



## LICE ON BEEF CATTLE

Cattle lice are primarily a winter problem. Direct sunshine, rain and self-grooming keep louse numbers low in the thin summer hair coat of cattle that are pastured in the open.

Cattle lice are small, but they reduce financial returns of nearly every cattle enterprise. Even moderate louse numbers can cause calves and feeders to grow

more slowly and require more feed per pound of gain. Louse-infected cows produce less milk for their calves. Biting and feeding activity of lice are irritating to cattle and the irritation intensifies with increasing numbers of lice.

Often one of the first signs that cattle have lice is that they rub and scratch themselves against fences, feed bunks, trees or other

objects. In advanced cases, this may result in larger patches of bare skin.

Typically 1 percent or 2 percent, or fewer, of the cattle in a herd may carry extremely high numbers of lice, even in the summer such "carriers" are unthrifty and perform poorly.

Bulls are "carriers" in a disproportionately high number of instances. This may be because bulls are housed more often than

cows, because their hair is longer and more dense, and because the bull's massive neck and shoulders prevent him from grooming himself as effectively as do females.

Several studies have documented severe anemia in cattle as a result of shortnosed sucking louse infestations. Anemic cattle fail to gain weight, or they may slowly lose weight. They appear very weak and have extremely pale skin around the eyes, muzzle and udder.

Anemic cattle have low resistance to disease and to stresses caused by bad weather, shipping or handling.

Ridding anemic cattle of lice usually results in rapid improvement. Complete recovery may be achieved within a month. The primary way in which lice are spread is from animal to animal when cattle are in close contact with one another such as during feeding, breeding or shipping.

Cattle lice should be controlled as soon as they become numerous—not late in the winter after the damage has been done. If left unchecked, lice gradually stress cattle more and more throughout the winter, attaining highest populations in late winter. High louse populations coincide with periods of both acute and cumulative winter stress and with the season when vitamin A is often deficient in cattle diets. Lousy cattle are much less able to cope with these

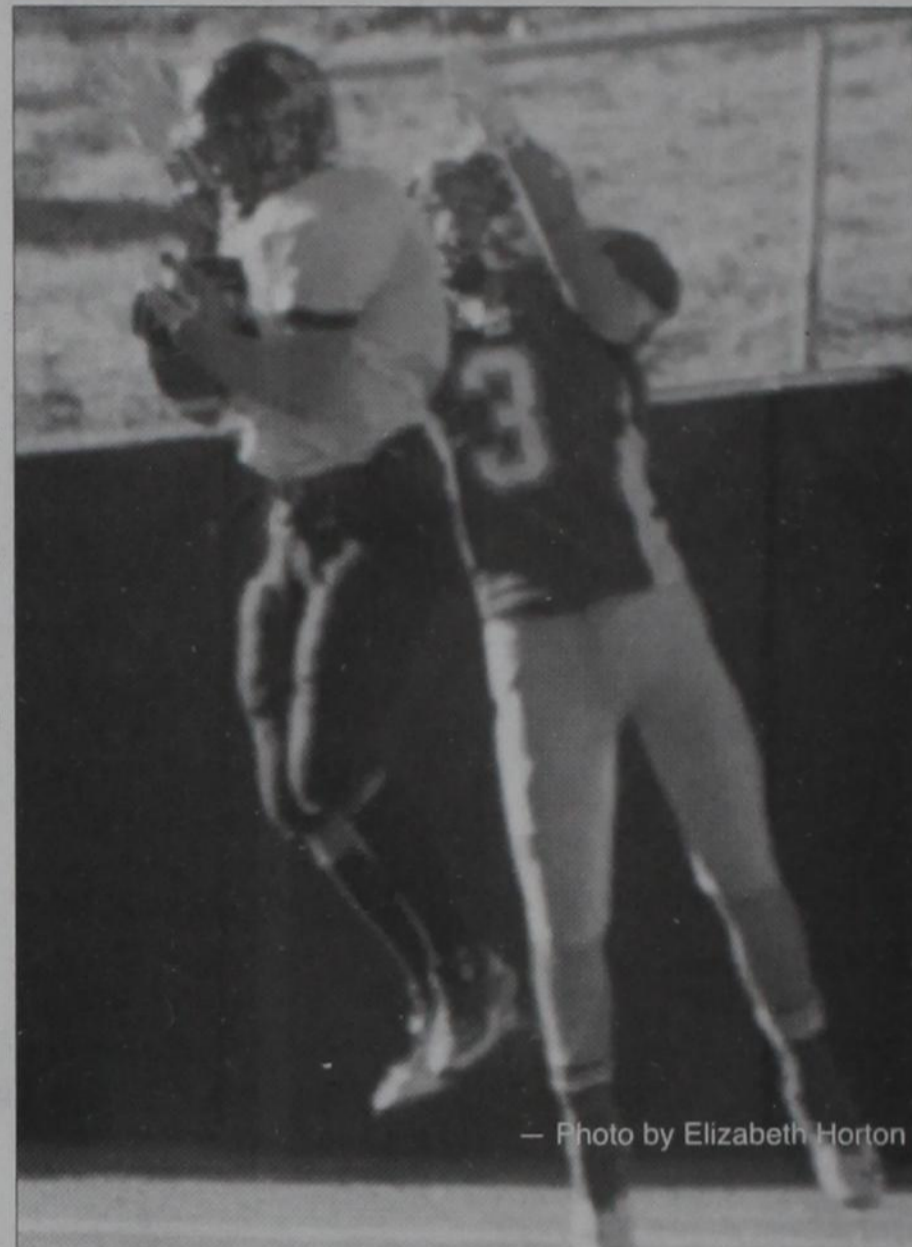

other stresses.

Chemical application methods for louse control include spraying, pour-ons, spot-ons and an injectable, as well as dusts and backrubbers or self-oilers. Regardless of the application method, most insecticides have little effect on louse eggs. Lice hatching from eggs after a single

treatment can rapidly re-infest cattle. For this reason, a second treatment two or three weeks after the first is important to kill the newly hatched lice before they can mature and lay eggs.

second exit on the south end of the site, concrete in parking areas and asphalt in impound area.  
After presentation and discussion of the proposal received from Open Range engineering Services PLLC, the court approved a contract in the amount of \$30,000, which will be invoiced and paid, passed on the completion percentage.

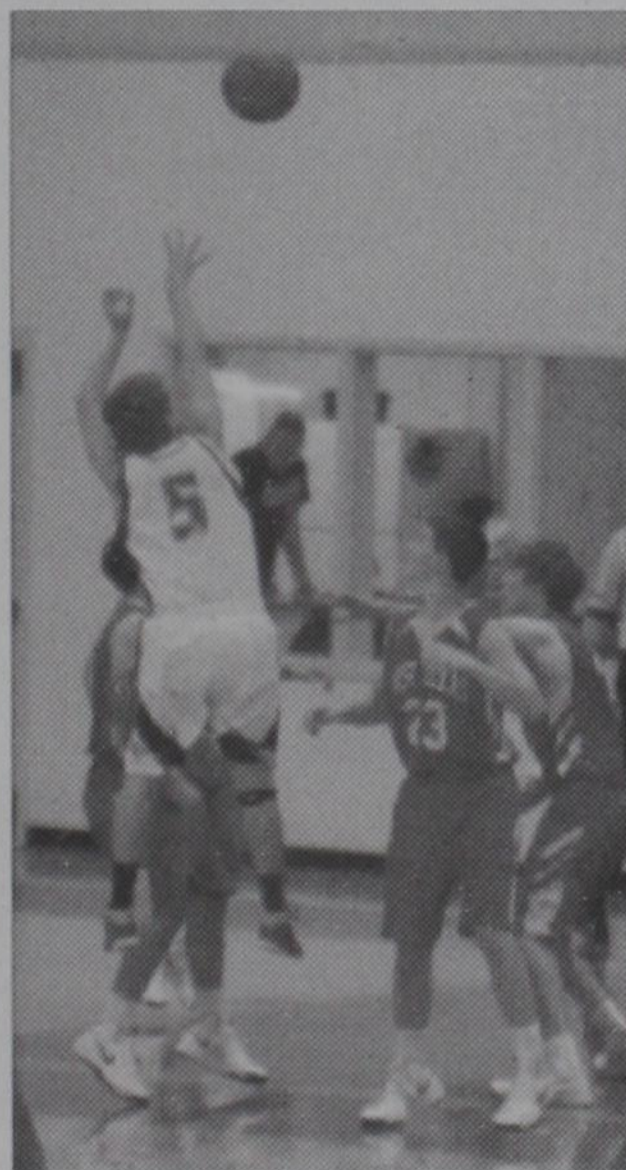

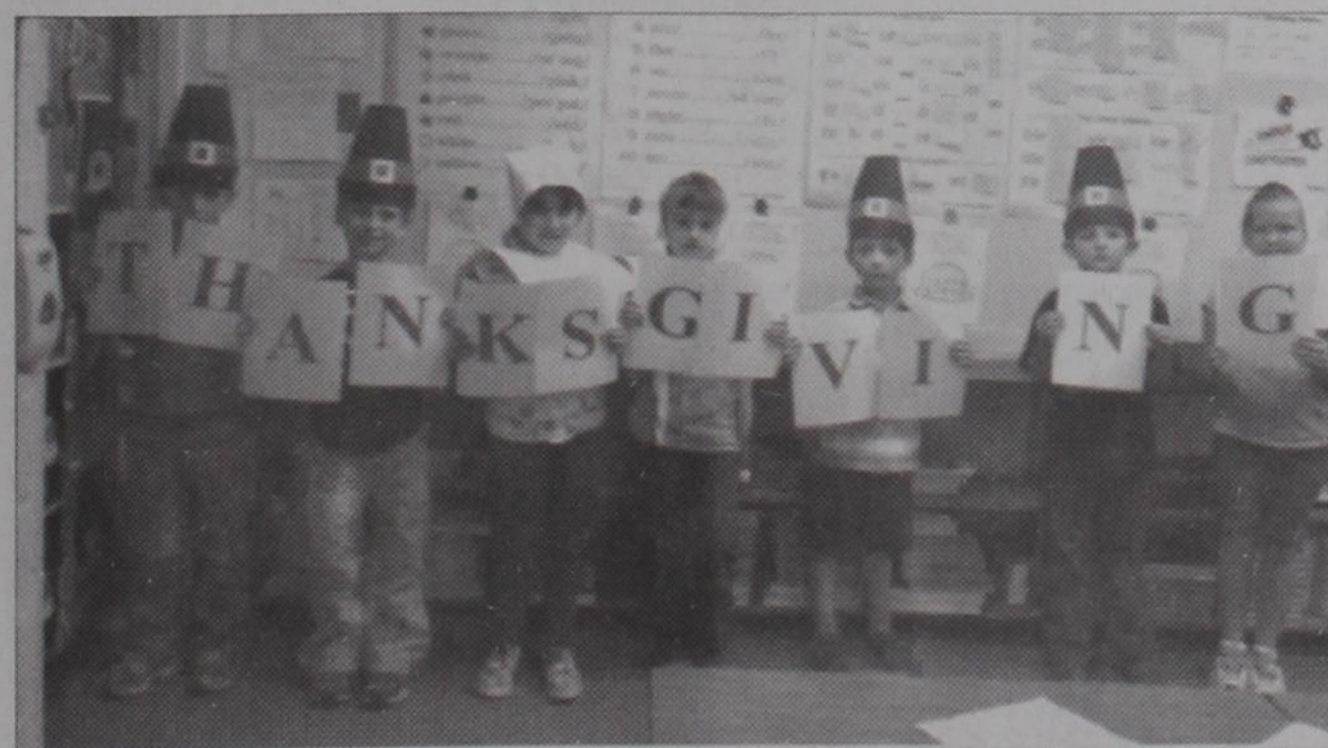
