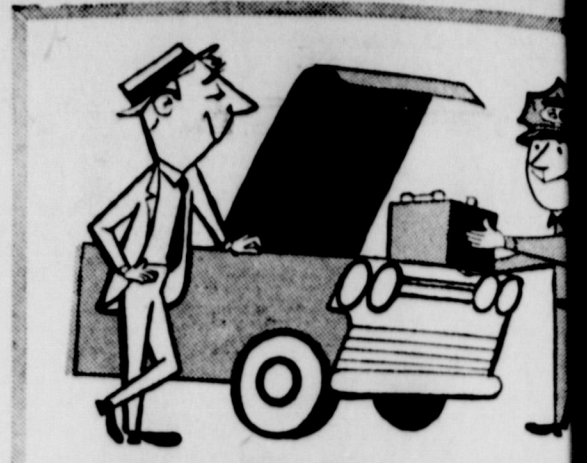

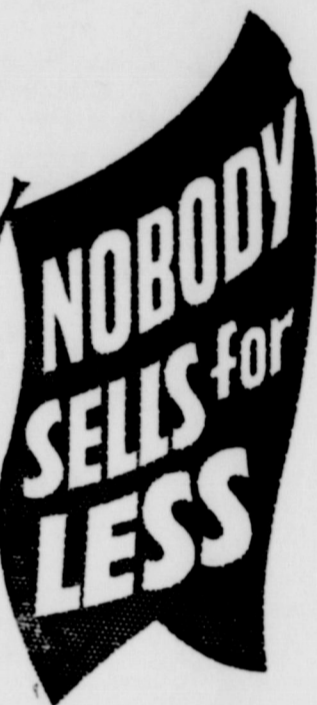

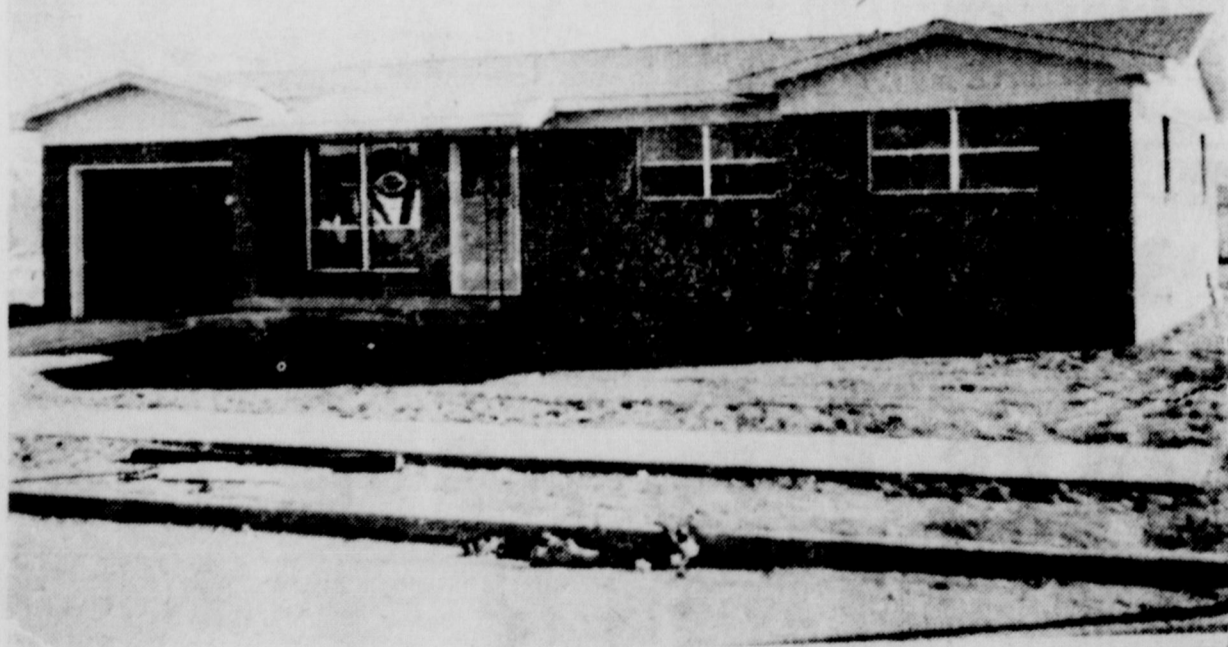

Briscoe 4-H Club Elects New Officers

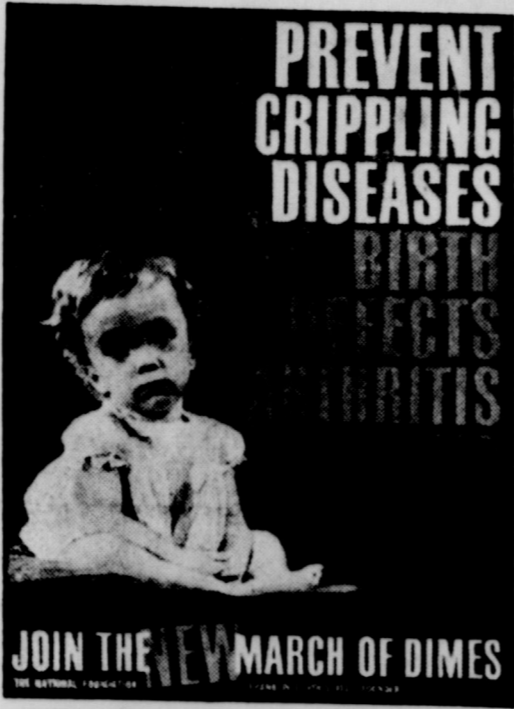
Briscoe 4-H girls and boys met Tuesday, November 24, 1959. There were 18 members present.
