 32 Pints Of Whiskey

George Harris of Shamrock was charged with "possession of liquor for the purpose of sale" Tuesday following his arrest in Shamrock by two members of the state liquor control board.

**IS SALVATION OUT OF DATE?**

Text: "They that be whole need not a physician, but they that are sick" Matt 9:12

So many people today don't even know what you are talking about when you ask them, "Are you saved?"

The word has suffered devaluation. It isn't circulated as freely as it was in the past. It was a frequent word in the Apostle Paul's vocabulary. Martin Luther used the word in every sermon he preached. The crowds knew what Moody and Sunday were talking about when these American evangelist spoke about being saved. Do you neighbor? Has the term become unintelligible. Has it passed out of fashion altogether? What do I mean when I ask you, "Are you saved?" Jesus never hesitated to use language people understood. It might not be the language of the synagogue or the temple but it got behind religious terminology to reality of every day experiences.

Jesus so often spoke of salvation as though it were health. He thought of sinners as sick people and sin as deadly disease. He thought of evil as a malignant growth like cancer, extending its roots and eating into the vitals of a man's personality. And thus to Jesus Christ salvation was imperative never irrelevant never out of date.

What is this disease that smites the human race? What is this great contradiction that makes an impassable gulf between our ideals and our attainments? Why is it always the same old story. "The good that I would, I do not, but the evil which I would not, that I do"? **WHAT IS THIS SICKNESS ABOUT THE HUMAN RACE?** We are all weak. We all need a cure. We need someone to save us.

Jesus thought of Himself as a Physician. He took the cynical, the disillusioned, the defeated, the despairing, the mentally distraught, the failures of life and changed them into new creatures, purposeful, forward looking, bursting with new zest and energy. He took Mary Magdalene, the playgirl of the city, and transfigured her into an ideal of beautiful womanhood. He took Zacchaeus, an unscrupulous twister, and made him into an honest man. He took Peter, a graveling coward, and made him a saint and martyr. He took Paul, a hate filled fanatic and made him into an apostle of love. There was no disease this Physician could not cure and today His skill is not spent. There is power in His touch this hour.

What is ruining your life mister? Is it a lie? Can you say that you are fit and whole as long as your life is crippled with deceit? You need salvation! Is it greed? Can you say that you are well as long as these desires uncontrolled in your life? You need help! Is it foul language, unspeakably, dirty and filthy, blasphemous and indecent?

Neighbor, there's something wrong with these kind of people - a terrible moral disease that will destroy them and everything worthwhile they could have in life unless someone can save them.

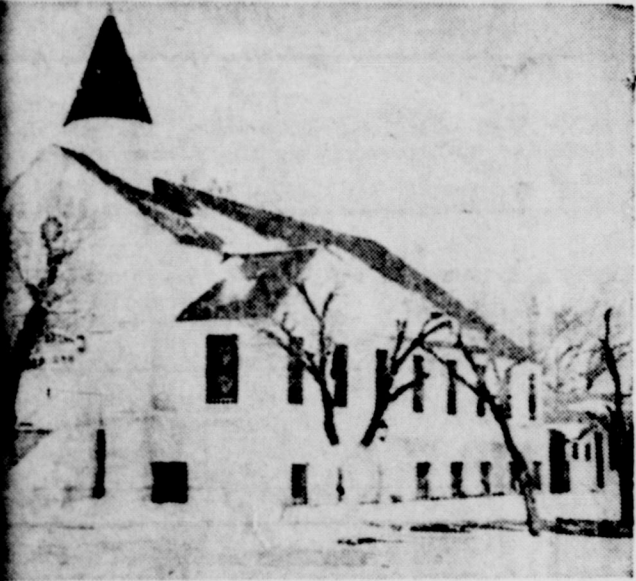
Jesus is the only one in history who announced that He would begin His work on the inside and work toward the outside. Jesus of Nazareth says, "Ye must be born again". He starts inside a man. He fits man to nature rather than trying to fit nature to man. He changes heart then habits, rather than habits then heart. He starts with a spiritual rebirth where old things pass away and all things become new. Salvation will never be out of date as long as there is a need for Salvation and Jesus says, "This Salvation is an individual personal heart-felt experience". Who can deny it?

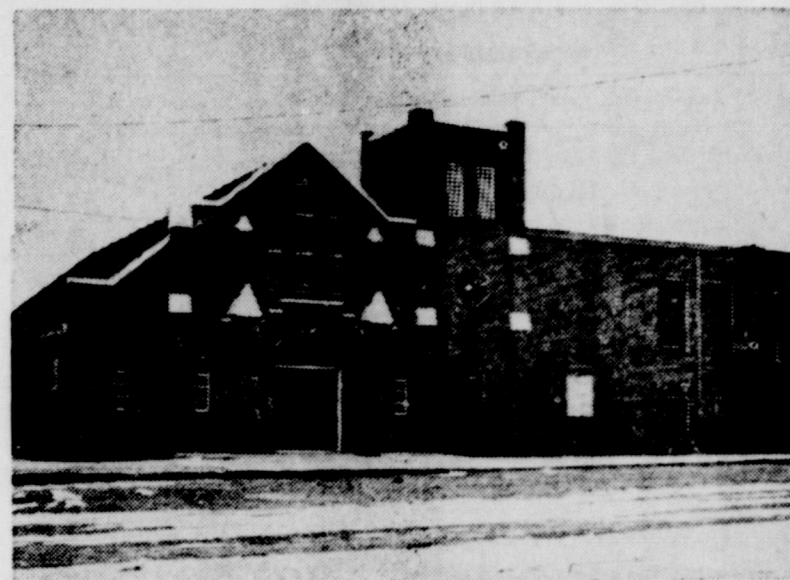

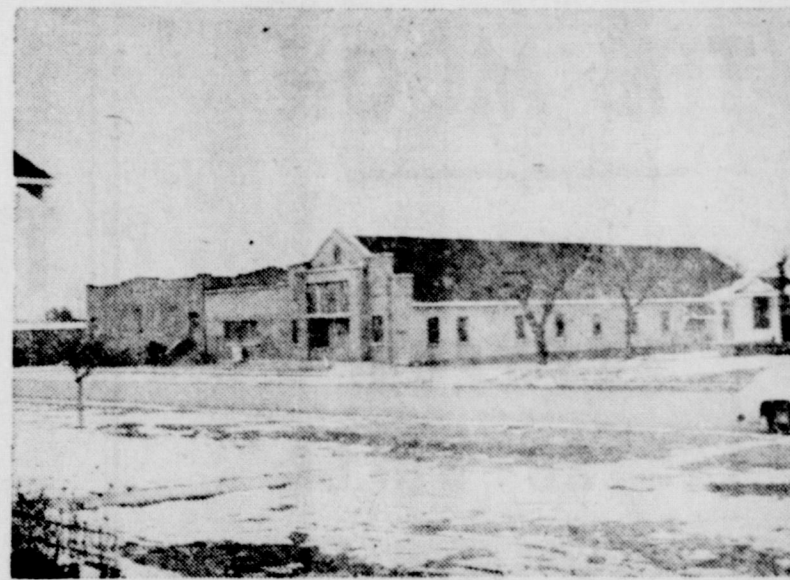
