### Frances Hefley, 91 Buried October 13

Frances Alice Meadows Hefley, 91, passed away October 8, 2012 in Pampa, Texas.

Services were at 10:00 AM Saturday, October 13, 2012, at Carmichael-Whitley Colonial Chapel, with Rev. Barry Owens, associate pastor of First Baptist Church, officiating.

Graveside services were at 3:00 PM Saturday, October 13, 2012, at Gageby Cemetery, with Herb Smith, her son-in-law, officiating. Arrangements were under the direction of Carmichael-Whitley Funeral Directors.

Mrs. Hefley was born April 17, 1921 in rural Hemphill County to Allen Meadows and Nannie Gertrude Cole Meadows. Frances was named for both her grandmothers, Alice Horton Meadows and Frances Massengale Cole. She attended the one-room school in the Pleasant Valley community and then graduated from Canadian High School in 1937.

Frances and James Loyd Hefley were married in the home of her parents on September 28, 1941, and he preceded her in death on August 2, 1970. The Hefleys lived their entire lives farming and ranching in south Hemphill County and north Wheeler County. Loyd and Frances met as youngsters, attending the Gageby Baptist Church where they attended and raised their family until his death. In 1977, Frances moved into Wheeler where she became a member of First Baptist Church, and was known and loved for her faith, her hospitality, and her flowers. In 2006, she moved to Pampa where she lived at Meredith House Assisted Living and later Pampa Nursing Center.

Mrs. Hefley was preceded in death by her parents; two sisters: Mrs. Lorene Vise and Mrs. Dollie Mooney; and by a brother: Mr. Roy Meadows.

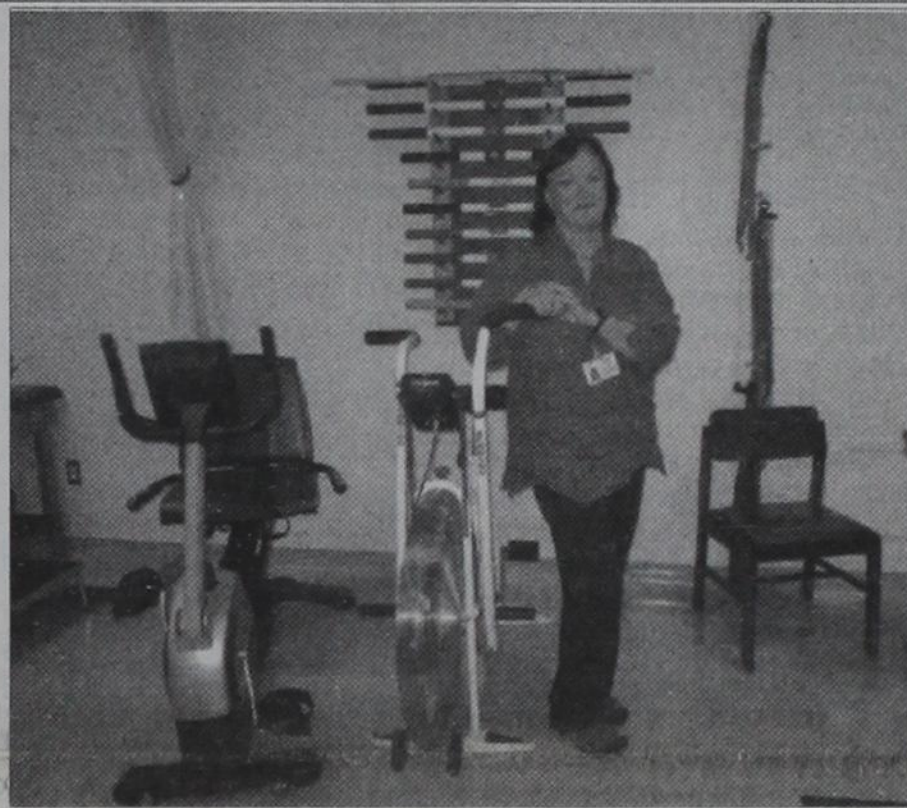
### Methodist Youth Pumpkin Patch

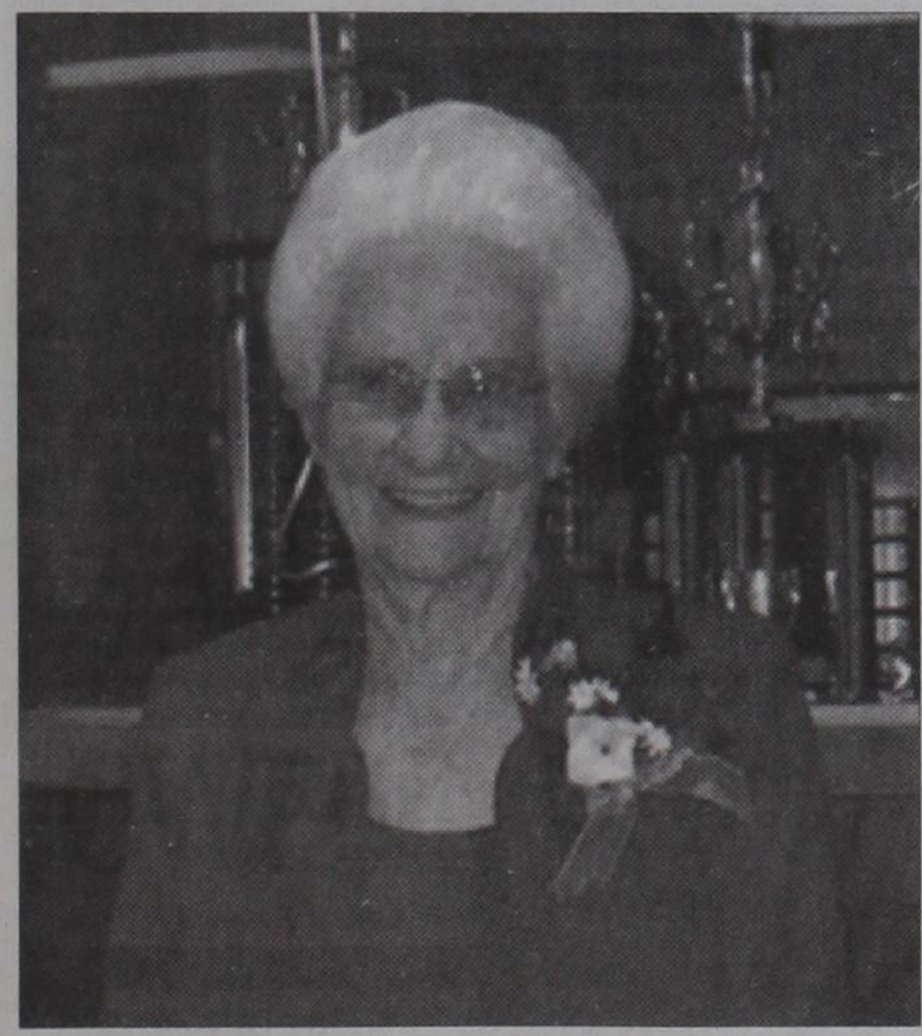

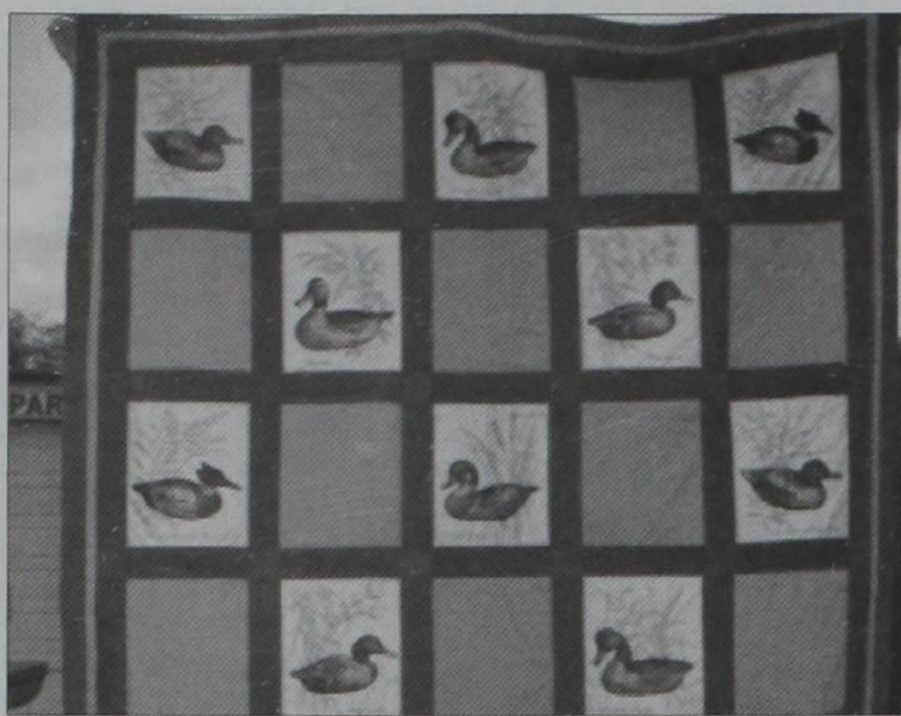


Dorothy Walker, daughter of William and Clara Lohberger

### Parkview Artery Alzheimer's Disease

Alzheimer's disease causes more worry for people over 55 than any other condition. Suspecting you or a loved one are exhibiting signs of Alzheimer's can be a stressful and emotional experience. Even if you find yourself forgetting things, it doesn't necessarily mean you have this disease. Even when you fear the worst, the earlier you seek help, the better your chances of getting the care you need and maximizing your quality of life.

What is Alzheimer's disease? Alzheimer's disease is the most common form of dementia, a serious brain disorder that impacts daily living through memory loss and cognitive changes. Although not all memory loss indicates Alzheimer's disease, one in ten people over 65 years of age, and over half of those over 85 have Alzheimer's disease. Currently, 26 million people worldwide have this dementia, and over 15 million Americans will be affected by the year 2050.

Symptoms of Alzheimer's disease usually develop slowly and gradually worsen over time, progressing from mild forgetfulness to widespread brain impairment. Chemical and structural changes in the brain slowly destroy the ability to create, remember, learn, reason, and relate to others. As critical cells die, drastic personality loss occurs and body systems fail.

#### Who is at risk of Alzheimer's disease?

The primary risk factors of Alzheimer's are age, family history, and genetics. However, there are other risk factors that you can influence. Maintaining a healthy heart and avoiding high blood pressure, heart disease, stroke, diabetes, and high cholesterol can decrease the risk of Alzheimer's. Watch your weight, avoid tobacco and excess alcohol, stay socially connected, and exercise both your body and mind.

Early-onset Alzheimer's affects patients under the age of 65. This relatively rare condition is seen more often in patients whose parents or grandparents developed Alzheimer's disease at a young age, and is generally associated with three specific gene mutations (the APP gene found on chromosome 21, the PS1 gene on chromosome 12, and the PS2 gene on chromosome 1).

#### Signs and symptoms of Alzheimer's disease

For many people, detecting the first signs of memory problems in themselves or a loved one brings an immediate fear of Alzheimer's disease. However, most people over 65 experience some level of forgetfulness. It is normal for age-related brain shrinkage to produce changes in processing speed, attention, and short term memory, creating so-called "senior moments." Forgetfulness is merely inconvenient, though, and generally involves unimportant information. Understanding the significance of these age-related changes begins with knowing the difference between what is normal and what is an early symptom of Alzheimer's.

#### Signs of Normal Change vs. Early Alzheimer's Symptoms

##### Normal Early Alzheimer's Disease

Can't find your keys—Routinely place important items in odd places, such as keys in the fridge, wallet in the dishwasher  
Search for casual names and words—Forget names of family members and common objects, or substitute words with inappropriate ones  
Briefly forget conversation details—Frequently forget entire conversations  
Feel the cold more—Dress regardless of the weather, wear several skirts on a warm day, or shorts in a snow storm  
Can't find a recipe—Can't follow recipe directions  
Forget to record a check—Can no longer manage check-book, balance figures, solve problems, or think abstractly  
Cancel a date with friends—Withdraw from usual interests and activities, sit in front of the TV for hours, sleep far more than usual  
Make an occasional wrong turn—Get lost in familiar places, don't remember how you got there or how to get home  
Feel occasionally sad—Experience rapid mood swings, from tears to rage, for no discernible reason

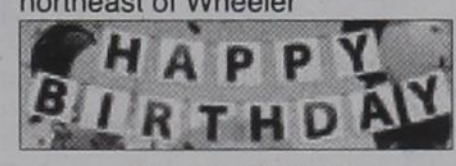

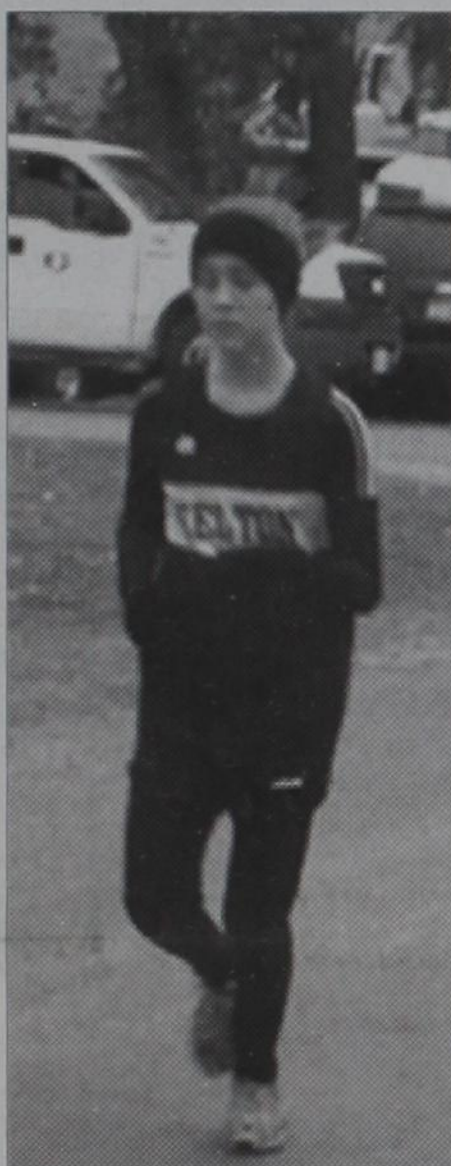

### Left Lane For Passing Only

COMING SOON TO A HIGHWAY NEAR YOU — "LEFT LANE FOR PASSING ONLY" SIGNS

New signs will be placed on highways with 75 mph or higher speed limits

AUSTIN — The Texas Department of Transportation is installing additional "Left Lane for Passing Only" signs on all highways with a speed limit of 75 mph or higher. State law requires TxDOT to post these signs on highways where slower traffic is asked to stay in another lane.

"We want to make sure that travelers on our highways have a safe, efficient and enjoyable trip," said Carol Rawson, TxDOT's Traffic Operations Division Director. "Reminding the public that slower moving vehicles should use right lanes and that passing vehicles use left lanes will help improve safety on our highways."

Safety of the traveling public is always TxDOT's No. 1 priority. Agency leaders think the expanded use of these signs will allow highway users to reach their intended destinations more safely and without undue delay due to slower moving vehicles. This is more important than ever with an increasing number of Texas highways with speeds of 75 mph or higher.

"Engineers generally consider highway travel to be the safest when vehicles are traveling at the same speeds," Rawson said. "The use of these signs will help ensure that vehicles traveling at the posted speed limit will not be impeded or forced to make excessive lane changes when encountering a slower vehicle."

TxDOT expects installation of approximately 3,400 new "Left Lane for Passing Only" signs to be completed by summer of 2013. The signs are enforceable and violators can be stopped and ticketed by law enforcement.

### TxDOT Negotiates I-35 Construction

TxDOT NEGOTIATES CONSTRUCTION AGREEMENT, SETTING IN MOTION MUCH-NEEDED \$1.6 BILLION EXPANSION ON TEXAS' NO. 1 CONGESTED HIGHWAY

Transportation agency partners with private company to design, construct expansion of I-35W starting mid-2013

AUSTIN — Each year, Texans waste more than 2 million hours sitting in traffic on I-35W near downtown in Fort Worth. With the completed negotiation of a new highway construction agreement this week, the Texas Department of Transportation hopes to cut that time by more than a third. The draft agreement with NTE Mobility Partners Segments 3 LLC (NTEMP3) will add two managed lanes each way on I-35W, or the North Tarrant Express, and rebuild the existing highway, which today tops TxDOT's 100 Most Congested Roadways.

"Texans have better things to do than to sit in traffic, and that's why we're proud to partner with the private sector to speed up a critical transportation project," said Phil Wilson, TxDOT executive director. "TxDOT continuously strives to move aggressively with our priority projects in order to address congestion and help Texans spend less time on the road and more time with their families."

Funding for the project highlights the region's strong transportation partnerships. The North Central Texas Council of Governments has committed approximately \$89.5 million for the project, and identified another \$40.5 million for project contingencies. Additionally, the U.S. Department of Transportation invited the developer to apply for a Transportation Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Act (TIFIA) loan of up to \$537 million to help fund the project. The project also is expected to receive \$273 million from Private Activity Bonds issued by the developer and \$446 million in developer equity. The scheduled improvements from north of

I-30 to north of I-820 (Segment 3A) will provide \$1.4 billion of needed infrastructure to the Fort Worth area. The agreement also provides operations and maintenance until 2061.

"This is a project that I have been involved with for many years and seen advance through many considerable obstacles, but with the help of four different Fort Worth mayors, county judges, legislators, business leaders and other advocates, we have managed to keep advancing it forward," said TxDOT Commissioner Bill Meadows. "This project will address mobility on the No. 1 most congested roadway in Texas. It is a project that is critical to the state's economy and essential to the region. It is a quality of life issue as well as an air quality issue, and I am glad to be a part of its success."

As part of this project, TxDOT will also make improvements to Segment 3B, which runs from north of I-820 to US 81/287. Segment 3B will be rebuilt and widened to include two managed lanes each way at a total project cost to TxDOT of \$234 million. Once constructed, Segment 3B will be turned over to NTEMP3 for operations and maintenance under the agreement. TxDOT will host a public hearing Thursday, Oct. 11 at 6 p.m. at the TxDOT Fort Worth District Regional Training Center (2501 Southwest Loop 820, Fort Worth) to present the draft agreement. The public hearing is a requirement prior to executing the final Facility Agreement. The draft

agreement will be submitted for review to the Texas Legislative Budget Board. The Texas Attorney General's office also will review the draft agreement for legal sufficiency. The final Facility Agreement is expected to be signed in early 2013. Construction is scheduled to begin in mid-2013 with substantial completion in mid-2018.

"We have been working together with the state for the past three years designing and building the first phase of the North Tarrant Express project.

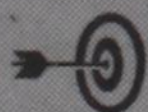

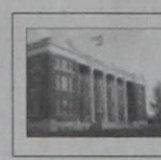

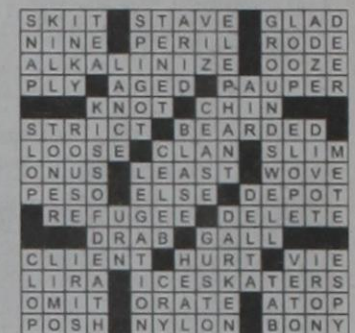
