

Postmaster Virgil Jamison this week announced his annual "Mail Early for Christmas" campaign, and outlined plans for insuring delivery of all Christmas gifts and cards by Christmas eve.

"Public cooperation," he said, has been a key factor in moving Christmas mail on time in recent years, and I am hopeful that it will be even better this year."

The Postmaster urged patrons of the Wheeler Post Office to start mailing Christmas packages now. Packages to distant places especially should be mailed as early as possible.

"This is also the week to prepare and mail your out-of-town Christmas cards," he said.

Mr. Jamison gave these pointers on the proper mailing of packages, "Use sturdy corrugated mailing cartons, plenty of heavy brown wrapping paper, and be sure that every package is tied with a strong cord. Cartons containing several gift packages should be stuffed with tissue or old newspapers to cushion the con-


