## SCOUT IDEA IS TO COOPERATE WITH OTHERS

"We're not trying to take away from the FFA and 4-H programs, but it is our aim rather to cooperate with those groups in such a manner that their programs are more effective as a result of a Scout program that truly meets the needs of rural boys."

Thus Charles S. Griffin, Assistant National Director of Rural Scouting, National Council Boy Scouts of America, summed up his remarks to School Superintendents, Boys 4-H Leaders, County Agents and Scout Officials of Wheeler and Collingsworth Counties meeting at Shamrock High School, Friday morning, December 11.

As an illustration of how Scouting and the various youth farm program work together, Mr. Griffin pointed out the 28 Scout Merit Badges covering subjects strictly agricultural in nature.

"We do not require the boy to come up to the degree of attainment in these fields as required by FFA and 4-H and he may earn them by completing FFA and 4-H projects in these particular subjects," Mr. Griffin said.

In stressing the importance of the rural Scout program, Mr. Griffin stated that 42% of the boys between the ages of 8 and 17 live in rural areas.

"As a boy growing up on a farm I did not have the opportunity to participate in the Scouting program and since joining the movement as a professional Scouter I have been determined to do everything within my power to see to it that every boy in the rural areas of our country has this opportunity," Mr. Griffin said.

This year's enrollment, which is 628 more than last year's, includes 2,750 coeds, the largest number of women students ever to enroll at OSU, Girod said.

Over a 20-year period, 1938-58, except during wartime, women student enrollment at State remained at a steady level, ranging from about 2,000 to 2,200 annually. Last year the total jumped 192 to 2,468, and this year it climbed another 230.

There are 2,924 freshmen, 2,138 sophomores, 1,953 juniors, 2,002 seniors, 1,207 graduate students and 74 special students.
