
> FCC regulations on translators read to the effect that a translator station cannot be constructed until the permit is issued. However FCC will allow us to setup a VHF test and monitoring station. (This sinmply means that we can begin immediately to setup the test station). "And in all probability be ready to broadcast over the translator within 10 to fifteen days after the permit is issued." Setliff said.

The three 10 ft. anchor holes have already been dug and the power supply is now available at the site. A local machinest is building the anchor plates and concrete workers are ready to build the base and set the anchors. The base of the tower will be set in five feet of concrete. 12 guy wires of 9/32 airplane type cable will support the 150 ft. tower.




