#### CONCERNING TIME BOMBS

Because he was a veteran who knew booby traps from painful experience, a young Congressman was suspicious of a Civil War relic on his desk. It was a mortar bomb he had bought as a souvenir to use as a paper-weight.

Just to play safe, he asked an ordinance expert to inspect it. Though it dated back to 1862, it exploded fortunately under supervision which prevented damage.

Maybe there's a time bomb on our own desk. For instance, the seemingly innocent indulgence which, geared to unconscious personality need, can explode into alcoholism. Or the carefully hidden mental vice which, given the opportunity of easy temptation, erupts into our making foels of ourselves.

Or the more dangerous time bombs in our society: our booby-trapped prospecity geared to inflation that one of these days, like a pretty balloon, has to burst; the "creeping socialism" that, like the tortoise in its race with the rabbit, overakes us while we sleep; or the slow, painless exchanges of freedom for security which, like the compounding interest on a debt, must finally be

#### Lawmen From All Over Panhandle Join In Hunt

Two escaped prisoners have been returned to the Wheeler County Jail in Wheeler, following a fruitless escapade Sunday. The men broke jail at 8:30 p.m. and were returned to their cell at 4:45.

The men were identified as Wayne Pearce, 19, of Sayre, Oklahoma; and Willie Stowe, 27, of Shamrock. Stowe had been sentenced to the State Penitentiary charged with theft over \$50 and breaking probation. Pearce was awaiting trial for car theft.

According to Wheeler County Sheriff Bus Dorman, the pair made a key out of cardboard and unlocked their cell door. There was a chain on the door but they jerked the door until the chain broke lose.

The fugitives headed for the home of Pearce's brother, Sonny Pearce, on the Cleve - Hamilton Ranch, several miles northwest of Shamrock. The brother brought them back to the jail at 4:45 a.m. Roadblocks were set up in the County following the break.

And approximately 75 patrol units were used in the hunt. Officers from Paducah, Clarendon, Canadian, Childress, Wellington, Matador, Pampa, McLean and several from Oklahoma converged on Wheeler to help hunt down the
