Little 3-year-old Steve Dollar has been afflicted with an excess of blood vessels on his neck and face and a hypertrophied tongue since his birth. And the only possible cure is, of course, plastic surgery.

This type of operation naturally necessitates the services of a specialist. And on a teachers salary, or most any other salary, the services of a specialist come high.

The students in the Briscoe school seemed to sense the difficulty being experienced by the family, and they decided to have a food sale in an effort to raise money for the family and the needed operation.

Tuesday night was the climax of the students efforts. Farmers, ranchers, businessmen, housewives, friends and neighbors gathered in the gym at Briscoe and paid all the way from \$2.00 for a dozen turkey eggs, to \$100 for a homemade cake.

The final tally indicated that more than thirteen hundred dollars was raised through the sale of food Tuesday night.

## RAPE SUSPECT TO BE TRIED MONDAY, MAY 11

Judge Lewis M. Goodrich will preside over a special criminal session of district court to convene Monday May 11 in the Wheeler Courthouse.

A special 120 name venire has been called for the criminal case. James Franklin Hare will be tried for the alleged rape of his 11-year-old daughter on the 8th day of November 1958.

Hare's trial was originally set for January 19. However, it was postponed until May 11 when the court learned that his wife was under treatment in an Amarillo hospital. She died February 3rd.

Hare will be present Monday morning, May 11 at 10:00 when his attorney begins the tedious task of picking 12 jurors from the 120 name venire.

The April term of Judge Lewis M. Goodrich's district court convened Monday morning in Wheeler with 6 cases on the docket.

The new grand jurors were sworn in for the new term of court with Mrs. C. C. Dyson as foreman of the jury. Those on the panel with Mrs. Dyson are N. D. Ware Jr., O. B. Burton, Lloyd Anglin, Joel Parish, Walter Dunn, Charley Corcoran, A. T. Jones, E. J. Brookshire, L. A. Parks, Raymond Moore and John Amber.

The grand jury returned four indictments. All four defendants waived their two day waiting period and appeared before the judge Monday.

Joe Davis of Erick, Oklahoma

was indicted on charges of "Theft" and was given a five year parole to the sheriff of Wheeler County.

Henry Stembbridge, 18-year-old, Brownwood, Texas man, was given a 5 year parole sentence for "Forgery and Passing."

20-year-old Tommy Blackman of Phoenix, Arizona was charged with "Forgery and Passing" and was given a 5 year parole sentence.

Shelby Vick, 19, Shamrock youth was also charged with "Forgery and Passing." He was given a 5 year parole sentence to the sheriff of Wheeler County.

The other two cases appearing before the grand jury were given a "no bill" and dismissed.

#### THE HIGH COST OF GETTING EVEN

Romans 12:19-21. "Dearly beloved, avenge not yourselves, but rather give place unto wrath: for it is written, Vengeance is mine. I will repay, saith the Lord. Therefore if thine enemy hunger, feed him; if he thirst, give him drink; in so doing thou shalt heap coals of fire on his head. Be not overcome of evil, but overcome evil with good."

Everybody is offended by someone, sooner or later. But very few people ever really forgive those who offend them. The great majority of people never forget an injury and they allow ill-will and resentment to overcome them.

Outwardly they may show friendliness, generosity, tolerance or love towards that person, but deep inside of that person's heart is a strong desire to get even. But the cost of getting even is too high. None of us can afford it. It always does more harm to the person trying to get even, than it does to the person they are trying to get even with. Let us read the high price tag of a refusal to forgive.

#### That Person Pays First Of All In Ill Health

One famous doctor said that, "A strong feeling of resentment is just as likely to cause disease as a germ". That 50% of the problems of the acute stages of illness and 75% of the difficulties of those trying to recover from an illness are primarily in the mind of the patient. It is a wonderful thing to be forgiven, but it is more wonderful to forgive. Many people could improve their health by getting all ill-will and resentment out of their hearts.

#### That Person Who Refuses To Forgive, Suffers Separation From God

"If any man say, I love God, and hateth his brother he is a liar: for he that loveth not his brother whom he hath seen, how can he love God whom he hath not seen?" I John 4:20.

Separation from the fellowship of God is a horrible price to pay for the refusal to forgive those who offend us. When we refuse to forgive those who offend us, we make it impossible for God to forgive us. God, "... Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us". Matt. 6:12.

"And his lord was wroth and delivered him to the tormentors till he should pay all that was due him." So likewise shall my heavenly Father do also unto you, if ye from your hearts forgive not every one his brother their trespasses". Matt. 18:34-35.

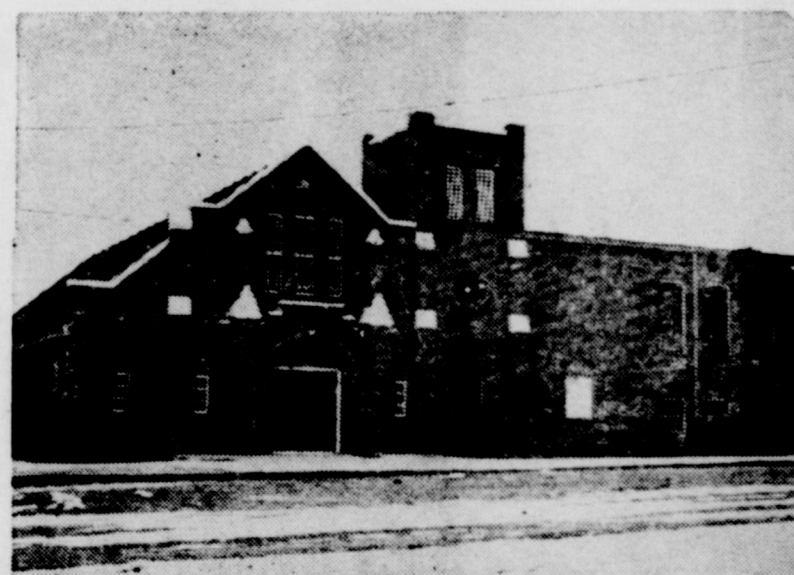
God not only allows fear, ill-health and the devil to punish them, but He refuses to fellowship with them. Isaiah 59:2. And that is too great a price to pay. It is better to pray for those who despitefully use you and do good to those who hate you and to love your enemies. ing bill, with the deficit added in, would require something around \$200,000,000 in new tax money. This much, it seems certain must be found, somewhere.

3. School improvement - Backers of the Hale-Aikin Committee program will push for adoption of at least part of that program. It would add some \$100,000,000 a year to state expenses.

**"COW BILLS" PASS:** Senate has given final approval to three bills affecting ranchers and dairy men.

A milk bill sponsored by Sen. Grady Hazelwood of Amarillo, would prohibit bringing in milk from other states unless it could be established that the milk was produced under the health and sanitation standards placed on Texas producers.

Sen. Ray Roberts of McKinney pushed through a bill that would provide a penalty for allowing cattle to roam on state and national highways and relieve motorists of liability for hitting stock.

A bill tightening licensing regulations of veterinarians also was passed by the Senate. Sen. Andy Rogers of Childress, sponsor, noted that there is no present law to suspend licenses of veterinarians guilty of malpractice.
